Fiscal Analysis

SB 1450 would name actions relating to theft, retail theft, or larceny that shall constitute organized retail crime. The measure would amend language pertaining to the period for which the value of stolen goods may be aggregated from ninety days to one year. The Department of Corrections is unable to determine the fiscal impact of this language change. The measure would also authorize the Office of the Attorney General to employ officers to serve on the Oklahoma Organized Retail Crime Task Force to prevent, respond to, investigate, and prosecute criminal violations related to organized retail crime. The Office believes they would require 2 additional prosecutors, 5 additional law enforcement agents, and 2 additional analysts to implement the measure.
