8	POLICY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION
9	An Act relating to crimes and punishments; defining
10	terms; making certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; providing for codification; and providing
11	an effective date.

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 540D of Title 21, unless there
16	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	A. As used in this section:
18	1. "First responder" shall include a peace officer as defined
19	in Section 99 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, a correctional
20	or probation and parole officer, and an emergency medical technician
21	or emergency medical care provider; and
22	2. "Harass" means to willfully engage in a course of conduct
23	directed at a first responder which intentionally distracts the
24	

- first responder from performing his or her official duties and serves no legitimate purpose.
- B. It shall be unlawful for a person, after receiving a verbal warning not to approach from a person he or she knows or reasonably should know is a first responder, who is engaged in the lawful performance of a legal duty, to knowingly and willfully violate such warning and approach or remain within twenty-five (25) feet of the first responder with the intent to:
- 1. Impede or interfere with the ability of the first responder to perform such duty;
 - 2. Threaten the first responder with physical harm; or
 - 3. Harass the first responder.
- C. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for a term not to exceed one (1) year, or by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
