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**Bill Analysis**

SB 279 creates the Parental Rights Immunization Act. The measure requires each health care provider that administers vaccines to obtain informed consent from the legal representative or other adult authorized by law to consent on behalf of a minor prior to administering the vaccine. The provider is required to provide relevant information regarding benefits and risks of the vaccine to obtain informed consent. Additionally, the provider must make available a copy of the Vaccine Information Statement as well as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's "Epidemiology and Prevention of Vaccine-Preventable Diseases: Vaccine Excipient and Media Summary", the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Vaccine Injury Table or the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's contraindications, and precautions or any combination of these 3 resources to the legal representative or other adult.

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
