**Bill Analysis**

SB 765 requires all wholesale distributors to make adequate provisions for the return of outdated prescription drugs for up to 6 months after the labeled expiration date for prompt full credit. Distributors shall be required to establish a written policy for such returns, which shall be available to the State Board of Pharmacy upon request. Influenza vaccines shall be exempt from these requirements. Prompt full credit shall be given to the purchaser within 60 days the return drugs were received by the wholesale distributor or its designated agent, provided the drugs were returned within the 6-month period.

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
