**Bill Analysis**

SB 818 creates the Firearms Freedom Act. The measure provides that any firearm manufactured and remaining in the state shall not be subject to federal law, federal taxation, or federal regulation. Such firearms shall include firearms manufactured using basic materials imported into the state. Firearms included in the measure shall exclude any firearm importing significant parts from another state or foreign country. Basic materials shall include polymers, unmachined metal, ferrous or nonferrous, bar stock, ingots or forgings, and unshaped wood. Firearms manufactured in this manner and sold within the state shall have the words "Made in Oklahoma" affixed to the firearm. Any person may possess firearms manufactured in the state barring the exceptions outlined in the measure. Persons employed by or contracting with the federal government attempting to enforce an act, order, law, statute, rule, or regulation of the government of the United States in violation of this measure shall be guilty of a felony punishable by a term of imprisonment not to exceed 5 years and/or a fine not to exceed \$5,000.00. State officials or employees of a political subdivision attempting to enforce an act, order, law, statute, rule, or regulation of the government of the United States in violation of this measure shall be guilty of a felony punishable by a term of imprisonment not to exceed 2 years and/or a fine not to exceed \$1,000.00.
