HOUSE BILL 3275

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-103.6a, which relates to adoption and review of subject matter standards; deleting requirement to review standards within certain time frame; requiring standards changes to be made one year prior to certain textbook adoption cycle; prescribing legislative review and approval of certain standards; providing an exception; allowing minor technical changes in specified cases; providing process for State Board of Education to review standards; requiring review process to include three committees and a public comment period; establishing powers and duties of committees; mandating process for receiving and reviewing public comments; providing for implementation of certain standards during review process; deleting certain outdated comparison standards report; directing Board to update certain frameworks; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-103.6a, is amended to read as follows:

Section 11-103.6a A. Beginning with the ~~2014-15~~ 2024-2025 school year, each area of subject matter standards, except for

1 standards for career and technology education adopted pursuant to
2 Section 14-103 of this title, shall be adopted by the State Board of
3 Education and shall be subject to legislative review and approval as
4 provided for in Section 4 11-103.6a-1 of this ~~act~~ title. The
5 subject matter standards provided in Section 11-103.6 of this title
6 shall be implemented statewide by every public school district in
7 this state. The subject matter standards shall be thoroughly
8 reviewed by the State Board ~~every six (6) years~~ according to and in
9 coordination with the existing subject area textbook adoption cycle.
10 Changes made to subject matter standards shall be approved by the
11 Board and subject to legislative review and approval one (1) year
12 prior to the corresponding subject area textbook adoption cycle to
13 provide textbook vendors time to adjust textbook materials which
14 align to subject matter standards. The Board may determine a review
15 of subject matter standards is not necessary if the state textbook
16 cycle for a subject area is conducted in less than a six-year cycle.
17 If subject matter standards are reviewed fewer than twelve (12)
18 years after substantive changes have been made, the Executive
19 Committee, in consultation with the Department, may recommend minor
20 technical changes to the Board and waive the committee requirements
21 outlined in subparagraphs b and c of paragraph 2 of subsection B of
22 this section. After review, the State Board shall adopt any
23 revisions in such subject matter standards deemed necessary to
24 achieve further improvements in the quality of education for the

1 students of this state. Any revisions adopted by the State Board of
2 Education shall be subject to review and approval as provided for in
3 Section 4 11-103.6a-1 of this ~~act~~ title. The adoption of subject
4 matter standards or revisions to the standards by the State Board of
5 Education pursuant to this section shall not be promulgated as rules
6 and shall not be subject to Article I of the Administrative
7 Procedures Act.

8 B. 1. ~~In addition to the requirements set forth in subsection~~
9 ~~A of this section, on or before August 1, 2016, the~~ The State Board
10 of Education, in consultation with the Oklahoma State Regents for
11 Higher Education, and the State Board of Career and Technology
12 Education ~~and the Oklahoma Department of Commerce,~~ shall adopt
13 ensure all subject matter standards ~~for English Language Arts and~~
14 ~~Mathematics~~ which are college- and career-ready ~~and will replace~~
15 ~~current standards. To be considered college- and career ready, the~~
16 ~~standards shall be evaluated by the State Department of Education,~~
17 ~~the State Regents for Higher Education, the State Board of Career~~
18 ~~and Technology Education and the Oklahoma Department of Commerce and~~
19 ~~be determined to be such that the standards will address the goals~~
20 ~~of reducing the need for remedial coursework at the postsecondary~~
21 ~~level and increasing successful completion of postsecondary~~
22 ~~education. The subject matter standards and corresponding student~~
23 ~~assessments for English Language Arts and Mathematics shall be~~
24 ~~solely approved and controlled by the state through the State Board~~

1 ~~of Education~~ through a review and revision process as provided in
2 this section.

3 2. Upon the effective date of this act, the State Board of
4 Education shall ~~begin the process of adopting the English Language~~
5 ~~Arts and Mathematics standards and shall provide reasonable~~
6 ~~opportunity,~~ review subject matter standards consistent with best
7 practices, ~~for public comment on the revision of the standards,~~
8 ~~including but not limited to comments from students, parents,~~
9 ~~educators, organizations representing students with disabilities and~~
10 ~~English language learners, higher education representatives, career~~
11 ~~technology education representatives, subject matter experts,~~
12 ~~community-based organizations, Native American tribal~~
13 ~~representatives and business community representatives~~ and inclusive
14 of a variety of stakeholders across the state with expertise in the
15 subject area standards under review. Each standards review process
16 shall leverage three (3) committees and include a public comment
17 period to support the review and possible revision of subject matter
18 standards under review by the State Board of Education:

