8	An Act relating to the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma; amending 62 O.S. 2021, Section 3103, as
9	last amended by Section 127, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (62 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 3103), which relates to
10	the Oklahoma Pension Actuarial Analysis Act; modifying definitions; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section
11	17-116.10, as amended by Section 9, Chapter 300, 0.S.L. 2024 (70 0.S. Supp. 2024, Section 17-116.10),
12	which relates to postretirement employment; modifying provisions related to earning limitations; providing
13	that a retired member may receive earnings without a reduction in retirement benefits; providing effective
14	dates; providing for contingent effective dates based on outcome of approval of the emergency clause; and
15	declaring an emergency.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 3103, as
20	last amended by Section 127, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (62 O.S. Supp.
21	2024, Section 3103), is amended to read as follows:
22	Section 3103. As used in the Oklahoma Pension Legislation
23	Actuarial Analysis Act:
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1. "Amendment" means any amendment including a substitute bill,
 2 made to a retirement bill by any committee of the House or Senate,
 3 any conference committee of the House or Senate or by the House or
 4 Senate;

2. "RB number" means that number preceded by the letters "RB"
assigned to a retirement bill by the respective staffs of the
Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives when
the respective staff office prepares a retirement bill for a member
of the Legislature;

3. "Legislative Actuary" means the firm or entity that enters
 into a contract with the Legislative Service Bureau pursuant to
 Section 452.15 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to provide the
 actuarial services and other duties provided for in the Oklahoma
 Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act;

4. "Nonfiscal amendment" means an amendment to a retirement bill having a fiscal impact, which amendment does not change any factor of an actuarial investigation specified in subsection A of Section 3109 of this title;

19 5. "Nonfiscal retirement bill" means a retirement bill:

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- a. which does not affect the cost or funding factors of a retirement system,
- b. which affects such factors only in a manner which doesnot:
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- grant a benefit increase under the retirement system affected by the bill,
 - (2) create an actuarial accrued liability for or increase the actuarial accrued liability of the retirement system affected by the bill, or
 - (3) increase the normal cost of the retirement system affected by the bill,
- which authorizes the purchase by an active member of 8 с. 9 the retirement system, at the actuarial cost for the 10 purchase as computed pursuant to the statute in effect 11 on the effective date of the measure allowing such 12 purchase, of years of service for purposes of reaching 13 a normal retirement date in the applicable retirement 14 system, but which cannot be used in order to compute 15 the number of years of service for purposes of 16 computing the retirement benefit for the member, 17 d. which provides for the computation of a service-18 connected disability retirement benefit for members of 19 the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System 20 pursuant to Section 2-305 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma 21 Statutes if the members were unable to complete twenty 22 (20) years of service as a result of the disability, 23 which requires membership in the defined benefit plan e. 24 authorized by Section 901 et seq. of Title 74 of the

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- 1 Oklahoma Statutes for persons whose first elected or appointed service occurs on or after November 1, 2018, if such persons had any prior service in the Oklahoma 3 Public Employees Retirement System prior to November 1, 2015,
- f. which provides for a one-time increase in retirement benefits if the increase in retirement benefits is not a permanent increase in the gross annual retirement benefit payable to a member or beneficiary, occurs 10 only once pursuant to a single statutory authorization 11 and does not exceed:
- 12 (1) the lesser of two percent (2%) of the gross 13 annual retirement benefit of the member or One 14 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and requires that 15 the benefit may only be provided if the funded 16 ratio of the affected retirement system would not 17 be less than sixty percent (60%) but not greater 18 than eighty percent (80%) after the benefit 19 increase is paid,
- 20 (2) the lesser of two percent (2%) of the gross 21 annual retirement benefit of the member or One 22 Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) and 23 requires that the benefit may only be provided if 24 the funded ratio of the affected retirement

2		but not greater than one hundred percent (100%)
3		after the benefit increase is paid,
4	(3)	the lesser of two percent (2%) of the gross
5		annual retirement benefit of the member or One
6		Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$1,400.00) and
7		requires that the benefit may only be provided if
8		the funded ratio of the affected retirement
9		system would be greater than one hundred percent
10		(100%) after the benefit increase is paid, or
11	(4)	the greater of two percent (2%) of the gross
12		annual retirement benefit of the volunteer
13		firefighter or One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for
14		persons who retired from the Oklahoma
15		Firefighters Pension and Retirement System as
16		volunteer firefighters and who did not retire
17		from the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and
18		Retirement System as a paid firefighter.

