9	Commission; creating the Spring Creek Watershed Study Act; establishing legislative intent; directing Conservation Commission to undertake certain water

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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-7-111 of Title 27A, unless
20	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Spring
22	Creek Watershed Study Act".
23	B. The Legislature finds that:
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1 1. Increasing pressure from agriculture and residential 2 development as well as stream bank erosion and other activities have led to declining water quality levels in the Northeast Oklahoma 3 4 watershed known as Spring Creek located in Cherokee, Delaware, and 5 Mayes counties near Kansas, Oklahoma, resulting in increased concern by the residents of the Spring Creek area and citizens of Oklahoma 6 7 as a whole as to the continued health of the watershed. The once pristine stream is a prime example of how many similar high quality 8 Ozark waterbodies that draw millions of visitors to the area each 9 year, support water supplies for growing urban centers in Oklahoma, 10 11 and provide habitat for important wildlife and fisheries resources 12 are threatened without cooperative, voluntary protective action by 13 local communities and other stakeholders;

14 2. Improved voluntary land management practices including soil 15 conservation practices, riparian restoration and protection, 16 reforestation, streambank livestock exclusion, and other methods of 17 stewardship have great potential to improve and protect the quality 18 of water in the Spring Creek watershed while improving the 19 ecological health of the area; and

3. It is in the interest of the citizens of this state as a whole and the residents of the Spring Creek watershed that the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, in partnership with other local, state, and federal agencies and nongovernmental organizations, undertake a comprehensive water quality study of Spring Creek to

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determine the best course of action to protect and improve the
 health of the aquatic habitat in the watershed.

C. It is the intent of the Legislature that the findings of this study will be used to direct implementation of voluntary, incentive-based conservation practices by the Commission in partnership with other local, state, and federal agencies and subject to availability of resources, in the Spring Creek watershed to protect and improve the aquatic habitat and water quality in the area.

10SECTION 2.NEW LAWA new section of law to be codified11in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-7-112 of Title 27A, unless12there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. 1. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission shall undertake a
comprehensive watershed-based water quality plan designed to improve
and protect the water quality and aquatic habitat in the Spring
Creek watershed through the utilization of voluntary, incentivebased programs.

2. On or before June 1, 2026, the Commission shall publish an
electronic report of the findings. The Commission may, from time to
time, update such findings as conditions change and pertinent
information becomes available.

B. The Commission may contract and cooperate with the Natural
 Resources Conservation Service of the United States Department of
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Agriculture and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to conduct
 activities provided for in this section.

C. The Commission may apply for and accept grants, gifts, or other sources of public and private funds to carry out the purposes of the Spring Creek Watershed Study Act.

6 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-7-113 of Title 27A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 8 9 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission to be designated the 10 11 "Spring Creek Watershed Study Cash Fund Revolving Fund". The fund 12 shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, 13 and shall consist of all monies received by the Commission from 14 appropriations by the Legislature to the fund, and any money 15 received as gifts, grants, or other contributions from public or 16 private sources provided for the purpose of implementing the Spring 17 Creek Watershed Study Act. All monies accruing to the credit of the 18 fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 19 Commission for the purpose provided for in this act. Expenditures 20 from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State 21 Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 22 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 23 approval and payment.

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SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
