7	An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.
8	2021, Sections 5003.2, 5003.3, 5003.4, 5003.7, 5003.8 and 5003.10, which relate to the Oklahoma Department
9	of Commerce; modifying statement of needs; modifying mission statement; modifying provisions related to
10	certain five-year plan; modifying provisions related to to annual report; modifying provisions related to
11	authority of agency; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.2, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 5003.2 A. Recognizing the geographic diversity of this
18	state, Oklahoma needs <del>one central, primary public-sector economic</del>
19	development agency for the state in order to manage or coordinate
20	all public sector economic development activity a focus on long-term
21	development of local communities to increase competitiveness and
22	enhance economic opportunities.
23	Oklahoma needs an agency to work at the community <del>and firm</del> level
24	to:

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1	1. Create new and higher quality jobs for the people of this
2	state through the expansion, creation, restructuring and recruitment
3	of export-oriented Oklahoma firms which produce value-added goods,
4	services and processes long-term development of local communities;
5	2. Encourage statewide economic diversification and stability;
6	3. Maintain a two-way flow of information between the <del>central</del>
7	state economic development agency and firms, farms and communities
8	through regional organization and representation;
9	4. Implement the strategic economic development five-year plan
10	developed by the state economic development entity; and
11	5. Carry out policy development and research in support of
12	Oklahoma Futures the long-term competitiveness of Oklahoma;
13	6. Provide technical assistance to local communities in
14	securing federal funding, incentive availability, and community
15	development;
16	7. Provide assistance and funding in development of potential
17	sites for economic development;
18	8. Coordinate with other state agencies deploying federal and
19	state funds for infrastructure development including, but not
20	limited to, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the Oklahoma
21	Water Resources Board, and the Oklahoma Broadband Office; and
22	9. Assist in compliance with the laws and regulations of
23	economic incentives and economic development initiatives.
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1 The Oklahoma Department of Commerce is hereby constituted an в. 2 agency of state government. 3 C. Whenever the terms "Department of Economic Development" or 4 "Department of Economic and Community Affairs" appear in the 5 Oklahoma Statutes they shall mean and refer to the Oklahoma 6 Department of Commerce. 7 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.3, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 Section 5003.3 The mission of the Oklahoma Department of 10 Commerce shall be to support firms', farms' and local communities' 11 growth, diversification, expansion and ability to compete in export 12 markets in order to create new and better jobs for Oklahomans 13 throughout the state community development and allow communities to 14 compete effectively in economic development opportunities. 15 AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.4, is SECTION 3. 16 amended to read as follows: 17 Section 5003.4 As used in the Oklahoma Department of Commerce 18 Act: 19 "Department" means the Oklahoma Department of Commerce; 1. 20 2. "Director" means the director Director of the Department of 21 Commerce; 22 3. "Enterprise" means a firm business with its principal place 23 of business operations in Oklahoma; 24 \_ \_

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1 "Economic Information System" means a comprehensive 4. 2 statewide data collection, analysis and distribution system which 3 makes available current and thorough information on Oklahoma 4 economic trends and future Oklahoma economic opportunities to 5 communities, firms, farms and individuals in the state; firms and 6 individuals outside the state considering location in Oklahoma; and 7 Oklahoma Futures, the Governor, the Legislature and all other state 8 agencies and institutions; and

9 5. "Economic Innovation System" means a decentralized statewide 10 system that responsively and innovatively coordinates technical 11 assistance, grant and loan programs with local, state, federal and 12 private sector activities into a single statewide Economic 13 Innovation System.

14SECTION 4.AMENDATORY74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.7, is15amended to read as follows:

Section 5003.7 A. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall prepare, with the cooperation of the Oklahoma business community, agricultural community, financial community, universities, labor and the state executive and legislative branches, a five-year economic development infrastructure and community development plan and annual updates for the State of Oklahoma.

1. The purpose of the plan shall be to identify significant economic, social, and demographic trends <u>and development</u> <u>opportunities</u> which may have both short-term and long-term impacts <sup>1</sup> on the state and local economy and to present strategies and <sup>2</sup> recommendations that the state and local political subdivisions <sup>3</sup> might adopt to improve or stabilize the economy.

