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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 341, O.S.L.
15	2022 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2357.601), is amended to read as
16	follows:
17	Section 2357.601. A. As used in this section, "nonrecurring
18	adoption expenses" means adoption fees, court costs, medical
19	expenses, attorney fees, and expenses which are directly related to
20	the legal process of adoption of a child including, but not limited
21	to, costs relating to the adoption study, health and psychological
22	examinations, transportation, and reasonable costs of lodging and
23	food for the child or adoptive parents which are incurred to
24	complete the adoption process and are not reimbursed by other

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1 sources. The term nonrecurring adoption expenses shall not include 2 attorney fees incurred for the purpose of litigating a contested 3 adoption, from and after the point of the initiation of the contest, 4 costs associated with physical remodeling, renovation, and 5 alteration of the adoptive parents' home or property, except for a 6 special needs child as authorized by the court.

B. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2023
<u>2026</u>, there shall be allowed a credit against the tax imposed
pursuant to Section 2355 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes for
nonrecurring adoption expenses paid by a resident individual
taxpayer in connection with:

12 1. The adoption of a minor; or

13 2. A proposed adoption of a minor which did not result in a14 decreed adoption.

15 С. The amount of the tax credit authorized by this section 16 shall be equal to ten percent (10%) fifteen percent (15%) of the 17 qualified expenses but the credit amount shall not exceed Two 18 Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) per 19 calendar year with respect to single filing status or married filing 20 separate income tax returns and shall not exceed Four Thousand 21 Dollars (\$4,000.00) Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) per calendar 22 year with respect to married filing joint return filing status. 23 The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall promulgate rules to D. 24 implement the provisions of this section which shall contain a

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1	specific list of nonrecurring adoption expenses which may be
2	presumed to qualify for the tax credit. The Tax Commission shall
3	prescribe necessary requirements for verification.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 2026.
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
