**Bill Analysis**

SB 941 directs the Wildlife Conservation Commission to prepare a report for the Legislature with proposed licensing fees based on the latest Consumer Price Index year-to-date percent change every 5 years, starting 5 years after the effective date. The measure increases the maximum age for persons exempted from fishing and hunting license requirements from 16 to 18. The measure also modifies several hunting and fishing license fees for residents and nonresidents. The measure also creates a 5-year disability combination hunting/finishing license and modifies the duration of the 5-year fishing, hunting, and combination licenses for residents. The measure lowers the duration from 5 years to 3 years.

**House Amendments**

HA's to SB 941 establishes a disability hunting/fishing license as well as lowers the 5-year fishing, hunting, and combination licenses for residents to 3 years.
