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Fiscal Analysis

SB 1334 will require all health benefit plans to provide standard fertility preservation services when medically necessary treatment may directly or indirectly cause iatrogenic infertility. OMES believes there to be 180 men and women annually who would be included at an estimated cost to the system of \$445,000 if 25% request the service. OMES believes there to be 180 men and women annually who would be included at an estimated cost of \$313,125 if 25% request the service. OMES believes there could be a large first-year impact of 650 current members receiving treatment that could request this service with a possible first year cost of \$1.6 million.
