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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:								
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L.								
18	2024 (74 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 325.20), is amended to read as								
19	follows:								
20	Section 325.20. A. In lieu of an automatic fire extinguishing								
21	system, portable fire extinguishers shall be installed in mobile								
22	food establishments that produce 1. All mobile food preparation								
23	vehicles operating within the State of Oklahoma prior to July 1,								
24	2024, that are capable of producing smoke or grease-laden vapors								

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1 shall be in compliance with the most current adopted code. With the 2 exception of an automatic fire extinguishing system, this shall include, but not be limited to, those utilizing electric, liquified 3 4 petroleum (LP) gas, compressed natural gas (CNG), or combination 5 thereof for cooking, provided that portable fire extinguishers are 6 installed and maintained in accordance with the most current version 7 of NFPA 10 (Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers). All fire extinguishers shall be inspected annually by a licensed contractor. 8 9 A six-liter Class K-rated, portable fire extinguisher is required 10 for all cooking equipment involving solid fuels or vegetable or 11 animal oils and fats or combination thereof. All portable fire 12 extinguishers shall be in clear view and immediately available for 13 use. 14 B. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force 15 and effect of law on November 1, 2025 2. All mobile food 16 preparation vehicles utilizing, handling, or transporting liquified 17 petroleum gas or any liquified petroleum gas system, equipment, 18 container, apparatus, or appliance shall receive and maintain a 19 permit from, and be inspected annually by, the Oklahoma Liquified 20 Petroleum Gas Board, prior to the State Fire Marshal issuing an 21 annual operational permit decal to the mobile food preparation 22 vehicle. This requirement is in addition to the State Fire 23 Marshal's inspections.

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3. The provisions in paragraph 1 of this subsection will expire on July 1, 2026, in which all mobile food preparation vehicles shall comply with the most current adopted codes set forth by the State of Oklahoma.

Mobile food preparation vehicles shall be under the sole jurisdiction of the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal and be inspected annually by the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal to ensure compliance with the latest version of the state adopted minimum codes for fire and life safety as adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission.
 - a. upon approval by the State Fire Marshal, the State

 Fire Marshal shall issue an operational permit decal

 indicating that the vehicle meets the minimum code

 requirements as currently adopted at the time of

 inspection, and
 - b. nothing in this act shall prevent the State Fire
 Marshal from enforcing the minimum code requirements
 as allowed by law and revoking the operations of a
 mobile food preparation vehicle upon cause that is
 determined to be inherently dangerous to the health,
 safety, or welfare of persons within the State of
 Oklahoma.
- 5. Nothing in this act shall prevent a political subdivision from enforcing the political subdivision's event permits,

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operational fees, land use regulations, zoning, and other ordinances
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    in relation to the operation of a mobile food preparation vehicle
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    within the boundaries of said political subdivision.
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        6. The rules promulgated pursuant to this section shall have
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    uniform force and effect throughout the state and no city, town,
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    county, political subdivision, or other agency shall enact or
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    enforce any fire or life safety code related ordinances, rules, or
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    other requirements for mobile food preparation vehicles.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