- 19 a. an Executive Committee consisting of five (5) to eight
20 (8) members shall be established for each subject
21 matter under review by the State Board of Education.
22 Executive Committee members shall be selected to
23 ensure representation from a variety of
24 characteristics, including geography, grade level
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1 expertise, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, and
2 experience in public education. At least one member
3 of the Executive Committee shall be a public school
4 educator in prekindergarten through twelfth grades and
5 at least one member shall be a representative of
6 higher education in the state with expertise in the
7 subject area standards under review. The Executive
8 Committee, in coordination with State Department of
9 Education staff, shall guide the subject matter
10 standards review process and select stakeholders to
11 serve on a Writing Committee and Draft Committee for
12 each subject area standards review through an
13 application process made available to the public on
14 the Department website and other standard forms of
15 communication. The Executive Committee, in
16 coordination with Department staff, and a Writing
17 Committee shall develop a set of criteria for quality
18 standards for each subject area standards under
19 review. The criteria used to guide the standards
20 review process shall be evidence-based and may
21 include, but shall not be limited to, the following:
22 (1) effective preparation for active citizenship and
23 postsecondary education or the workforce,
24 (2) subject matter content,
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- 1 (3) sequencing of subject matter content and
2 relationship to measurement of student
3 performance and the application of subject matter
4 standards,
5 (4) developmental appropriateness of grade-level
6 expectations, academic content, and instructional
7 rigor,
8 (5) clarity for educators and families,
9 (6) measurability of student proficiency in the
10 subject matter,
11 (7) evidence-based pedagogy,
12 (8) development of critical thinking skills, and
13 (9) demonstration of application of acquired
14 knowledge and skills,

15 b. a Writing Committee shall be established for each
16 subject area standards review and shall be tasked with
17 reviewing and, if necessary, revising the subject
18 matter standards utilizing criteria for quality
19 subject matter standards established by the Executive
20 Committee and Department staff. The Writing Committee
21 may recommend modifications to the criteria for
22 quality subject matter standards. Members of the
23 Writing Committee shall include representatives with
24 expertise in the subject matter standards under review
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1 from prekindergarten through twelfth grade education,
2 higher education, informal education, technology
3 center schools, and the community. Members shall be
4 selected by the Executive Committee members and
5 Department staff through an application process,
6 ensuring representation from a variety of
7 characteristics, including geography, grade level
8 experience, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, and
9 experience in public education. Educator expertise
10 shall be prioritized in the application selection
11 process for Writing Committee members with special
12 consideration for inclusion given to educators with
13 experience implementing the subject matter standards
14 under review, and

15 c. a Draft Review Committee shall be established for each
16 subject area standards review and shall be responsible
17 for reviewing and providing feedback on draft versions
18 of subject area standards produced by the Writing
19 Committee during each subject matter standards review
20 process. Feedback shall be consistent with the
21 quality criterion established by the Executive
22 Committee, Writing Committee, and Department staff
23 provided for in this section. Members of the Draft
24 Review Committee shall include representatives from
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1 prekindergarten through twelfth grade education,
2 higher education, informal education, career
3 technology, and the community and are selected by
4 Executive Committee members and Department staff
5 through an application process, ensuring
6 representation from a variety of characteristics,
7 including geography, grade level experience, ethnic
8 and cultural backgrounds, and experience.

9 3. The State Board of Education shall actively seek public
10 comments from diverse stakeholders including, but not limited to,
11 students, families of public school students, public school
12 educators, organizations representing students with disabilities and
13 English language learners, higher education representatives, career
14 technology education representatives, subject matter experts,
15 community-based organizations, Native American tribal
16 representatives, and business community representatives for a draft
17 version of subject matters standards produced by the Executive
18 Committee and Writing Committee. The State Board of Education shall
19 provide a public comment period of not less than thirty (30) days
20 for subject matter draft standards. Public comments shall be
21 reviewed by the Executive Committee and Writing Committee to
22 determine if additional modifications to the subject area standards
23 are needed.

1 4. Until the statewide student assessments for English Language
2 ~~Arts and Mathematics subject matter standards~~ are implemented as
3 ~~provided for in paragraph 1 of subsection C of this section~~
4 operational, the State Board of Education shall implement the
5 subject matter standards ~~for English Language Arts and Mathematics~~
6 which were in place prior to the ~~revisions adopted by the Board in~~
7 June 2010 review process provided for in this subsection.

8 ~~4. Upon the effective date of this act, the State Board of~~
9 ~~Education shall seek certification from the State Regents for Higher~~
10 ~~Education that the subject matter standards for English Language~~
11 ~~Arts and Mathematics which were in place prior to the revisions~~
12 ~~adopted by the Board in June 2010 are college- and career-ready as~~
13 ~~defined in the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)~~
14 ~~Flexibility document issued by the United States Department of~~
15 ~~Education and referenced in Option B of Principle 1: College and~~
16 ~~Career-Ready Expectations for All Students. The State Regents shall~~
17 ~~provide the Board a detailed description of the certification~~
18 ~~process and results, including a list of deficiencies if the State~~
19 ~~Regents conclude that the standards are not college- and career-~~
20 ~~ready. The Board shall post all documents, materials, reports,~~
21 ~~descriptions and correspondence produced by the State Regents or~~
22 ~~used by the State Regents in the certification process on the~~
23 ~~website for the State Department of Education.~~

1 C. 1. ~~On or before the 2017-18 school year, the State Board of~~
2 ~~Education, in consultation with the State Regents for Higher~~
3 ~~Education, the State Board of Career and Technology Education and~~
4 ~~the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, shall direct the process of the~~
5 ~~development of annual high quality statewide student assessments for~~
6 ~~English Language Arts and Mathematics as provided for in Section~~
7 ~~1210.508 of this title that align with the college and career ready~~
8 ~~subject matter standards developed pursuant to subsection B of this~~
9 ~~section.~~

