8	amending Section 3, Chapter 291, O.S.L. 2024 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 538.3), which relates to laser hair removal practitioners; authorizing certain
9	professionals to perform laser hair removal; requiring oversight of laser hair removal facilities
10	by certain professionals; requiring the establishment of patient relationships; providing for the creation
11	of patient charts; deleting evaluation or referral
12	exception; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 291, O.S.L.
16	2024 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 538.3), is amended to read as
17	follows:
18	Section 538.3. A. A laser practitioner shall only perform
19	laser hair removal using lasers or pulsed light devices approved by
20	the United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for noninvasive
21	procedures.
22	B. A person shall not perform or attempt to perform laser hair
23	removal unless the person holds the appropriate health professional
24	license or certificate as defined in Section $\frac{2}{538.2}$ of this act

1 title, or the person is a laser practitioner performing laser hair 2 removal under the supervision of a physician as defined in paragraphs 1 through 6 of subsection A of Section 725.2 of this 3 4 title, a certified physician assistant, or a certified Advanced 5 Practice Registered Nurse. A laser practitioner who is not a physician shall complete a laser practitioner training and education 6 7 program. A laser training and education program may be completed internally at the laser hair removal facility or via a third party, 8 9 provided such third-party program is overseen by a physician. A 10 laser practitioner training and education program shall include 11 forty (40) total hours of training, which may be a combination of 12 didactic training, in-person hands-on training, and performance of 13 laser hair removal procedures.

C. A laser hair removal facility shall be overseen by a
physician; provided, that Advanced Practice Registered Nurses shall
be exempt from this oversight requirement, as defined in paragraphs
1 through 6 of subsection A of Section 725.2 of this title, a
certified physician assistant, or a certified Advanced Practice
Registered Nurse.

20 D. The overseeing physician shall:

Establish proper protocols for laser hair removal provided
 at a facility including, but not limited to, complication
 management. A laser practitioner shall follow all written procedure
 protocols established and revised by the overseeing physician. Such

1 protocols shall require utilizing a physician, physician assistant, 2 or Advanced Practice Registered Nurse for complication management; 2. Determine the number of laser practitioners under such 3 4 physician's supervision; and 5 3. Review not less than ten percent (10%) of laser hair removal patient records. 6 7 Every physician or physician assistant or Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall establish a relationship with patients which 8 9 shall include an initial evaluation, prior to treatment, that is 10 either face-to-face or via telemedicine that is performed by the 11 physician or physician assistant or Advanced Practice Registered 12 Nurse. 13 As part of the patient relationship, each physician or certified 14 physician assistant or certified Advanced Practice Registered Nurse 15 shall create a patient chart. The chart shall contain an informed 16 consent, a treatment plan that includes risks, benefits, 17 alternatives, follow-up, and care for potential complications. 18 A physician shall not be required to be physically present Ε. or to supervise laser hair removal, but shall be available for 19 20 communication during the procedure, either in person or by two-way, 21 real time interactive communication. 22 F. A laser practitioner may perform laser hair removal on a 23 patient without the prior evaluation or referral of such patient by 24 a physician.

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1 G. The conduct of allopathic physicians and physician assistants pursuant to this act shall be regulated by the State 2 Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. The conduct of 3 4 osteopathic physicians pursuant to this act shall be regulated by 5 the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners. The conduct of Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, and Advanced Practice Registered 6 7 Nurses pursuant to this act shall be regulated by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing. 8

9 H. G. Nothing in this act shall prohibit any person in the 10 healing arts, in this state, under any other act, from engaging in 11 the practice for which he or she is duly licensed.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
