


together with Engrossed House Amendments thereto, beg leave to report that we have had the same under consideration and herewith return the same with the following recommendations

20 An Act relating to the World Health Organization;  
21 prohibiting enforcement of policies required by  
22 certain entities; clarifying application of certain  
23 provisions; providing for codification; providing an  
24 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6301 of Title 74, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. The World Health Organization, the United Nations, and the  
2 World Economic Forum have no jurisdiction in this state. The state  
3 and its political subdivisions, including, but not limited to,  
4 counties, cities, towns, precincts, water districts, school  
5 districts, school administrative units, or quasi-public entities,  
6 shall not be compelled to engage in the enforcement of, or any  
7 collaboration with the enforcement of, any requirements or mandates  
8 issued by the World Health Organization, the United Nations, or the  
9 World Economic Forum.

10 B. Any requirements or mandates issued by the World Health  
11 Organization, the United Nations, or the World Economic Forum shall  
12 not be used in this state as a basis for action, nor to direct,  
13 order, or otherwise impose, contrary to the constitution and laws of  
14 this state, any requirements whatsoever, including those for masks,  
15 vaccines, or medical testing, or gather any public or private  
16 information about the state's citizens or residents, and shall have  
17 no force or effect in this state.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective June 1, 2024.

19 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