10 2. ~~The statewide student assessments for English Language Arts~~
11 ~~and Mathematics shall continue to assess standards and objectives~~
12 ~~found in the subject matter standards for English Language Arts and~~
13 ~~Mathematics which were in place prior to the revisions adopted by~~
14 ~~the Board in June 2010 and the test blueprints shall continue to~~
15 ~~align to the standards and objectives found in such subject matter~~
16 ~~standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics until the new~~
17 ~~assessments are implemented as provided for in paragraph 1 of this~~
18 ~~subsection.~~

19 ~~D. 1.~~ The State Board of Education shall not enter into any
20 agreement, memorandum of understanding or contract with any federal
21 agency or private entity which in any way cedes or limits state
22 discretion or control over the process of development, adoption or
23 revision of subject matter standards and corresponding student
24 assessments in the public school system, including, but not limited

1 to, agreements, memoranda of understanding and contracts in exchange
2 for funding for public schools and programs. If the State Board of
3 Education is a party to such an agreement, memorandum of
4 understanding or contract on the effective date of this act, the
5 State Board of Education shall initiate necessary efforts to amend
6 the agreement, memorandum of understanding or contract to comply
7 with the requirements of this subsection.

8 2. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the
9 State Board of Education from seeking and being granted a waiver
10 from federal law, provided that the conditions for the waiver do not
11 require the state to cede or limit its discretion or control over
12 the process of development, adoption or revision of subject matter
13 standards and corresponding statewide student assessments.

14 3. The State Department of Education may participate in a
15 multistate or multigovernmental cooperative pursuant to the
16 requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, but shall not
17 bind the state, contractually or otherwise, to the authority of any
18 other state, organization or entity which may supersede the
19 authority of the State Board of Education.

20 ~~E. D.~~ D. The content of all subject matter standards ~~and~~
21 ~~corresponding student assessments~~ shall be solely approved and
22 controlled by the state through the State Board of Education and
23 subject to legislative review and approval. The State Board of
24 Education shall maintain independence of all subject matter
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1 standards referenced in Section 11-103.6 of this title and
2 corresponding statewide student assessments and shall not relinquish
3 authority over Oklahoma subject matter standards and corresponding
4 statewide student assessments. Nothing in this section shall
5 prohibit benchmarking the state subject matter standards and
6 corresponding student assessments with those of other states or
7 nations to allow comparison of Oklahoma subject matter standards and
8 corresponding student assessments with those of other states and
9 nations.

10 ~~F.~~ E. School districts shall exclusively determine the
11 instruction, curriculum, reading lists and instructional materials
12 and textbooks, subject to any applicable provisions or requirements
13 as set forth in law, to be used in meeting the subject matter
14 standards. School districts may, at their discretion, adopt
15 supplementary student assessments which are in addition to the
16 statewide student assessments.

17 ~~G. 1. Upon completion of the adoption of English Language Arts
18 and Mathematics subject matter standards pursuant to subsection B of
19 this section, the State Board of Education shall compare such
20 English Language Arts and Mathematics standards with the English
21 Language Arts and Mathematics standards that were adopted by the
22 State Board of Education prior to implementation of this act. The
23 State Board of Education shall consider public comments, the use of
24 best practices, evidence and research in the evaluation of both sets~~

1 ~~of standards. The State Board of Education shall compare the~~
2 ~~standards in the areas of:~~

- 3 a. ~~effective preparation for active citizenship and~~
4 ~~postsecondary education or the workforce,~~
- 5 b. ~~subject matter content,~~

20 ~~2. Upon completion of the comparison of the English Language~~
21 ~~Arts and Mathematics subject matter standards, the State Board of~~
22 ~~Education shall submit to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of~~
23 ~~Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the~~
24 ~~Minority Leader of the House of Representatives and the Minority~~
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1 ~~Leader of the Senate a report outlining the results of the~~
2 ~~comparison of the standards.~~

3 H. F. All subject matter standards and corresponding statewide
4 student assessments adopted by the State Board of Education shall be
5 carefully circumscribed to reflect direct application to subject
6 matter proficiency and statewide assessments shall not include
7 ~~standards or~~ assessment questions that are designed to collect or
8 measure noncognitive, emotional or psychological characteristics, or
9 attributes ~~or skills~~ of students.

10 G. Upon approval of changes to subject area standards by the
11 State Board of Education, and subject to the availability of funds,
12 the Department shall update subject matter curriculum frameworks
13 with resources to support public school districts with the
14 implementation of subject area standards.

15 ~~I. H.~~ H. Any rule, including but not limited to Rules 210:15-4-1
16 through 210:15-4-3 of the Oklahoma Administrative Code, which
17 conflicts with the requirements of this section, shall be amended or
18 repealed by the State Board of Education as necessary to comply with
19 the requirements of this section.

20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

21 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
22 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
