8 PROPOSED POLICY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

9 An Act relating to professional entities; amending 18  
10 O.S. 2021, Section 803, as amended by Section 1,  
11 Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section  
12 803), which relates to definition used in the  
13 Professional Entity Act; modifying the definition of  
14 professional service; and providing an effective  
15 date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 18 O.S. 2021, Section 803, as  
18 amended by Section 1, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2024,  
19 Section 803), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 803. A. As used in the Professional Entity Act, unless  
21 the context clearly indicates that a different meaning is intended:

22 1. "Associated act" means the Oklahoma General Corporation Act,  
23 in the case of a corporation; the Uniform Limited Partnership Act of  
24 2010, in the case of a limited partnership; or the Oklahoma Limited  
Liability Company Act, in the case of a limited liability company;

1        2. "Interest" means a share of stock in a corporation, a  
2 partnership interest in a limited partnership or a membership  
3 interest in a limited liability company;

4        3. "Owner" means a shareholder in the case of a corporation, a  
5 general or limited partner in the case of a limited partnership or a  
6 member in the case of a limited liability company;

7        4. "Manager" means a director or officer in the case of a  
8 corporation, a general partner in the case of a limited partnership  
9 or a manager in the case of a limited liability company;

10       5. "Professional entity" means a domestic or qualified foreign  
11 corporation, limited partnership or limited liability company formed  
12 for the purpose of rendering professional service or formed for the  
13 purpose of owning a professional entity rendering professional  
14 service;

15       6. "Professional service" means the personal service rendered  
16 by:

17           a. a physician, surgeon or doctor of medicine pursuant to  
18 a license under Sections 481 through 524 of Title 59  
19 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
20 regulating the practice of medicine,

21           b. an osteopathic physician or surgeon pursuant to a  
22 license under Sections 620 through 645 of Title 59 of  
23 the Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
24 regulating the practice of osteopathy,

- 1 c. a chiropractic physician pursuant to a license under  
2 Sections 161.1 through 161.20 of Title 59 of the  
3 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating  
4 the practice of chiropractic,
- 5 d. a podiatric physician pursuant to a license under  
6 Sections 135.1 through 160.2 of Title 59 of the  
7 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating  
8 the practice of podiatric medicine,
- 9 e. an optometrist pursuant to a license under Sections  
10 581 through 606 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes,  
11 and any subsequent laws regulating the practice of  
12 optometry,
- 13 f. a veterinarian pursuant to a license under Sections  
14 698.1 through 698.30b of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
15 Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating the  
16 practice of veterinary medicine,
- 17 g. an architect pursuant to a license under Sections 46.1  
18 through 46.41 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes,  
19 and any subsequent laws regulating the practice of  
20 architecture,
- 21 h. an attorney pursuant to his or her authority to  
22 practice law granted by the Supreme Court of this  
23 state,
- 24

- 1 i. a dentist pursuant to a license under Sections 328.1  
2 through 328.53 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes,  
3 and any subsequent laws regulating the practice of  
4 dentistry,
- 5 j. a certified public accountant or a public accountant  
6 pursuant to his or her authority to practice  
7 accounting under Sections 15.1 through 15.38 of Title  
8 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
9 regulating the practice of public accountancy,
- 10 k. a psychologist pursuant to a license under Sections  
11 1351 through 1376 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
12 Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating the  
13 practice of psychology,
- 14 l. a physical therapist pursuant to a license under  
15 Sections 887.1 through 887.18 of Title 59 of the  
16 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating  
17 the practice of physical therapy,
- 18 m. a registered nurse pursuant to a license under  
19 Sections 567.1 through 567.19 of Title 59 of the  
20 Oklahoma Statutes, and any other subsequent laws  
21 regulating the practice of nursing,
- 22 n. a professional engineer pursuant to a license under  
23 Sections 475.1 through 475.22a of Title 59 of the  
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1 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws relating to  
2 the practice of engineering,

3 o. a land surveyor pursuant to a license under Sections  
4 475.1 through 475.22a of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
5 Statutes, and any subsequent laws relating to the  
6 practice of land surveying,

7 p. an occupational therapist pursuant to Sections 888.1  
8 through 888.15 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes  
9 and any subsequent law regulating the practice of  
10 occupational therapy,

11 q. a speech pathologist or speech therapist pursuant to  
12 Sections 1601 through 1622 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
13 Statutes, and any subsequent law regulating the  
14 practice of speech pathology,

15 r. an audiologist pursuant to Sections 1601 through 1622  
16 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any  
17 subsequent law regulating the practice of audiology,

18 s. a registered pharmacist pursuant to Sections 353  
19 through 360 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and  
20 any subsequent law regulating the practice of  
21 pharmacy,

22 t. a licensed perfusionist pursuant to Sections 2051  
23 through 2071 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and  
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1 any subsequent laws regulating the practice of  
2 perfusionists,

3 u. a licensed professional counselor pursuant to Sections  
4 1901 through 1920 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
5 Statutes, and any subsequent law regulating the  
6 practice of professional counseling,

