AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to driver licenses; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1550.42, which relates to entities authorized to print identification documents; clarifying language; removing certain limitation; removing certain exceptions; removing certain license renewal requirement; removing certain presumption; removing certain application; removing certain exemption; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-109.3, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 223, O.S.L. 2023 (26 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 4-109.3), which relates to motor vehicle licensing agencies and voter registration; prohibiting voter registration services from being provided to certain applicants and licensees; requiring Service Oklahoma to transmit certain identifying information to the Secretary of the State Election Board; requiring certain action and notice; prohibiting retention of certain information; providing certain exception; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as last amended by Section 5, Chapter 47, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 6-101), which relates to class requirements for driver licenses and fees; creating certain fee; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-103, as amended by Section 40, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 6-103), which relates to persons not to be licensed; updating statutory references; modifying preclusion; requiring certain documents be presented to allow for the issuance of driver licenses to aliens; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-106, as amended by Section 45, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 6-106), which relates to application for license; providing an acceptable form of proof of identity; allowing for certain information to be provided by an applicant; updating statutory reference; providing

1 certain preclusions; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section
2 6-114, as amended by Section 7, Chapter 47, 1st
3 Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp.
4 2023, Section 6-114), which relates to replacement
5 driver licenses; removing certain requirements and
6 replacement period limitations for aliens; amending
7 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-115, as amended by Section
8 55, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023,
9 Section 6-115), which relates to issuance,
10 expiration, and renewal of driver licenses; modifying
11 certain limitations for certain applicants or
12 licensees; requiring certain applicants provide
13 additional specific documentation; amending 47 O.S.
14 2021, Section 6-122, as amended by Section 62,
15 Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section
16 6-122), which relates to renewal by mail; modifying
17 certain exceptions; requiring Service Oklahoma to
18 provide certain notation of status; prohibiting voter
19 registration services from being provided to certain
20 applicants and licensees; updating statutory
21 language; providing for codification; and providing
22 an effective date.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1550.42, is
25 amended to read as follows:

26 Section 1550.42. ~~A.~~ The following entities may create, publish
27 or otherwise manufacture an identification document, identification
28 card, or identification certificate and may possess an engraved
29 plate or other such device for the printing of such identification;
30 provided, the name of the issuing entity shall be clearly printed
31 upon the face of the identification:

32 1. Businesses, companies, corporations, service organizations
33 and federal, state and local governmental agencies for employee

1 identification which is designed to identify the bearer as an
2 employee;

3 2. Businesses, companies, corporations and service
4 organizations for customer identification which is designed to
5 identify the bearer as a customer or member;

6 3. Federal, state and local government agencies for purposes
7 authorized or required by law or any legitimate purpose consistent
8 with the duties of such an agency, including, but not limited to,
9 voter identification cards, driver licenses, nondriver
10 identification cards, passports, birth certificates and social
11 security cards;

12 4. Any public school or state or private educational
13 institution, as defined by Sections 1-106, 21-101 or 3102 of Title
14 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to identify the bearer as an
15 administrator, faculty member, student or employee;

16 5. Any professional organization or labor union to identify the
17 bearer as a member of the professional organization or labor union;
18 and

19 6. Businesses, companies or corporations which manufacture
20 medical-alert identification for the wearer thereof.

21 ~~B. All identification documents as provided for in paragraph 3~~
22 ~~or 4 of subsection A of this section shall be issued only to United~~
23 ~~States citizens, nationals and legal permanent resident aliens.~~

1 ~~C. The provisions of subsection B of this section shall not~~
2 ~~apply when an applicant presents, in person, valid documentary~~
3 ~~evidence of:~~

4 ~~1. A valid, unexpired immigrant or nonimmigrant visa status for~~
5 ~~admission into the United States;~~

6 ~~2. A pending or approved application for asylum in the United~~
7 ~~States;~~

8 ~~3. Admission into the United States in refugee status;~~

9 ~~4. A pending or approved application for temporary protected~~
10 ~~status in the United States;~~

