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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-126 of Title 70, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. As used in this section:
22	1. "Bell to bell" means the time between the first bell ringing
23	at the start of the school day to begin instructional time until the
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- 1 dismissal bell at the end of the school day to end instructional 2 time; and
- 2. "Personal electronic device" means a personal device capable 3 of connecting to a smart phone, the Internet, or a cellular or Wi-Fi 4 5 network, or directly connecting to another similar device. Personal electronic devices include, but are not limited to, smart watches, 6 smart headphones, laptops, tablets, and smart glasses. Personal 7 electronic devices shall not include school-issued or school-8 9 approved devices that are specifically limited for use in classroom instruction. 10
- B. Each school district board of education shall adopt a policy prohibiting students from using cell phones and personal electronic devices while on the campus of a public school district from bell to bell. The policy shall include disciplinary procedures for violations.
 - C. The policy adopted pursuant to subsection B of this section may provide for exceptions including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Emergency use of cell phones or personal electronic devices by students during the school day; and
- 2. Use of cell phones or personal electronic devices by students who use them to monitor health issues.

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- 22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
- 23 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 24 of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby

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declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