19	i.	which provides for the reinstatement of retirement
20		benefits for members of the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
21		Retirement System pursuant to Section 2-305 of Title
22		47 of the Oklahoma Statutes for those who were hired
23		on or after November 1, 2012, or May 24, 2013,
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- j. which authorizes the purchase of military service credit as provided in Section 50-128 of Title 11, Section 1102.2 of Title 20, Section 2-307.4 of Title 4 47, and Section 913.8 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- k. which restores benefits pursuant to Sections 49-100.1,
 49-101, 49-101.2, 49-106.1, 49-108, 49-117.1, and 49135 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- 9 1. which modifies the computation of the line-of-duty
 10 disability benefit pursuant to the provisions of this
 11 act Sections 50-101 and 50-115 of Title 11 of the
 12 Oklahoma Statutes; and
- 13 <u>m.</u> which modifies postretirement earning limitations
 14 pursuant to the provisions of this act.

A nonfiscal retirement bill shall include any retirement bill that has as its sole purpose the appropriation or distribution or redistribution of monies in some manner to a retirement system for purposes of reducing the unfunded liability of such system or the earmarking of a portion of the revenue from a tax to a retirement system or increasing the percentage of the revenue earmarked from a tax to a retirement system;

6. "Reduction-in-cost amendment" means an amendment to a retirement bill having a fiscal impact which reduces the cost of the

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1 bill as such cost is determined by the actuarial investigation for 2 the bill prepared pursuant to Section 3109 of this title;

7. "Retirement bill" means any bill or joint resolution introduced or any bill or joint resolution amended by a member of the Oklahoma Legislature which creates or amends any law directly affecting a retirement system. A retirement bill shall not mean a bill or resolution that impacts the revenue of any state tax in which a portion of the revenue generated from such tax is earmarked for the benefit of a retirement system;

10 8. "Retirement bill having a fiscal impact" means any 11 retirement bill creating or establishing a retirement system and any 12 other retirement bill other than a nonfiscal retirement bill; and

9. "Retirement system" means the Teachers' Retirement System of
Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System, the
Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges, the Oklahoma
Firefighters Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Police
Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
Retirement System, or a retirement system established after January
1, 2006.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 17-116.10,
as amended by Section 9, Chapter 300, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp.
2024, Section 17-116.10), is amended to read as follows:
Section 17-116.10. A. Subject to the requirements of Section
6-101.2 of this title and any other applicable requirements of law,

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1 a member may enter into postretirement employment with a public 2 school of Oklahoma and still receive monthly retirement benefits 3 subject to the following limitations:

1. A retired member is not eligible to be employed by the 4 5 public schools of Oklahoma, in any capacity, for sixty (60) calendar days between the retiree's last day of preretirement public 6 7 education employment and any postretirement public education employment. For purposes of this section, the term "last day of 8 preretirement employment" shall mean the last day the employee is 9 required to be physically present on the job to complete the terms 10 11 of the employment contract or agreement or the member's effective 12 retirement date, whichever is later. An employee on paid leave is 13 still considered to be employed for purposes of this section. 14 Employment under any conditions during this time, volunteer services 15 for the purpose of obtaining a paid position at a later date, or 16 payment at a later time for services performed during this time 17 period shall cause the forfeiture of all retirement benefits 18 received during the period;

For thirty-six (36) months following a member's effective
 retirement date, the retired member shall be subject to earnings
 limitations on allowable earnings. Earnings limits are determined
 annually based on a calendar year. For retired members under the
 age of sixty-two (62) years, allowed earnings from the public
 schools of Oklahoma for employment for the performance of duties