11 ~~5. Approved deferred action status; or~~

12 ~~6. A pending application for adjustment of status to legal~~
13 ~~permanent residence status or conditional resident status.~~

14 ~~Upon approval, the applicant may be issued an identification~~
15 ~~document provided for in paragraph 3 or 4 of subsection A of this~~
16 ~~section. Such identification document shall be valid only during~~
17 ~~the period of time of the authorized stay of the applicant in the~~
18 ~~United States or, if there is no definite end to the period of~~
19 ~~authorized stay, a period of one (1) year. Any identification~~
20 ~~document issued pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall~~
21 ~~clearly indicate that it is temporary and shall state the date that~~
22 ~~the identification document expires. Such identification document~~
23 ~~may be renewed only upon presentation of valid documentary evidence~~
24 ~~that the status by which the applicant qualified for the~~

1 ~~identification document has been extended by the United States~~
2 ~~Citizenship and Immigration Services or other authorized agency of~~
3 ~~the United States Department of Homeland Security.~~

4 D. ~~The provisions of subsection B of this section shall not~~
5 ~~apply to an identification document described in paragraph 4 of~~
6 ~~subsection A of this section that is only valid for use on the~~
7 ~~campus or facility of that educational institution and includes a~~
8 ~~statement of such restricted validity clearly and conspicuously~~
9 ~~printed upon the face of the identification document.~~

10 E. ~~Any driver license issued to a person who is not a United~~
11 ~~States citizen, national or legal permanent resident alien for which~~
12 ~~an application has been made for renewal, duplication or reissuance~~
13 ~~shall be presumed to have been issued in accordance with the~~
14 ~~provisions of subsection C of this section; provided that, at the~~
15 ~~time the application is made, the driver license has not expired, or~~
16 ~~been cancelled, suspended or revoked. The requirements of~~
17 ~~subsection C of this section shall apply, however, to a renewal,~~
18 ~~duplication or reissuance if the Department of Public Safety is~~
19 ~~notified by a local, state or federal government agency of~~
20 ~~information in the possession of the agency indicating a reasonable~~
21 ~~suspicion that the individual seeking such renewal, duplication or~~
22 ~~reissuance is present in the United States in violation of law. The~~
23 ~~provisions of this subsection shall not apply to United States~~
24 ~~citizens, nationals or legal permanent resident aliens.~~

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-109.3, as
2 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 223, O.S.L. 2023 (26 O.S. Supp.
3 2023, Section 4-109.3), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 4-109.3. A. When a qualified elector applies for
5 issuance or renewal of an Oklahoma driver license, or issuance of a
6 state identification card issued pursuant to Section 6-105 of Title
7 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, he or she shall be provided voter
8 registration services as required by the National Voter Registration
9 Act. The person shall be asked whether he or she wishes to register
10 to vote or to change his or her address for voting purposes. A
11 person who declines to register shall confirm such choice in writing
12 or by electronic means. Completed electronic voter registration
13 applications shall be electronically transmitted by the agency
14 accepting the application to the State Election Board or county
15 election board. Completed paper voter registration applications
16 shall be transmitted by the agency accepting the application at the
17 close of business each week to the State Election Board in
18 preaddressed, postage prepaid envelopes provided by the State
19 Election Board. If a person registers or declines to register to
20 vote, the office at which the person submits the voter registration
21 application or the fact that the person declined to register shall
22 remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration
23 purposes.

1 B. No voter registration services shall be offered to any
2 person who, at the time of an application for issuance or renewal of
3 an Oklahoma driver license or state identification card, provides
4 documentation that shows that the person is not a citizen of the
5 United States. Any applicant or licensee providing an individual
6 tax identification number to Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator
7 pursuant to Section 6-106 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall
8 not be provided voter registration services as the applicant or
9 licensee is not a qualified elector pursuant to this section.

