7	An Act relating to fish and wildlife; amending 29
8	O.S. 2021, Section 7-503, which relates to prohibition on sales of protected fish and wildlife;
9	removing provision for all seized wildlife and parts to be sold and the proceeds from sale to be deposited
10	into certain fund; and providing an effective date.

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 7-503, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 7-503. A. Except as otherwise provided for by law, no
16	person may buy, barter, trade, sell or offer, or expose for sale all
17	or any part of any fish or wildlife or the nest or eggs of any bird,
18	protected by law. The carcasses or any parts thereof of legally
19	acquired furbearing animals or coyotes may be purchased, bartered,
20	traded, sold or offered for sale. The fur or pelt of legally
21	acquired squirrels may be purchased, bartered, traded, sold or
22	offered for sale.
23	B. Persons licensed to propagate or sell fish or wildlife
24	pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation

Code and persons who have documentation of legally purchased fish or wildlife or parts thereof for resale are exempt from the provisions of this section.

C. All wildlife or parts thereof seized pursuant to the provisions of this section and determined to be unfit for release in a suitable locale shall be sold. The proceeds from said sale shall be deposited in the Wildlife Conservation Fund.

8 D. No person shall buy, barter, trade, or sell, within this 9 state, any furbearing animal, game animal, or game fish, or any part 10 thereof, acquired from a source within or outside of this state 11 unless at the time and place of each such sale, the seller shall 12 possess an invoice signed by the person from whom said seller 13 purchased said animals or fish, which shall contain a statement of 14 the source from which said animals or fish were acquired, and the 15 species and quantity of each species, or parts thereof, delivered to 16 said seller.

17 E. D. Persons who have obtained legal possession of wildlife or 18 parts of wildlife after being given to the person for taxidermic 19 preparation or processing of the meat for consumption shall be 20 permitted to dispose of such, unless otherwise prohibited by law, 21 under rules established by the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation 22 Commission.

 $\frac{23}{\text{F. E.}}$ The animal, bird, fish, or part thereof shall be confiscated by the arresting authority and forwarded to the

Commission to be held until the matter is resolved. If a person violating the provisions of this section is convicted, the Commission shall retain and properly dispose of the confiscated animal, bird, fish, or part thereof. If a person accused of violating the provisions of this section is acquitted, the confiscated animal, bird, fish, or part thereof shall be returned to the possession of the person from whom it was confiscated.

8 G. <u>F.</u> The first violation of any of the provisions of this 9 section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than One Hundred 10 Dollars (\$100.00), nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or 11 by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not less than ten 12 (10) days nor more than sixty (60) days, or by both said fine and 13 imprisonment.

Subsequent violations of the provisions of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not less than ten (10) days nor more than sixty (60) days, or by both said fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
