**Bill Analysis**

SB 635 requires each hemp-derived ingestible cannabinoid product to be registered with the State Board of Agriculture prior to distribution. All registration for such products shall expire on December 31. If the Board discovers any hemp-derived ingestible cannabinoid product that is not registered, the registration was falsely submitted, or the registration was late, the Board may assess an administrative penalty. Such products shall also be labeled clearly and in a manner outlined in the measure nor may they imitate any product marketed to children. Hemp-derived cannabinoids may be added to an ingestible product during the manufacturing process or prior to retail sale at a food service establishment. No person shall distribute misbranded hemp-derived ingestible cannabinoid product. The measure authorizes the State Board of Agriculture to issue and enforce a stop sale, stop use, or removal order to the owner or custodian of any lot of hemp-derived ingestible cannabinoid product.