10 C. A change of address for an Oklahoma driver license or state
11 identification card submitted by a registered voter shall also serve
12 as a change of address for voter registration purposes if the new
13 address is within the same county where the voter is registered to
14 vote. If the new address is outside the county where the voter is
15 currently registered to vote, the voter shall be sent a notice and
16 application with instructions for registering to vote at the new
17 address. A change of address for an Oklahoma driver license or
18 state identification card shall not be used to update a voter
19 registration address if the registrant states in writing or by
20 electronic means that the change of address is not for voter
21 registration purposes.

22 D. Licensed operators shall receive fifty cents (\$0.50) per
23 valid paper voter registration application or application for change
24 in voter registration taken by themselves and employees of the

1 licensed operator's office taken at the licensed operator's office,
2 payable by the State Election Board.

3 E. Service Oklahoma shall notify the Secretary of the State
4 Election Board of licensed operator appointments. Service Oklahoma
5 shall notify the Secretary of the State Election Board of licensed
6 operators qualified to issue driver licenses.

7 F. 1. At least weekly, Service Oklahoma shall electronically
8 transmit to the Secretary of the State Election Board a complete
9 list of identifying information that shall include the name, date of
10 birth, residential address, mailing address, and driver license
11 number of all applicants or licensees who have provided an
12 individual tax identification number pursuant to Section 6-106 of
13 Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

14 2. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall compare the
15 transmitted identifying information provided pursuant to paragraph 1
16 of this subsection with the list of registered voters in each
17 county. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall notify the
18 secretary of any relevant county election board of any matches based
19 on the identifying information provided by Service Oklahoma.

20 3. Upon receipt of notification from the Secretary of the State
21 Election Board pursuant to paragraph 2 of this subsection, the
22 secretary of the county election board shall notify the proper
23 authority pursuant to Section 16-123 of this title to investigate
24 whether a violation related to voting crimes or voter registration

1 has occurred, and any unlawful voter registration shall be
2 automatically canceled.

3 4. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall not retain
4 the information provided pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection
5 after the completion of his or her duties pursuant to paragraph 2 of
6 this subsection except as may be necessary when assisting with an
7 investigation.

8 G. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall promulgate
9 rules and procedures to implement the requirements of this section.

10 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as
11 last amended by Section 5, Chapter 47, 1st Extraordinary Session,
12 O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 6-101), is amended to read
13 as follows:

14 Section 6-101. A. No person, except those hereinafter
15 expressly exempted in Sections 6-102 and 6-102.1 of this title,
16 shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless
17 the person has a valid Oklahoma driver license for the class of
18 vehicle being operated under the provisions of this title. No
19 person shall be permitted to possess more than one valid license at
20 any time, except as provided in paragraph 4 of subsection F of this
21 section.

22 B. 1. No person shall operate a Class A commercial motor
23 vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and
24 holds a valid Class A commercial license, except as provided in
25

1 paragraph 5 of this subsection and subsection F of this section.

2 Any person holding a valid Class A commercial license shall be
3 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes A, B, C and D, except
4 as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

5 2. No person shall operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle
6 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
7 valid Class B commercial license, except as provided in paragraph 5
8 of subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class B
9 commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in
10 Classes B, C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this
11 subsection.

12 3. No person shall operate a Class C commercial motor vehicle
13 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
14 valid Class C commercial license, except as provided in subsection F
15 of this section. Any person holding a valid Class C commercial
16 license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes C
17 and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

18 4. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be
19 licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be
20 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172,
21 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section;
22 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be
23 licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded
24

1 for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F,
2 except as provided in subsection F of this section.

3 5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who
4 successfully completes all examinations required by law may be
5 issued by Service Oklahoma:

6 a. a restricted Class A commercial license which shall
7 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
8 A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest
9 purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or

10 b. a restricted Class B commercial license which shall
11 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
12 B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a
13 Class D motor vehicle.

14 6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the
15 person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class
16 D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this
17 title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be
18 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

19 C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section
20 may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and
21 highways in this state.

