**Bill Analysis**

SB 828 provides that any unlawful federal statute, rule, or executive order, federal or state judicial order, or judicial finding that would have the effect of forcing an extreme risk protection order or ex parte extreme risk protection order which would unlawfully infringe upon a citizen's constitutionally protected rights including, but not limited to, the right to free speech, shall be null, void, unenforceable, and of no effect. Any individual including a law enforcement officer who attempts to enforce an unlawful federally implemented extreme risk protection order upon a citizen shall be guilty of a felony and subject to a maximum fine of \$1,000.00 and term of imprisonment not to exceed 1 year.
