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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to medical marijuana; directing
8 promulgation of rules to impose limits on
9 tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) potency of medical
10 marijuana and medical marijuana products; allowing
11 Executive Director to set limits at his or her
12 discretion; setting maximum limits on potency;
13 prohibiting licensed medical marijuana dispensary
14 from selling medical marijuana or medical marijuana
15 product that exceeds potency limits or certain
16 products to patients under a certain age; directing
17 dispensaries to distribute certain educational
18 material as directed by rule; providing for
19 codification; and providing an effective date.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 427.18a of Title 63, unless
23 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 A. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana
Authority shall promulgate rules to limit the tetrahydrocannabinol
(THC) serving size of edible medical marijuana products sold in
medical marijuana dispensaries. The serving sizes imposed by such
rules shall be at the discretion of the Executive Director;

1 provided, that the limits do not exceed one thousand (1,000)
2 milligrams THC per package for edible medical marijuana products.

3 B. A licensed medical marijuana dispensary shall not sell any
4 edible medical marijuana product that exceeds the THC per package
5 limits imposed in this section.

6 C. For medical marijuana patients eighteen (18) years of age or
7 younger, the Executive Director may impose further limits on THC per
8 serving in edible medical marijuana products. No dispensaries shall
9 be allowed to sell any medical marijuana product for the use of
10 vaping to any medical marijuana patient eighteen (18) years of age
11 or younger.

12 D. The Executive Director shall establish rules that require
13 dispensaries to provide educational information to patients
14 regarding potency, dosing, and physiological impacts pertaining to
15 usage and consumption of medical marijuana and medical marijuana
16 products.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 2026.

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