1	ordinarily performed by classified or nonclassified optional
2	personnel shall be limited to one-half (1/2) of the member's final
3	average salary used in computing retirement benefits or the earnings
4	limit allowed by the Social Security Administration for those under
5	Social Security's normal retirement age, whichever is less. For
6	retired members sixty-two (62) years of age or older, allowed
7	earnings from the public schools of Oklahoma for the performance of
8	duties ordinarily performed by classified or nonclassified personnel
9	shall be limited to Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) or one-half
10	(1/2) of the member's final average salary used in computing
11	retirement benefits, whichever is less. For purposes of this
12	paragraph, the following shall apply:
13	a. carnings shall mean regular annual compensation as
14	defined in paragraph 23 of Section 17-101 of this
15	title, and shall include any payment by a public
16	school for services rendered by a retired member who
17	is employed for any purpose whatsoever. Supplemental
18	retirement payments paid by a former public school
19	employer pursuant to subsection N of Section 17-105 of
20	this title or other state law shall not be considered
21	as carnings,
22	b. the earnings limit for the calendar year in which a
23	member retires shall be one-twelfth (1/12) of the
24	annual limit multiplied by the number of months the

 the public schools of Oklahoma, and c. carnings in excess of the maximum limit on allowed carnings from public schools of Oklahoma shall result in a loss of retirement benefits of One Dollar (\$1.4 for each One Dollar (\$1.00) carned over the maximum allowed carnings amount; 3. Notwithstanding paragraph 2 of this subsection, for a period of three (3) years beginning July 1, 2017, members who have retire as of July 1, 2017, as active classroom teachers, who have been retired and receiving a benefit for at least one (1) year, and who have not been employed by any public school during that one-year period, shall be eligible to be reemployed as an active classroom 	f

5	nonclassified personnel shall be able to receive annualized earnings
6	from the public school with no reduction in retirement benefits
7	regardless of the amount of annualized earnings; and

A member shall be considered to be employed by a school 9 district to perform the duties ordinarily performed by classified or 10 nonclassified optional personnel if the member is hired by the 11 school district in the member's individual capacity to perform the duties or if the member performs the duties through employment with 12 13 a proprietorship, partnership, corporation, limited liability 14 company or partnership, or any other business structure that has 15 agreed or contracted to provide the services to the school district. 16 A public school district that employs a retired member shall в. 17 be required to make contributions to the System for the retired 18 member in an amount as required in Section 17-108.1 and in paragraph

19 3 of subsection B of Section 17-116.2 of this title.

20 C. For purposes of this section, postretirement employment of 21 less than one thousand (1,000) hours per year with the Governor, the 22 Oklahoma State Senate, the Oklahoma House of Representatives or the 23 Legislative Service Bureau shall not be considered as postretirement 24 employment with a public school of Oklahoma.

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D. The Board of Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma shall promulgate such rules as are necessary to implement the provisions of this section.

E. A member who has entered into postretirement employment with
a participating employer of the Teachers' Retirement System of
Oklahoma must fully comply with all the provisions of the rules
promulgated by the Board of Trustees pursuant to this section in
order to continue receiving the member's monthly retirement benefit.

9 SECTION 3. If the emergency clause is not approved pursuant to
10 the requirements of the Oklahoma Constitution as part of this
11 measure, the effective date of Section 1 of this act shall be
12 October 1, 2025.

SECTION 4. If the emergency clause is not approved pursuant to the requirements of the Oklahoma Constitution as part of this measure, the effective date of Section 2 of this act shall be November 1, 2025.

SECTION 5. Except as otherwise provided by Section 3 of this act, Section 1 of this act shall become effective immediately upon signature by the Governor or as otherwise provided by Section 58 of Article V of the Oklahoma Constitution.

SECTION 6. Except as otherwise provided by Section 4 of this act, Section 2 of this act shall become effective July 1, 2025. SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
