L 4	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 265, O.S.L.								
L5	2024 (47 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 6-212.7), is amended to read as								
16	follows:								
L7	Section 6-212.7. A. There is hereby created the Impaired								
L8	Driving Prevention Advisory Committee. The Committee shall be								
L 9	comprised of:								
20	1. The Commissioner of Public Safety, or a designee, who shall								
21	act as the Chair <u>chair</u> ;								
22	2. The Chief of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, or a designee;								
23	3. A member appointed by the District Attorneys Council;

- 5. The Director of the Department Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, or a designee;
- 5 6. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, 6 or a designee;
- 7. The <u>State</u> Director of the Board of Tests for Alcohol and 8 Drug Influence, or a designee;
- 9 8. The Director of the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office, or a designee;
- 9. The President of the Oklahoma Association of Chiefs of Police, or a designee;
- 13 10. The President of the Oklahoma Sheriff's Association, or a designee;
- 15 11. The Chief Executive Officer Director of Service Oklahoma,

 16 or a designee;
- 13. A representative designated by a victim advocacy group to 20 be selected by the Commissioner of Public Safety;
- 21 14. A member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives appointed 22 by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives; and
- 23 15. A member of the Oklahoma State Senate appointed by the 24 President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;

- B. The Department of Public Safety shall provide administrative
- 15 support necessary for the Committee to accomplish the goals and
- 16 objectives assigned by this section.
- 17 C. The Committee shall meet at the direction of the chair, and
- 18 | shall meet not less than once a year, but not more than four times a
- 19 year. A vice chair shall be elected by the Committee from among its
- 20 members. The vice chair shall act as chair of the Committee in the
- 21 absence of the chair.
- 22 D. The Committee is authorized to collect, analyze, and
- 23 | interpret relevant crash data on impaired driving and associated
- 24 traffic crashes. In addition, the Committee is authorized to

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- review, evaluate, and monitor the impaired driving system of this
 state and provide a network of communication and cooperation among
 the various stakeholders to coordinate and integrate efforts and
 resources to reduce the incidence and severity of impaired driving
 crashes.
 - E. The Committee shall annually complete a statewide strategic plan to reduce the incidents of impaired driving and impaired driving crashes. The plan shall be submitted no later than December 31 of each year to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, and the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives.
 - F. Members of the Committee who are otherwise employed by a state agency or political subdivision shall serve without additional compensation. Members of the Committee who are otherwise employed by a state agency or political subdivision shall be entitled to reimbursement for any actual and necessary traveling expenses in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act from the employing agency.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.

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