2. The goals of the plan shall include the development of a
diversified state economy, increasing employment, the maximum use of
federal, state and local funds to achieve the goals or
recommendations included in the plan, the maximum investment of
capital in the economy of the state, and the improvement of the
quality of life in the state.

10 3. The plan wherever possible shall make recommendations <u>for</u> 11 <u>infrastructure investment</u> to encourage intergovernmental cooperation 12 and public and private cooperation.

4. Copies of the plan and the annual updates shall be submitted to the Oklahoma Advisory Committee on Intergovernmental Relations <u>state economic development entity</u>, the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the chairmen of the standing committees on economic development of the Senate and of the House of Representatives on the first day of each legislative session.

5. The Department shall develop and manage a complete economic information system which will support the five-year planning process, and which will make available complete and timely information on the state economy. The economic information system <del>shall may</del> be operated by public or private Oklahoma universities or <sup>1</sup> an Oklahoma enterprise capable of providing such services in a cost<sup>2</sup> effective manner.

3	6. The Department shall convene a working group of Oklahoma
4	state agencies who invest state and federal funds to develop
5	infrastructure to better coordinate and maximize deployment of
6	funds. Agencies included in the working group shall include, but
7	not be limited to, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the
8	Oklahoma Water Resources Board, and the Oklahoma Broadband Office.
9	7. The Department shall provide technical assistance to local
10	communities seeking to pursue federal funding opportunities.
11	Technical assistance may include identification of federal funding
12	opportunities, grant writing support, data collection, and
13	identifying funds to meet matching funds requirements.

14 The Department, in conjunction with the Oklahoma Development в. 15 Finance Authority, is authorized to develop an infrastructure 16 program which will enable political subdivisions of this state to 17 finance public works projects in order to modify or improve existing 18 public facilities for purposes of bringing said facilities, and the 19 operation thereof, into compliance with and maintaining compliance 20 with federal, state and local laws and regulations pertaining to the 21 protection of the public health and the environment.

C. The Director shall develop an annual business plan for the Department. The business plan shall include the need and mission of each division of the Department created by law or the Director and an analysis of past costs and benefits and future projected costs and benefits to the state of the programs of each division of the Department. The business plan shall be consistent with the goals of the recurring five-year plan specified in this section. The Director shall distribute copies of the business plan by such means that will make it widely available to communities, firms and local economic development managers throughout this state.

10 Section 5003.8 In order to ensure that the Oklahoma Department 11 of Commerce is effectively implementing its mission, purpose and 12 objectives, the Department shall publish an annual report setting 13 forth in detail the operations and programs conducted by it pursuant 14 to this act or to other legislation. The report shall review both 15 statewide progress and departmental progress according to several 16 measures including objective measures listed in the Department's 17 five-year plan. The Department shall present this report to the 18 Governor and the Legislature. The annual report shall specifically 19 account for ways in which the needs, mission and programs of the 20 Department described in this act have been carried out and 21 recommendations shall specifically note what changes in the 22 activities of the Department and the programs it administers and of 23 state government are necessary to better address the mission 24 described in this act. The Department shall distribute its annual \_ \_

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1 report by such means that will make it widely available to 2 communities, firms and local economic development managers 3 throughout this state. 4 SECTION 6. 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.10, is AMENDATORY 5 amended to read as follows: 6 Section 5003.10 The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall have 7 the authority to: 8 1. Disseminate Maintain information concerning the industrial, 9 commercial, governmental, educational, cultural, agricultural, 10 business and other advantages and attractions of the state; 11 2. Assist public and private agencies in the preparation of 12 informational and publicity programs designed to attract or retain 13 business and industry for the state plans for the development of 14 local communities; 15 3. Obligate and expend funds for services performed by local 16 political subdivisions of the state, state agencies, including 17 universities and colleges within and without the state, and federal 18 agencies for research and training in conformity with the general 19 state laws governing such activity; and apply for, accept, 20 administer and expend grants from the federal government and any 21 other public or private sources for research and training purposes; 22 4. Conduct, publish and disseminate or encourage research 23 designed to further new and more extensive uses of the natural and 24 \_ \_