22 D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle
23 without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle
24 endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant

1 for an original driver license shall be required to successfully
2 complete a written examination, vision examination and driving
3 examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of
4 Public Safety, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified
5 state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the
6 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the applicant
7 is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a
8 motorcycle endorsement thereon. The written examination and driving
9 examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service Oklahoma
10 upon verification that the person has successfully completed a
11 certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the
12 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

13 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully
14 possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for
15 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written
16 examination, vision examination and driving examination for a
17 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, in conjunction with
18 Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic
19 rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service
20 Oklahoma, if the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to
21 be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination
22 and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service
23 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully
24

1 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course
2 approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

3 F. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply
4 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. Service
5 Oklahoma, after the applicant has passed all parts of the
6 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all
7 parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license
8 other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a
9 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having
10 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a
11 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant
12 to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C
13 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the
14 purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules
15 promulgated by the Department.

16 2. This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period
17 as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one hundred eighty
18 (180) days, which may be renewed one time for an additional one
19 hundred eighty (180) days; provided, such commercial learner permit
20 may be suspended, revoked, canceled, denied or disqualified at the
21 discretion of the Department, with notice to Service Oklahoma, for
22 violation of the restrictions, for failing to give the required or
23 correct information on the application or for violation of any
24 traffic laws of this state pertaining to the operation of a motor

1 vehicle. Except as otherwise provided, the lawful possessor of a
2 commercial learner permit who has been issued a commercial learner
3 permit for a minimum of fourteen (14) days may have the restriction
4 requiring an accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily
5 completing a driver's examination; provided, the removal of a
6 restriction shall not authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C
7 commercial motor vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited
8 by law.

9 3. No person shall apply for and Service Oklahoma shall not
10 issue an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person
11 has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for
12 at least fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class
13 B or C license and who wishes to apply for another class of
14 commercial driver license shall be required to apply for a
15 commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at least
16 fourteen (14) days before applying for the Class A or B license, as
17 applicable. Any person who currently holds a Class A, B or C
18 license and who wishes to add an endorsement or remove a restriction
19 for which a skills examination is required shall be required to
20 apply for a commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at
21 least fourteen (14) days before applying for the endorsement.

22 4. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by Service
23 Oklahoma as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only
24 in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional

1 driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of
2 which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they have
3 been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial motor
4 vehicle as provided in this subsection.

5 5. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as
6 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit
7 shall not be renewed again. Any person who has held a commercial
8 learner permit for the initial issuance period and one renewal
9 period shall not be eligible for and Service Oklahoma shall not
10 issue another renewal of the permit; provided, the person may
11 reapply for a new commercial learner permit, as provided for in this
12 subsection.

13 G. 1. For purposes of this title:

14 a. "REAL ID Compliant Driver License" or "Identification
15 Card" means a driver license or identification card
16 issued by this state that has been certified by the
17 United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS)
18 as compliant with the requirements of the REAL ID Act
19 of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13. A REAL ID Compliant
20 Driver License or Identification Card and the process
21 through which it is issued incorporate a variety of
22 security measures designed to protect the integrity
23 and trustworthiness of the license or card. A REAL ID
24 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card will

1 be clearly marked on the face indicating that it is a
2 compliant document, and

- 3 b. "REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License" or
4 "Identification Card" means a driver license or
5 identification card issued by this state that has not
6 been certified by the United States Department of
7 Homeland Security (USDHS) as being compliant with the
8 requirements of the REAL ID Act of 2005. A REAL ID
9 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
10 will be clearly marked on the face indicating that it
11 is not compliant with the federal REAL ID Act of 2005
12 and is not acceptable for official federal purposes.
13 The driver license or identification card will have a
14 unique design or color indicator that clearly
15 distinguishes it from a compliant license or card.

16 2. Original Driver License and Identification Card Issuance:

- 17 a. Application for an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
18 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
19 shall be made to Service Oklahoma.
20 b. Service Oklahoma employees shall perform all document
21 recognition and other requirements needed for approval
22 of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
23 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
24 application.

