**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 1100 would clarify that anyone convicted of aiding suicide would be guilty of a felony and punishable by a \$1,000 fine, imprisonment within the Department of Corrections not to exceed two years, or both. The measure would also add the use of an online platform to harass, to instill fear, to make lewd or obscene comments, or in conspiracy or concerted actions to the other electronic and telecommunication uses that are unlawful. The Floor Substitute would define the punishments for initial and subsequent offenses. The Department of Corrections does not currently have any data to determine the potential fiscal impact.
