8	An Act relating to teacher preparation; directing the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability
9	to establish and maintain TeachForwardOK for certain time period; providing purpose; directing the
10	Commission to issue certain request for proposals within certain time period; providing process for
11	program application; directing the Commission to prescribe application form; directing the Commission
12	to establish criteria for applicant approval; directing the Commission to award grants to approved
13	applicants, subject to availability of funding; allowing the Commission to use certain funds for
14	<pre>implementation; providing for use of grants; directing certain provider to evaluate certain</pre>
15	minimum factors; requiring evaluation reports to be electronically submitted to approved applicants and
16	the Commission; directing teacher education program to electronically submit a report response to the
17	Commission within certain time period; directing report responses to prioritize certain approaches;
18	directing the Commission to review report responses and select certain program to receive certain funding
19	for certain purpose, subject to availability of funding; directing the Commission to electronically
20	submit certain report by certain date; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for codification;
21	providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-186.1 of Title 70, unless 3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 4 5 Α. The Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability shall establish and maintain a two-year pilot program to be known as 6 TeachForwardOK to provide new, high-quality pathways to enter the 7 teaching profession and increase the number of teachers in this 8 9 state's workforce.

B. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this act,
the Commission shall issue a request for proposals to select
technical assistance providers to evaluate teacher education
programs in institutions of higher education within The Oklahoma
State System of Higher Education that are accredited by the
Commission pursuant to Section 6-186 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
Statutes.

С. To participate in TeachForwardOK, a teacher education 17 program shall submit an application to the Commission in the manner 18 and on a form prescribed by the Commission. The Commission shall 19 establish criteria to approve applicants. Subject to the 20 availability of funds, the Commission shall award grants to approved 21 applicant teacher education programs. The Commission may use any 22 gifts, grants, devises, and donations from any public or private 23 source and monies appropriated by the Legislature for the purpose of 24

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1 implementing the provisions of this section. Grants shall be used 2 as incentives to participate and to contract with a technical assistance provider selected by the Commission pursuant to 3 subsection B of this section. The provider shall evaluate, at a 4 5 minimum, the following:

Teacher candidate recruitment and completion; 1.

2. Whether the teacher education program prepares teacher 7 candidates effectively; 8

9 3. Whether the teacher education program meets workforce needs in this state; and 10

Innovative ways to recruit nontraditional teacher candidates 11 4. 12 unique to the teacher education program.

1. Evaluation reports prepared by a technical assistance 13 D. provider shall be electronically submitted to the approved applicant 14 teacher education program and the Commission. 15

2. Within ninety (90) days of receiving the report, the teacher 16 education program shall electronically submit a report response to 17 the Commission detailing how the teacher education program plans to 18 address the evaluation report's findings. The report response shall 19 prioritize innovative approaches to provide new, high-quality 20 pathways to enter the teaching profession and increase the number of 21 teachers in this state's workforce including, but not limited to: 22 developing a system for recruiting eligible teacher 23 a. candidates, such as:

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- (1) a pathway for high school students to become paraprofessionals,
  - (2) a pathway for paraprofessionals to become teachers, and
  - (3) a pathway for individuals with bachelor's degrees to become teachers,
- b. developing a curriculum that includes intensive onthe-job training for teacher candidates,
- 9 c. identifying a mastery-based evaluation system to 10 determine when eligible teacher candidates have 11 mastered the skills and competencies necessary for 12 graduation from an apprenticeship program and 13 outlining benchmarks that teacher candidates must meet 14 as they progress through on-the-job training,
- d. offering a schedule that enables teacher candidates to
  work full time in a public school district while
  participating in an apprenticeship program and
  allowing paraprofessionals to continue in their
  positions, or
- e. providing a flexible schedule for paraprofessionals
  participating in an apprenticeship program to support
  their success in the program that will facilitate
  course completion and on-the-job training.
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1 Ε. Subject to the availability of funding, the Commission shall 2 review the report responses submitted pursuant to subsection D of this section and select one approved applicant teacher education 3 program to receive Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) to 4 5 enact the initiatives outlined in the program's report response. F. By December 31, 2027, the Commission shall electronically 6 submit a report of TeachForwardOK's findings and recommendations to 7 the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the 8 9 Speaker of the House of Representatives. The Commission shall promulgate rules to implement the 10 G. provisions of this section. 11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025. 12 13 SECTION 3.
