An Act relating to education; defining terms; 6 prohibiting discrimination on certain basis against 7 students or employees in an institution of higher education or public school; prohibiting persons from being excluded, denied benefits, or discriminated 8 against on certain basis; prohibiting criteria for admission to an institution of higher education 9 course or program from restricting access to certain persons; providing certain exceptions; directing 10 certain services to be available to all students; directing all education programs, activities, and 11 opportunities offered by institutions of higher education and public schools to be made available 12 without certain discrimination; providing certain construction; directing institutions of higher 13 education and public schools to integrate certain definition into certain codes of conduct; prohibiting 14 certain conduct; directing institutions of higher education and public schools to treat certain 15 harassment and discrimination in certain manner; encouraging institutions of higher education and 16 public schools to incorporate certain training and integrate certain curriculum; directing the State 17 Department of Education and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to designate certain 18 coordinator; prescribing duties of coordinator; providing for written notice to address certain 19 complaint within certain time period; providing for certain findings to be reported to certain 20 departments; directing submission of annual report; providing for contents of report; providing certain 21 construction; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency. 22

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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-162 of Title 70, unless there 4 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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A. As used in this section:

1. "Antisemitism" has the same meaning as provided for by the
International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance Working Definition of
Antisemitism, including its contemporary examples, as it was adopted
on May 26, 2016;

10 2. "Institution of higher education" means an institution of 11 higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher 12 Education; and

3. "Public school" shall have the same meaning as provided forin Section 1-106 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

Discrimination on the basis of race, ethnicity, national 15 Β. origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital status against a 16 student or an employee in an institution of higher education or a 17 public school in this state shall be prohibited. No person in this 18 state shall, on the basis of race, ethnicity, national origin, sex, 19 disability, religion, or marital status, be excluded from 20 participating in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to 21 discrimination under any institution of higher education or public 22 school program or activity or in any employment conditions or 23 practices conducted by an institution of higher education or a 24

public school that receives or benefits from federal or state financial assistance.

C. The criteria for admission to a program or course at an institution of higher education shall not have the effect of restricting access by persons of a particular race, ethnicity, national origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital status; provided, this shall not infringe upon the rights of student faithbased organizations and ethnic solidarity organizations to select leadership committed to their group's mission and principles.

All institution of higher education and public school 10 D. classes shall be available to all students without regard to race, 11 12 ethnicity, national origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital status. Provided, however, the provisions of this subsection shall 13 not prohibit the provision of programs designed to meet the needs of 14 students with limited proficiency in English, gifted students, or 15 students with disabilities or programs tailored to students with 16 specialized talents or skills. 17

E. Guidance, counseling, and financial assistance services in institutions of higher education and public schools shall be available to all students equally and provided in the same manner regardless of race, ethnicity, national origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital status.

F. All education programs, activities, and opportunitiesoffered by institutions of higher education and public schools shall

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be made available without discrimination on the basis of race,
 ethnicity, national origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital
 status.

G. Nothing in this act shall be construed to limit or restrict
the implementation, funding, or administration of any Indian
education programs or services established under federal or state
law.

8 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-163 of Title 70, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Institutions of higher education and public schools shall 11 Α. 12 integrate the definition of antisemitism provided for in Section 1 of this act into their student, faculty, and employee codes of 13 conduct. Prohibited conduct as it specifically relates to 14 antisemitism shall include harassment and discrimination against 15 Jews in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and 16 antidiscrimination regulations provided by the United States 17 Department of Education and the United States Department of Justice. 18

B. Institutions of higher education and public schools shall
treat harassment of or discrimination against students or employees
or resulting from institutional policies or programs on their
campuses motivated by or including antisemitic intent in an
identical manner to discrimination motivated by race.

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C. All institutions of higher education and public schools are
 encouraged to:

3 1. Incorporate antisemitism awareness training for all4 students, faculty, administrators, and campus police;

2. Integrate Jewish American heritage curriculum for students
that incorporates Jewish experiences in the United States of America
pre- and post-revolution, pre- and post-World War II and the
Holocaust, and in modern times; and

9 3. Place reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions on10 speech to ensure order and protect the rights of all students.

The State Department of Education shall designate a 11 D. 1. Title VI coordinator dedicated to monitoring antisemitic 12 discrimination and harassment in public schools in this state. All 13 public schools shall electronically report incidents and complaints 14 of antisemitic discrimination and harassment to the Title VI 15 coordinator. The Title VI Coordinator shall establish, maintain, 16 and publicize a formal reporting process whereby students, parents, 17 staff, and faculty can submit complaints of antisemitic 18 discrimination and harassment. 19

2. The Title VI coordinator designated pursuant to paragraph 1
 of this subsection shall thoroughly investigate all submitted
 complaints. If after a reasonable investigation a Title VI
 coordinator determines that a public school has engaged in, allowed,
 or not sufficiently prohibited antisemitic discrimination, the State

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Department of Education shall provide written notice to the public
 school to address the complaint within thirty (30) days of receiving
 the notice.

3. If the Title VI coordinator determines that the public
school has not taken the necessary actions to address the complaint
within thirty (30) days of receiving the notice, the Department
shall report its findings to the United States Department of
Education and the United States Department of Justice by making a
complaint under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

E. 1. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall designate a Title VI coordinator dedicated to monitoring antisemitic discrimination and harassment in institutions of higher education in this state. All institutions of higher education shall electronically report incidents and complaints of antisemitic discrimination and harassment to the Title VI coordinator.

2. The Title VI coordinator designated pursuant to paragraph 1 16 of this subsection shall thoroughly investigate all submitted 17 complaints. If after a reasonable investigation a Title VI 18 coordinator determines that an institution of higher education has 19 engaged in, allowed, or not sufficiently prohibited antisemitic 20 discrimination, the State Regents shall provide written notice to 21 the institution of higher education to address the complaint within 22 thirty (30) days of receiving the notice. 23

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3. If the Title VI coordinator determines that the institution
 of higher education has not taken the necessary actions to address
 the complaint within thirty (30) days of receiving the notice, the
 State Regents shall report their findings to the United States
 Department of Education and the United States Department of Justice
 by making a complaint under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of
 1964.

8 F. No later than June 30, 2026, and June 30 each subsequent 9 year, the Title VI coordinators designated pursuant to paragraph 1 10 of subsections D and E of this section shall electronically submit 11 to the Legislature a report on antisemitism in institutions of 12 higher education and public schools.

G. The Legislature is encouraged to conduct hearings and/or investigations to assess if institutions are adequately addressing antisemitic harassment and discrimination; if not, the Legislature should consider reducing or eliminating state funding to such institutions.

18 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-164 of Title 70, unless there 20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Nothing in this act shall be construed to diminish or
infringe upon any right protected under the First Amendment to the
United States Constitution or Section 22 of Article II of the
Oklahoma Constitution.

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1	B. Nothing in this act shall be construed to conflict with
2	federal or state discrimination laws.
3	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
4	SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
