NEW LAW 12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 43-116 of Title 11, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 13 A municipality may enter into a real estate contract for the 14 sale, conveyance, or exchange of real property, option to purchase 15 real property, or a lease with an option to purchase real property 16 that includes a contingency, not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) 17 days, for the purposes of securing required permits, lot changes, 18 zoning changes, and any other land use approvals necessary to use 19 and operate the real property. 20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 865.70 of Title 19, unless there 22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23

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A county may enter into a real estate contract for the sale,

conveyance, or exchange of real property, option to purchase real

property, or a lease with an option to purchase real property that

includes a contingency, not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days,

for the purposes of securing required permits, lot changes, zoning

changes, and any other land use approvals necessary to use and

operate the real property.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 110.6 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The state may enter into a real estate contract for the sale, conveyance, or exchange of real property, option to purchase real property, or a lease with an option to purchase real property that includes a contingency, not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days, for the purposes of securing required permits, lot changes, zoning changes, and any other land use approvals necessary to use and operate the real property.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