7 v. a licensed marital and family therapist pursuant to  
8 Sections 1925.1 through 1925.18 of Title 59 of the  
9 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent law regulating  
10 the practice of marital and family therapy,

11 w. a dietitian licensed pursuant to Sections 1721 through  
12 1739 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes and any  
13 subsequent laws regulating the practice of dietitians,

14 x. a social worker licensed pursuant to Sections 1250  
15 through 1273 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and  
16 any subsequent laws regulating the practice of social  
17 work,

18 y. a licensed alcohol and drug counselor pursuant to  
19 Sections 1870 through 1885 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
20 Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating the  
21 practice of alcohol and drug counseling,

22 z. a licensed behavioral practitioner pursuant to  
23 Sections 1930 through 1949.1 of Title 59 of the  
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1 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating  
2 the practice of behavioral health services, ~~or~~

3 aa. a certified real estate appraiser licensed pursuant to  
4 Sections 858-700 through 858-732 of Title 59 of the  
5 Oklahoma Statutes or listed on the National Registry  
6 of Appraisers by the Appraisal Subcommittee in  
7 compliance with Title XI of the Financial Institutions  
8 Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act (FIRREA) of  
9 1989, and any subsequent laws regulating the practice  
10 of real estate appraisal, or

11 bb. a human resource professional defined as someone who  
12 works in the human resources department of an  
13 organization, managing the employee life cycle and  
14 performing tasks including recruiting, hiring,  
15 training, and administering benefits;

16 7. "Related professional services" means those services which  
17 are combined for professional entity purposes as follows:

18 a. any combination of the following professionals:

19 (1) a physician, surgeon or doctor of medicine  
20 pursuant to a license under Sections 481 through  
21 524 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any  
22 subsequent laws regulating the practice of  
23 medicine,  
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- 1 (2) an osteopathic physician or surgeon pursuant to a  
2 license under Sections 620 through 645 of Title  
3 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent  
4 laws relating to the practice of osteopathy,
- 5 (3) a dentist pursuant to a license under Sections  
6 328.1 through 328.53 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
7 Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating the  
8 practice of dentistry,
- 9 (4) a chiropractic physician pursuant to a license  
10 under Sections 161.1 through 161.20 of Title 59  
11 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
12 regulating the practice of chiropractic,
- 13 (5) a psychologist pursuant to a license under  
14 Sections 1351 through 1376 of Title 59 of the  
15 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
16 regulating the practice of psychology,
- 17 (6) an optometrist pursuant to a license under  
18 Sections 581 through 606 of Title 59 of the  
19 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
20 regulating the practice of optometry,
- 21 (7) a podiatric physician pursuant to a license under  
22 Sections 135.1 through 160.2 of Title 59 of the  
23 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
24 regulating the practice of podiatric medicine,

1 (8) a dietitian licensed pursuant to Sections 1721  
2 through 1739 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes  
3 and subsequent laws regulating the practice of  
4 dietitians, or

5 (9) an occupational therapist pursuant to Sections  
6 888.1 through 888.15 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
7 Statutes and any subsequent law regulating the  
8 practice of occupational therapy, or

9 b. any combination of the following professions:

10 (1) an architect pursuant to a license under Sections  
11 46.1 through 46.41 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
12 Statutes, and any subsequent laws regulating the  
13 practice of architecture,

14 (2) a professional engineer pursuant to a license  
15 under Sections 475.1 through 475.22a of Title 59  
16 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
17 relating to the practice of engineering, or

18 (3) a land surveyor pursuant to a license under  
19 Sections 475.1 through 475.22a of Title 59 of the  
20 Oklahoma Statutes, and any subsequent laws  
21 relating to the practice of land surveying;

22 8. "Regulating board" means the board which is charged with the  
23 licensing and regulation of the practice of the profession which the  
24 professional entity is organized to render;

1           9. "Individual", "incorporator" and "shareholder" each include  
2 the trustee of an express trust created by a person duly licensed or  
3 otherwise permitted to render a professional service who has the  
4 right to revoke the trust and who is serving as the trustee of the  
5 trust. Any certificate required by the Professional Entity Act to  
6 be issued to an individual incorporator or shareholder may be issued  
7 to the grantor on behalf of a trust. All references in the  
8 Professional Entity Act to death and incapacity of a shareholder  
9 shall include the death and incapacity of the grantor of a trust  
10 which own stock in a professional corporation;

11           10. "Incapacity" of a shareholder means a determination by a  
12 court of competent jurisdiction, or otherwise by two independent  
13 licensed physicians, that the shareholder is fully incapacitated or  
14 is partially incapacitated to the extent that the shareholder is not  
15 capable of rendering the professional service for which the  
16 professional corporation was organized; and

17           11. "Other personal representative" includes the successor  
18 trustee of an express trust owning stock in a professional  
19 corporation, which trust was created by a person duly licensed or  
20 otherwise permitted to render the professional service for which the  
21 professional corporation was organized who has the right to revoke  
22 the trust and who is the original trustee of the trust.

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B. The definitions of the applicable associated act shall apply to the Professional Entity Act, unless the context clearly indicates that a different meaning is intended.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
