SENATE BILL 225

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to public health; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 7301, which relates to diabetes prevention reporting; modifying reporting period; requiring submission to Governor; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 7301, is amended to read as follows:

Section 7301. A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the State Department of Health shall collaborate to identify benchmarks and develop goals to reduce the incidence rates of, improve health care services for, and control complications resulting from diabetes.

B. The Authority and the Department shall submit a report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate ~~and,~~ the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Governor by ~~January 10th of odd-numbered years~~ January 10 of every fifth year, beginning January 10, 2024. Such report shall contain the following information:

1 1. The fiscal impact of all types of diabetes on the Authority,
2 the Department, and county health departments including the number
3 of persons with diabetes receiving services through the Authority,
4 the Department, and county health departments;

5 2. The fiscal impact of diabetes on the Authority, the
6 Department, and county health departments in comparison to other
7 chronic diseases;

8 3. An assessment of the benefits of diabetes prevention
9 programs including a summary of funding directed to the Authority
10 and the Department from the ~~Oklahoma State~~ Legislature;

11 4. A description of coordination between the Authority and the
12 Department including, but not limited to, programs relating to the
13 treatment and prevention of all forms of diabetes;

14 5. Detailed action plans for battling diabetes with actionable
15 items for consideration by the Legislature including, but not
16 limited to, steps to reduce the impact of diabetes, pre-diabetes,
17 and related diabetes complications;

18 6. Identification of expected outcomes of the action steps and
19 benchmarks for controlling and preventing all forms of diabetes; and

20 7. The development of a detailed budget blueprint identifying
21 needs, costs, and resources required to implement the plan provided
22 for in this ~~act~~ section. Such blueprint shall include a budget
23 range for all options presented in the plan for consideration by the
24 Legislature.

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1 C. The provisions of this ~~act~~ section shall be limited to
2 diabetes information, data, initiatives, and programs within the
3 Authority and the Department prior to ~~the effective date of this act~~
4 November 1, 2015, unless there is available funding for diabetes in
5 each agency that may be used for new research, data collection
6 reporting or other requirements of this ~~act~~ section.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