1 c. Upon approval of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
2 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
3 application, the applicant may take the approved
4 application document to a licensed operator to receive
5 a temporary driver license or identification card.

6 d. The licensed operator shall process the approved REAL
7 ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
8 Identification Card application and upon payment shall
9 provide the applicant a temporary driver license or
10 identification card. A temporary driver license or
11 identification card shall afford the holder the
12 privileges otherwise granted by the specific class of
13 driver license or identification card for the period
14 of time listed on the temporary driver license or
15 identification card or the period of time prior to the
16 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
17 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card,
18 whichever time period is shorter.

19 3. REAL ID Compliant Driver License and Identification Card

20 Renewal and Replacement:

21 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
22 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card may be
23 made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator;
24 provided, such licensed operator is authorized to
25

1 process application for REAL ID Compliant Driver
2 Licenses and Identification Cards. A licensed
3 operator may process the voluntary downgrade of a REAL
4 ID Compliant Commercial Driver License to any lower
5 class license upon request of the licensee; provided,
6 no additional endorsements or restrictions are placed
7 on the license.

8 b. Service Oklahoma employees or authorized licensed
9 operators shall perform all document recognition and
10 other requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
11 replacement REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
12 Identification Card application.

13 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
14 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card
15 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
16 driver license or identification card from Service
17 Oklahoma or an authorized licensed operator.

18 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
19 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
20 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
21 the specific class of driver license or identification
22 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time
23 listed on the temporary driver license or
24 identification card or the period of time prior to the

1 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant Driver License
2 or Identification Card, whichever time period is
3 shorter.

- 4 e. For purposes of this title, an application for a REAL
5 ID Compliant Driver License or Identification Card by
6 an individual with a valid Oklahoma-issued driver
7 license or identification card shall be considered a
8 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
9 Identification Card.

10 4. REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License and Identification Card

11 Renewal and Replacement:

- 12 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
13 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card may
14 be made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator.
15 A licensed operator may process the voluntary
16 downgrade of a REAL ID Noncompliant Commercial Driver
17 License to any lower class license upon request of the
18 licensee; provided, no additional endorsements or
19 restrictions are added to the license.
- 20 b. Service Oklahoma employees or licensed operators shall
21 perform all document recognition and other
22 requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
23 replacement REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
24 Identification Card application.

1 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
2 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
3 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
4 driver license or identification card from Service
5 Oklahoma or a licensed operator.

6 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
7 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
8 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
9 the specific class of driver license or identification
10 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time
11 listed on the temporary driver license or
12 identification card or the period of time prior to the
13 applicant receiving a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
14 License or Identification Card, whichever time period
15 is shorter.

16 H. 1. The fee charged for an approved application for an
17 original Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
18 License or an approved application for the addition of an
19 endorsement to a current valid Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
20 Noncompliant Driver License shall be assessed in accordance with the
21 following schedule:

22	Class A Commercial Learner	
23	Permit	\$25.00
24	Class A Commercial License	\$25.00

19 revoked, canceled or denied in this state or any other state or
20 country until the driving privilege has been reinstated by the state
21 or country withdrawing the privilege;

22 4. Any person who is classified as an excessive user of
23 alcohol, any other intoxicating substance, or a combination of
24 alcohol and any other intoxicating substance, and inimical to public
25

1 safety, in accordance with rules promulgated by the Department,
2 until all requirements granting or reinstating driving privileges
3 are met, including, but not limited to, abstinence from the use of
4 alcohol, any other intoxicating substance, or any combination of

14 been refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for the suspension,
15 revocation or refusal;

16 10. Whether the applicant is an alien eligible to be considered
17 for licensure and is not prohibited from licensure pursuant to
18 paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this title;

19 11. Whether the applicant has:

20 a. previously been licensed and, if so, when and by what
21 state or country, and

22 b. held more than one license at the same time during the
23 immediately preceding ten (10) years; and

1 12. Social Security number or an individual tax identification
2 number issued by the United States Internal Revenue Service.