1 other resources of the state and designed to develop and 2 commercialize new products and commercial processes;

3 5. Study trends and developments in the industries of the state and analyze the reasons underlying such trends; study costs within the state; and make recommendations regarding circumstances promoting or hampering business and industrial development;

7 6. Generally gather, compile and make available economic 8 analyses and statistical information relating to business, trade, 9 commerce, industry, transportation, communication, natural 10 resources, population and other like subjects in this state, with 11 authority to call upon other agencies, universities and colleges of 12 the state for statistical data and results obtained by them, and to 13 arrange and compile such economic analyses and statistical 14 information in such a manner as it deems advisable;

15 7. Study such other scientific, industrial, financial and 16 economic issues as, in the judgment of the Department, shall be 17 deemed of value to the people of the state;

18 Support and assist the efforts of state, regional and local 8. 19 development organizations, industrial committees, chambers of 20 commerce, agricultural organizations, labor organizations and other 21 similar public and private agencies to obtain new and to foster 22 expansion of existing service, industrial and manufacturing 23 facilities, businesses and enterprises; and to foster community 24 improvements in leadership, expertise, human development, \_ \_

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1 infrastructure, public facilities and quality of life; and to expand 2 data availability and utilization opportunities;

9. Maintain a continuing evaluation of the sources available for the financing of the development or expansion of industrial, agricultural and commercial facilities in this state through both public and private agencies;

7 10. Assist in obtaining financing for the development and 8 expansion of industrial, agricultural and commercial facilities in 9 the state;

10 11. Serve as the state's official liaison agency between 11 persons interested in locating new economic enterprises in Oklahoma 12 and state and local groups seeking new enterprises. In this 13 respect, the Department shall aid communities in organizing for and 14 obtaining new businesses and expanding existing businesses and shall 15 process requests which reflect interest in locating economic 16 enterprises in the state resource for local communities by providing 17 technical assistance for funding opportunities and community 18 development;

19 12. Promote the sale and facilitate the marketing of Oklahoma 20 products including agricultural and value-added products in the 21 international market;

22 13. Encourage the location of foreign manufacturing plants and 23 other industries in Oklahoma;

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1 14. Coordinate the international efforts of the various state 2 agencies without violating the individual authority given those 3 agencies by statute;

<sup>4</sup> 15. Coordinate and serve as liaison to the private sector as <sup>5</sup> needed;

6 16. Establish, subject to an annual appropriation or private 7 gifts, offices outside the state boundaries. The offices may be 8 operated by the state or may be operated pursuant to contract which 9 shall not be subject to the competitive bid laws of the State of 10 Oklahoma. The Department shall prepare an annual report concerning 11 the activities of the offices and submit it to the Governor and the 12 Legislature. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Commerce 13 shall notify in writing the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of 14 the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives that the 15 Department intends to establish a new office pursuant to this 16 paragraph at least thirty (30) days prior to the establishment of 17 the new office or execution of a contract;

18 17. 13. Establish a system of not less than six geographic regions for providing technical assistance and support to local communities in promoting new or existing businesses, assisting in the expansion of small and medium sized manufacturers through a modernization program, creating new jobs, and assisting local businesses, political subdivisions or other entities to better utilize the services of the Department;

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1 18. 14. Solicit, accept and expend donations and contributions 2 from any source, whether public or private, in order to advertise, 3 promote or disseminate information which may assist in the 4 recruitment of companies, firms or jobs to development of 5 communities in Oklahoma, including but not limited to the Oklahoma 6 Quality Jobs Program Act, and any other acts which the Department 7 administers or which may assist the Department in the performance of 8 its mission. The Department shall deposit any funds collected 9 pursuant to this paragraph in the "Oklahoma Department of Commerce 10 Revolving Fund" created by Section 5012 of this title; and 11 19. 15. Enter into contracts at fair market value for the rental 12 of office space in any facility under its control to entities 13 engaged in activities related to the export of goods produced in 14 development of Oklahoma. The Department shall deposit any funds

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024. SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
