**Bill Analysis**

SB 346 modifies training requirements for law enforcement personnel. The measure requires such personnel to receive at least 1 hour of education and training relating to protecting the rights of the people as enumerated in the Constitutions of the United States and the State of Oklahoma. The Council on Law Enforcement Education Training shall be required to create such a course no later than November 1, 2023. Such training shall include the right of the officer to refuse to implement any order, mandate, or directive that they deem to be a violation of the rights of the people. The measure provides that no political subdivision may discipline, fine, demote, fire, or otherwise punish any law enforcement officer for refusing to implement any order, mandate, or directive that the officer believes and articulates as being a violation of the rights of the people.