3 No person shall request Service Oklahoma to use the Social Security
4 number of that person as the driver license number. Upon renewal or
5 replacement of any driver license issued after ~~the effective date of~~
6 ~~this act~~ July 1, 2001, the licensee shall advise Service Oklahoma or
7 the licensed operator if the present driver license number of the
8 licensee is the Social Security number of the licensee. If the
9 driver license number is the Social Security number, Service
10 Oklahoma or the licensed operator shall change the driver license
11 number to a computer-generated alphanumeric identification. An
12 applicant providing an individual tax identification number shall

15 requested may include full name, address, and phone number. The
16 emergency contact information shall be maintained by Service

21 Public Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this
22 title, and
- 23 f. (1) Two Dollars (\$2.00) of the fee authorized by this
24 paragraph related to the replacement of a driver
25

1 license by a licensed operator that does not
2 process approved applications or renewals for
3 REAL ID Compliant Driver Licenses or
4 Identification Cards shall be deposited, in
5 addition to the amount authorized by subparagraph
6 e of this paragraph, to the State Public Safety
7 Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title, or
8 (2) Two Dollars (\$2.00) of the fee authorized by this
9 paragraph related to the replacement of a driver
10 license by a licensed operator that does process
11 approved applications or renewals for REAL ID
12 Compliant Driver Licenses or Identification Cards
13 shall be retained by the licensed operator
14 through June 30, 2023. Beginning July 1, 2023,
15 these monies shall be retained by the licensed
16 operator pursuant to subsection E of Section
17 1141.1 of this title.

18 3. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules prescribing forms of
19 primary and secondary identification acceptable for replacement of
20 an Oklahoma driver license; provided, however, a valid and unexpired
21 U.S. passport shall be acceptable as both primary and secondary
22 identification.

23 B. Any person desiring to add or remove an endorsement or
24 endorsements or a restriction or restrictions to any existing driver
25

1 license, when authorized by Service Oklahoma, shall obtain a
2 replacement license with the endorsement or endorsements or the
3 restriction or restrictions change thereon and shall be charged the
4 fee for a replacement license as provided in subsection A of this
5 section.

6 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-115, as
7 amended by Section 55, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023,
8 Section 6-115), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 6-115. A. Except as otherwise provided in this
10 section, every driver license shall be issued for a period of either
11 four (4) years or eight (8) years; provided, if the applicant or
12 licensee ~~is an alien~~ provides an individual tax identification
13 number pursuant to Section 6-106 of this title, the license shall be
14 issued for a period which does not exceed ~~the lesser of:~~

- 15 1. ~~Four (4) years or eight (8) years; or~~
- 16 2. ~~The expiration date on the valid documentation authorizing~~
17 ~~the presence of the applicant or licensee in the United States, as~~
18 ~~required by paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this~~
19 ~~title~~ two (2) years.

20 B. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the expiration
21 date of an initial license shall be no more than either four (4)
22 years or eight (8) years from the last day of the month of issuance
23 or no more than either four (4) years or eight (8) years from the
24

1 last day of the birth month of the applicant immediately preceding
2 the date of issuance, if requested by the applicant.

3 C. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the expiration
4 date of a renewal license shall be:

5 1. For a renewal during the month of expiration, either four
6 (4) years or eight (8) years from the last day of the month of
7 expiration of the expiring license or either four (4) or eight (8)
8 years from the last day of the birth month of the licensee
9 immediately preceding the expiration date of the expiring license,
10 if requested by the licensee; or

11 2. For a renewal prior to the month of expiration, as provided
12 by rule of Service Oklahoma, either four (4) or eight (8) years from
13 the last day of the month of expiration of the current license;
14 provided, no license shall be issued with an expiration date of more
15 than five (5) years from the date of renewal on a four (4) year
16 license or nine (9) years from the date of renewal on an eight (8)
17 year license.

