2	petroleum (LP) gas, compressed natural gas (CNG), or combination						
3	thereof for cooking, provided that portable fire extinguishers are						
4	installed and maintained in accordance with the most current version						
5	of NFPA 10 (Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers). All fire						
6	extinguishers shall be inspected annually by a licensed contractor.						
7	A <u>six-liter</u> Class K-rated, portable fire extinguisher is required						
8	for all cooking equipment involving solid fuels or vegetable or						
9	animal oils and fats or combination thereof. All portable fire						
10	extinguishers shall be in clear view and immediately available for						
11	use.						
12	B. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force						
13	and effect of law on November 1, 2025 2. All liquified petroleum						
14	gas shall be inspected by the Oklahoma Liquified Petroleum Gas Board						
15	or a certified contractor.						
16	3. The provisions in paragraph 1 of this subsection will expire						
17	on July 1, 2026, in which all mobile food preparation vehicles shall						
18	comply with the most current adopted codes set forth by the State of						
19	Oklahoma.						
20	4. Mobile food preparation vehicles shall be under the sole						
21	jurisdiction of the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal and be inspected						
22	annually by the Oklahoma State Fire Marshal to ensure compliance						
23	with the latest version of the state adopted minimum codes for fire

3	<u>a.</u>	upon approval by the State Fire Marshal, the State						
4		Fire Marshal shall issue an operational permit decal						
5		indicating that the vehicle meets the minimum code

7		inspection, and						
8	<u>b.</u>	nothing in this act shall prevent the State Fire						
9		Marshal from enforcing the minimum code requirements						
10		as allowed by law and revoking the operations of a						
11		mobile food preparation vehicle upon cause that is						
12		determined to be inherently dangerous to the health,						
13		safety, or welfare of persons within the State of						
14	Oklahoma.							
15	5. Nothing in this act shall prevent a political subdivision							
16	from enforcing the political subdivision's event permits,							
17	operational fees, land use regulations, zoning, and other ordinances							
18	in relation to the operation of a mobile food preparation vehicle							
19	within the boundaries of said political subdivision.							
20	6. The rules promulgated pursuant to this section shall have							
21	uniform force and effect throughout the state and no city, town,							
22	county, political subdivision, or other agency shall enact or							
23	enforce any fire or life safety code related ordinances, rules, or							
24	other requirements for mobile food preparation vehicles.
