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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1873, as
15	amended by Section 1, Chapter 88, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024,
16	Section 1873), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 1873. A. There is hereby re-created, to continue until
18	July 1, 2025 July 1, 2028, in accordance with the provisions of the
19	Oklahoma Sunset Law, the Oklahoma Board of Licensed Alcohol and Drug
20	Counselors, consisting of seven (7) members, to be appointed by the
21	Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, as follows:
22	1. a. Six members who shall be alcohol and drug counselors
23	certified by an entity recognized to do professional
24	alcohol and drug counseling certification in this

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1 state; provided, however, five of such members shall subsequently secure licensure and one such member 2 shall subsequently secure certification, pursuant to 3 the provisions of the Licensed Alcohol and Drug 4 5 Counselors Act, no later than January 1, 2005. Thereafter, five members shall be licensed alcohol and 6 b. drug counselors at the time of appointment, and one 7 member shall be certified as an alcohol and drug 8 9 counselor at the time of appointment. Pursuant to the provisions of this paragraph, the с. 10 Governor shall appoint: 11 12 (1)four members from a list of names submitted by the Oklahoma Drug and Alcohol Professional 13 Counselors Counselor Association, 14 (2)one member from a list of names submitted by the 15 Oklahoma Substance Abuse Services Alliance, and 16 (3) one member from a list of names submitted by the 17 Oklahoma Citizen Advocates for Recovery and 18 Treatment Transformation Association. 19 d. One member shall be appointed from and shall represent 20 the general public. Such member shall be a resident 21 of this state who has attained the age of majority and 22 shall not be, nor shall ever have been, a licensed or 23 certified alcohol and drug counselor, or the spouse of 24

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1a licensed or certified alcohol and drug counselor, or2a person who has ever had any material financial3interest in the provision of alcohol and drug4counseling services or has engaged in any activity5directly related to the practice of alcohol and drug6counseling.

7 2. The composition of the Board shall include five members who
8 hold a master's or higher degree and one member whose highest degree
9 held is a bachelor's degree.

The Governor shall appoint the members to the Board no later
 than July 1, 2004.

B. Each member of the Board appointed as a licensed alcohol and drug counselor shall:

Be certified or licensed to engage in the practice of
 alcohol and drug counseling in this state and shall be in good
 standing; and

17 2. Have at least three (3) years of experience in the practice18 of alcohol and drug counseling in this state.

C. Two of the members initially appointed shall serve threeyear terms; two shall serve four-year terms; and three shall serve five-year terms, as designated by the Governor. Thereafter, the terms of all members shall be five (5) years.

D. A vacancy on the Board shall be filled in the same manner asthe original appointment for the balance of the unexpired term.

Members may succeed themselves but shall serve no more than two
 consecutive terms. Each member shall serve until a successor is
 appointed and qualified.

4 E. Members of the Board may be removed from office for one or5 more of the following reasons:

The refusal or inability for any reason to perform the
 duties of a Board member in an efficient, responsible and
 professional manner;

9 2. The misuse of office for pecuniary or material gain or for10 personal advantage for self or another;

A violation of the laws or rules governing the practice of
 alcohol and drug counseling; or

4. Conviction of a felony as verified by a certified copy ofthe record of the court of conviction.

F. Members of the Board shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel expenses as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
