worker to whom the State Department of Health has issued a
certificate to practice as a certified community health worker in
this state;

5 2. "Community health worker" means a frontline health worker 6 who has a shared understanding of and is a trusted member of the 7 community being served; and

3. "Department" means the State Department of Health.

A. The State Department of Health shall establish a certificate for community health workers. This certification shall be voluntary.
