SB 1476 proposes to amend 68 O.S. § 1357 by providing definitions of a “firearm safety device” and “gun safety device” and exempting from sales tax the sale of a firearm safety device” and “gun safety device”.




EFFECTIVE DATE: November 1, 2024

REVENUE IMPACT:

The state of Maine has a sales tax exemption for gun locks and safes. Information from Maine indicates the tax expenditure for this exemption was \$105,000 for FY 23. After adjusting for the differences between Maine and Oklahoma in population¹, tax rates, and gun ownership percentages², it was determined an estimated \$271,555 in Oklahoma state sales taxes was collected in FY 23 on these devices. Application of inflation rate³ adjustments of 2.3% for 2024, 2.2% for 2025, and 2.1% for 2026 results in the following revenue impact:

FY 25: An estimated decrease of \$166,000 in state sales tax revenues

FY 26: An estimated decrease of \$290,000 in state sales tax revenues