18 D. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection E of Section
19 1550.42 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, any Oklahoma driver
20 license that is not more than one (1) year past the date of
21 expiration provided on the driver license shall be presumed to be a
22 valid form of identification for the purposes of renewing an
23 Oklahoma driver license.

1 E. Except as otherwise provided in this section, every driver
2 license shall be renewable by the licensee upon application to
3 either Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator, furnishing the
4 current mailing address of the person and payment of the required
5 fee, if the person is otherwise eligible for renewal. If the
6 licensee is an ~~alien~~ applicant that was previously issued a driver
7 license after confirmation by the Tax Commission to Service Oklahoma
8 that the applicant filed a 2024 state tax return pursuant to
9 subsection A of Section 6-103 of this title and an individual tax
10 identification number pursuant to subsection B of Section 6-106 of
11 this title, then the licensee shall appear before a driver license
12 examiner of Service Oklahoma ~~and shall be issued a renewal driver~~

19 confirm to Service Oklahoma that the applicant has filed a state tax
20 return for each year between the date of issuance of the license and
21 for the year prior to the expiration of the license.

22 F. All applicants for renewals of driver licenses who have
23 proven collision records or apparent physical defects may be
24 required to take an examination as specified by Service Oklahoma.

1 G. When a person makes application for a driver license, or
2 makes application to renew a driver license, and the person has been
3 convicted of, or received a deferred judgment for, any offense
4 required to register pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act,
5 the driver license shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from
6 the month of issuance, but may be renewed yearly during the time the
7 person is registered on the Sex Offender Registry. Notwithstanding
8 any other provision of law, the cost for such license shall be the
9 same as for other driver licenses and renewals.

10 H. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules prescribing forms of
11 identification acceptable for the renewal of an Oklahoma driver
12 license.

13 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-122, as
14 amended by Section 62, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023,
15 Section 6-122), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 6-122. Service Oklahoma may develop procedures whereby
17 driver licenses issued under the provisions of Section 6-101 et seq.
18 of this title may be renewed or replaced by the applicant by mail or
19 online except for licenses to be renewed ~~or replaced by aliens~~ by
20 applicants having previously provided proof of having filed a state
21 tax return and an individual tax identification number as prescribed
22 by subsection E of Section 6-115 of this title. Any license issued
23 pursuant to this section shall be valid for a period as prescribed
24 in Section 6-115 of this title. Service Oklahoma shall not renew or

1 replace a license by mail or online unless the immediately preceding
2 issuance, renewal or replacement was done in person by the
3 applicant.

4 Provided, any person or the spouse or dependent of a person:

5 1. Who is on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United
6 States; or

7 2. Who is currently employed as a civilian contractor with the
8 Armed Forces of the United States,
9 living outside of Oklahoma and having a valid Class D driver license
10 issued by ~~the State of Oklahoma~~ this state, requiring no material
11 change, may apply for no more than three consecutive renewals or
12 replacement of such license by mail or online, in accordance with
13 Service Oklahoma rules. A fourth consecutive renewal or replacement
14 must be done in person.

15 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-125 of Title 47, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. Service Oklahoma shall make space available on the
19 credential line of the front of a driver license issued to an
20 applicant who provided an individual tax identification number to
21 prominently print "ITIN Non-citizen", which shall be designed by
22 Service Oklahoma and shall serve as a notation of status as a non-
23 citizen of the United States.

1 B. Service Oklahoma shall include the words "License holder is
2 not a U.S. citizen and is ineligible to vote in any election" on all
3 driver licenses affixed with "ITIN Non-citizen" as required by
4 subsection A of this section.

5 C. An applicant or licensee who provides an individual tax
6 identification number to Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator
7 shall be prohibited from receiving voter registration services as
8 described in subsection A of Section 4-109.3 of Title 26 of the
9 Oklahoma Statutes.

10 D. For any driver license issued pursuant to Section 6-106 of
11 Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the driver license found in Field
12 4 shall begin with the letters "ITIN".

13 SECTION 10. This act shall become effective January 1, 2025.

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
