8	An Act relating to plumbing licenses; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Sections 1003, 1005, and 1009, which
9	relate to definitions, examinations, and duration of licenses; modifying definitions; establishing
10	requirements for certain examination applicants; authorizing promulgation of rules by Construction
11	Industries Board; extending duration of certain license renewal; updating statutory language;
12	updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1003, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	As used in The Plumbing License Law of 1955:
19	1. "Board" means the Construction Industries Board;
20	2. "Committee" means the <u>Oklahoma</u> State Committee of Plumbing
21	Examiners appointed by the Construction Industries Board;
22	3. "Plumbing Hearing Board" means the State Plumbing Hearing
23	Board which shall consist of a designee of the Construction
24	

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Industries Board, as chair, and the members of the <u>Oklahoma</u> State
 Committee of Plumbing Examiners;

4. "Apprentice" or "plumber's apprentice" means any person
sixteen (16) years of age or older who, as the principal occupation
of the person, is engaged in learning and assisting in the
installation of plumbing under the direct supervision of a licensed
journeyman plumber or plumbing contractor;

5. "Journeyman plumber" means any person other than a master
plumber or plumbing contractor who engages in or works at the actual
installation, alteration, repair and/or renovation of plumbing
licensed as a temporary, residential, or unlimited journeyman
plumber;

6. "Temporary journeyman plumber" means any person other than a
person permanently licensed as a journeyman plumber, master plumber,
or plumbing contractor in this state who meets the temporary
licensure requirements of Section 1006.1 of this title;

17 7. "Master plumber" is a term used and defined under laws which 18 have been repealed. A person formerly known as a master plumber is 19 henceforth to be known as a "plumbing contractor" as defined in this 20 section;

8. "Plumbing contractor" means any person who is skilled in the planning, superintending, and practical installation of plumbing and who is familiar with the laws and rules governing the same <u>or</u> formerly known as a master plumber. This definition may be

<u>supervising and performing plumbing work for detached one- or two-</u>
<u>family dwellings;</u>

23 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1005, is 24 amended to read as follows:

Plumbing Installation Code Variance and Appeals Board.

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Section 1005. (a) <u>A.</u> Examinations shall be uniform and shall
 be practical in nature but sufficiently strict to test the
 qualification and fitness of the applicant as a journeyman plumber
 or as a plumbing contractor, as the case may be. It <u>An examination</u>
 shall be in whole or in part in writing.

(b) B. Regular examinations shall be held at least twice each 6 year and special examinations may be fixed by the Oklahoma State 7 Committee of Plumbing Examiners. Any applicant initially failing to 8 9 pass the examination shall not be permitted to take another examination for a period of thirty (30) days, and thereafter any 10 such applicant subsequently failing to pass the examination shall 11 12 not be permitted to take a subsequent examination for a period of ninety (90) days. An examinee shall earn a seventy percent (70%) 13 score or more on each part to pass the examination. 14

<u>C. An applicant for a residential journeyman plumber</u>
<u>examination shall be eighteen (18) years of age or older and have:</u>
<u>Two (2) years of experience in the plumbing trade, and four</u>
<u>(4) hours of continuing education that covers codes and revisions as</u>
<u>established by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission (OUBCC)</u>
<u>while employed by a licensed plumbing contractor;</u>

17	hours from an educational institution approved by the Oklahoma State
18	Committee of Plumbing Examiners;
19	3. Three (3) years of experience in the plumbing trade while
20	serving in the United States Armed Forces; or
21	4. A current, valid out-of-state plumbing license.
22	E. An applicant for a plumbing contractor examination shall be
23	eighteen (18) years of age or older and have:
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1	1. Two (2) years of experience in the plumbing trade, four (4)
2	hours of continuing education that covers codes and revisions as
3	established by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission, and
4	one (1) year of experience as a licensed residential or unlimited
5	journeyman while employed by a licensed plumbing contractor;
6	2. An associate's degree or vocational diploma certifying
7	completion of a formal plumbing educational program approved by the
8	Committee consisting of a minimum of one thousand (1,000) classroom
9	hours from an educational institution approved by the Oklahoma State
10	Committee of Plumbing Examiners;
11	3. Two (2) years of experience in the plumbing trade while
12	serving in the United States Armed Forces and six (6) hours of
13	continuing education that covers codes and revisions as established
14	by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission; or
15	4. A current, valid out-of-state plumbing license.
16	F. The Construction Industries Board may promulgate rules as
17	necessary to effectuate the provisions of this section.
18	SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1009, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Section 1009. No A. Except for unlimited journeyman plumber or
21	residential journeyman plumber licenses which shall be issued for
22	two (2) years, no license shall be issued for longer than one (1)
23	year and all licenses shall expire on the last day in the birth
24	month of the licensee. Such licenses may be renewed upon

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application and payment of fees within thirty (30) days preceding or
following the date the license renewal is due. No journeyman or
contractor license shall be renewed unless the licensee has
completed the required hours of continuing education as determined
and approved by the <u>Oklahoma State</u> Committee <u>of Plumbing Examiners</u>.

The Committee may renew licenses upon application made more 6 в. than thirty (30) days following the date of expiration only upon 7 payment of the renewal and additional fee prescribed and upon 8 9 compliance with any applicable continuing education requirements as established by the Construction Industries Board and this act The 10 Plumbing License Law of 1955. Provided, that no penalty for renewal 11 shall be charged to any holder of a license which expires while such 12 13 holder is in military service if application is made within one (1) year following discharge from the military service. 14

15 <u>C.</u> Apprentice registration certificates expire one (1) year 16 after date of registration, at which time the apprentice may 17 reregister.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
