HOUSE BILL 3542 By: Pfeiffer

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AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to state government; creating the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency; providing for the separation of the Oklahoma Information Fusion Center from the Department of Public Safety; transferring all funds and property to new agency; allowing personnel to retain employment positions and status; authorizing agency to contract with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for payroll and administrative services; directing the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to coordinate the transfer of property and personnel; abolishing certain division within the Department of Public Safety upon completion of transfer; creating the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission; providing for membership; requiring appointments within certain time frame; stating term of appointments; designating the Executive Director as ex officio member and Secretary; providing for the selection of a chair and vice chair; providing quorum requirement; providing exemption from dual officeholding prohibition; stating powers and duties of the Commission; allowing reimbursement for certain expenses; establishing meeting and vacancy requirements; providing for clerical staff and meeting space; directing the Commission to comply with the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, Oklahoma Open Records Act, and the Administrative Procedures Act; stating powers and duties of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency; providing for the appointment of an Executive Director; stating qualifications; authorizing the appointment of assistants and staff; creating the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency Revolving Fund; providing sources of funds; providing for use of funds; prescribing procedures for expenditures;

providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

A new section of law to be codified SECTION 1. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 52.1 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created an agency of state government to be designated the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency.

Beginning November 1, 2024, the Oklahoma Information Fusion В. Center shall cease to be under the control of or in any manner affiliated with the Department of Public Safety and shall become a separate and distinct agency of the state, to be known as the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency. All unexpended funds, property, records, equipment, software, software licenses, personnel, grants, and outstanding financial obligations and encumbrances related to the Oklahoma Information Fusion Center shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency. All personnel shall retain their employment positions and status as unclassified employees, as well as any leave, sick, and annual time earned, and any retirement and longevity benefits which have accrued during tenure with the Oklahoma Information Fusion Center.

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- C. The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency may contract with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for payroll or other administrative services.
- D. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services is hereby directed to coordinate the transfer of funds, allotments, purchase orders, outstanding financial obligations, and encumbrances provided for in subsection B of this section. The transfer of personnel shall also be coordinated with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
- E. The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency is authorized to rent, lease, or own appropriate office space and property to conduct its business.
- F. The division within the Department of Public Safety known as the Oklahoma Information Fusion Center shall be abolished by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services after the transfer is completed.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 52.2 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission, which shall be an advisory body to the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency.

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- B. The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission shall consist of thirteen (13) members, or their designees, as follows:
 - 1. Seven of the members shall be:
 - a. the Commissioner of the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety,
 - b. the Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation,
 - c. the Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control,
 - d. the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management,
 - e. the Director of the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security,
 - f. the Secretary of the Oklahoma State Department of Agriculture, and
 - g. the Commissioner of the Oklahoma State Department of Health, and
 - 2. Six of the members shall be:
 - a. one member appointed by the Governor, who shall be a chief of police of a municipality with a population over one hundred thousand (100,000), as determined by the latest Federal Decennial Census, selected from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma

 Association of the Chiefs of Police,

- b. one member appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, who shall be a sheriff of a county with a population under twenty-five thousand (25,000), as determined by the latest Federal Decennial Census, selected from a list of three names submitted by the executive board of the Oklahoma Sheriff's Association,
- c. one member appointed by the Speaker Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, who is a district attorney selected from a list submitted by the District Attorneys Council,
- d. one member appointed by the Governor, who shall be a member or citizen of a federally recognized American Indian tribe or nation whose primary tribal headquarters is located in this state,
- e. one member appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma

 House of Representatives, who shall be a member or

 citizen of a federally recognized American Indian

 tribe or nation whose primary tribal headquarters is

 located in this state, and
- f. member appointed by the Speaker Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, who shall be a member or citizen of a federally recognized American Indian

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tribe or nation whose primary tribal headquarters is located in this state.

- C. Appointments to the initial Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission shall be made within forty-five (45) days of the effective date of this act.
- Each member of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission shall serve a term of four (4) years from the date of appointment. Members of the Commission shall not serve more than two consecutive terms.
- The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism E. Information Agency selected by the Commission shall be an ex officio member of the Commission and shall act as Secretary. A chair and vice-chair shall be elected annually from the membership of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission. A majority of the members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and for taking any official action. Official action of the Commission must have a favorable vote by a majority of the members present.
- Members who serve on the Commission shall be exempt from dual office-holding prohibitions pursuant to Section 6 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- G. The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission shall be the rulemaking body for the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency and shall have the power and duty to:

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- Establish the policies of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism
 Information Agency;
- 2. Adopt and promulgate rules as necessary and appropriate to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency;
- 3. Hire an Executive Director and other staff for its operation; and
- 4. Prepare a budget for expenditures necessary for the proper maintenance of the Commission and accomplishment of its purpose.
- H. Members appointed pursuant to subsection B of this section shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
- I. The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission shall meet as often as necessary at a place and time to be fixed by the Commission. Special meetings may be called by the chair or by four members of the Commission by delivery of written notice to each member of the Commission.
- J. Any vacancy occurring on the Oklahoma Counterterrorism

 Information Commission shall be filled for the unexpired term of office in the same manner as provided for in subsection B of this section.

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The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency shall provide clerical staff to perform designated duties of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission. The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency shall also provide space for meetings of the Commission.

Except as provided in Section 24A.28 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statues, the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Commission shall act in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Records Act, and shall be subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Administrative Procedures Act.

- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 52.3 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- The Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency shall have the power and duty to:
- Establish and maintain an information clearinghouse in order to accept and appropriately process intelligence information provided by law enforcement agencies, public safety agencies, private sector agencies, and concerned citizens;
- Provide informative reports and intelligence assessments, both strategic and tactical, for homeland security initiatives;
- 3. Provide real-time intelligence support to law enforcement and public safety agencies;

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- 4. Consolidate information and data on suspicious activities and threats from all jurisdictions within Oklahoma and the public;
- 5. Facilitate communication and collaboration with multidisciplinary partners including local, state, and federal law enforcement and non-governmental organizations; and
- 6. Provide early warning of incidents at the local, regional, and state levels.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 52.4 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism

Information Agency shall be appointed by the Oklahoma

Counterterrorism Information Commission. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency shall, at the time of the appointment, have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university and at least five (5) years of experience in law enforcement. The Executive Director may appoint necessary assistants and other personnel to perform the work of the agency and may prescribe their titles and duties and fix their compensation.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 52.5 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency to be

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    designated the "Oklahoma Counterterrorism Information Agency
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    Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject
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    to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of any monies received
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    from gifts, bequests, devises, contributions or grants, public or
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    private, including federal funds unless otherwise provided by
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    federal law or regulation, and receipts from any other source. All
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    monies accruing to the credit of said fund are hereby appropriated
    and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma Counterterrorism
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    Information Agency for general operations of the agency.
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    Expenditures from said fund shall be made upon warrants issued by
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    the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with
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    the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
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    approval and payment.
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        SECTION 6. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
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
