6 An Act relating to civil procedure; amending 12 O.S.  
7 2021, Section 2012, which relates to defenses and  
8 objections; providing procedures for default judgment  
9 under certain circumstances; clarifying effect of  
10 certain contact or communication; clarifying effect  
11 on evidentiary hearing for damages; amending 12 O.S.  
12 2021, Section 727.1, which relates to postjudgment  
13 interest; providing for certain postjudgment interest  
14 during pendency of an appeal; and providing an  
15 effective date.

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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 12 O.S. 2021, Section 2012, is  
21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 2012.

23 DEFENSES AND OBJECTIONS; WHEN AND HOW PRESENTED;

24 BY PLEADING OR MOTION

A. WHEN PRESENTED. 1. Unless a different time is prescribed  
by law, a defendant shall serve an answer:

a. within twenty (20) days after the service of the  
summons and petition upon the defendant,

b. within twenty (20) days after the service of the

summons and petition upon the defendant, or within the

1 last day for answering if applicable; provided, a  
2 defendant may file a reservation of time which shall  
3 extend the time to respond twenty (20) days from the  
4 last date for answering. The filing of such a  
5 reservation of time waives defenses of paragraphs 2,  
6 3, 4, 5, 6, and 9 of subsection B of this section.

7 2. A party served with a pleading stating a cross-claim against  
8 that party shall serve an answer thereto within twenty (20) days  
9 after the service upon the party.

10 3. The plaintiff shall serve a reply to a counterclaim in the  
11 answer within twenty (20) days after service of the answer or, if a  
12 reply is ordered by the court, within twenty (20) days after service  
13 of the order, unless the order otherwise directs.

14 4. The party requesting a summons to be issued or filing a  
15 ~~counter-claim~~ counterclaim or cross-claim may elect to have the  
16 answer served within thirty-five (35) days in lieu of the twenty  
17 (20) days set forth in this section.

18 5. The service of a motion permitted under this section or a  
19 motion for summary judgment alters these periods of time as follows:  
20 if the court denies the motion or postpones its disposition until  
21 the trial on the merits, the responsive pleading shall be served  
22 within twenty (20) days after notice of the court's action, unless a  
23 different time is fixed by order of the court.

1 B. HOW PRESENTED. Every defense, in law or fact, to a claim  
2 for relief in any pleading, whether a claim, counterclaim, cross-  
3 claim, or third-party claim, shall be asserted in the responsive  
4 pleading thereto if one is required, except that the following  
5 defenses may at the option of the pleader be made by motion:

- 6 1. Lack of jurisdiction over the subject matter;
- 7 2. Lack of jurisdiction over the person;
- 8 3. Improper venue;
- 9 4. Insufficiency of process;
- 10 5. Insufficiency of service of process;
- 11 6. Failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted;
- 12 7. Failure to join a party under Section 2019 of this title;
- 13 8. Another action pending between the same parties for the same  
14 claim;
- 15 9. Lack of capacity of a party to be sued; and
- 16 10. Lack of capacity of a party to sue.

17 A motion making any of these defenses shall be made before pleading  
18 if a further pleading is permitted. No defense or objection is  
19 waived by being joined with one or more other defenses or objections  
20 in a responsive pleading or motion. If a pleading sets forth a  
21 claim for relief to which the adverse party is not required to serve  
22 a responsive pleading, the adverse party may assert at the trial any  
23 defense in law or fact to that claim for relief. If, on a motion  
24 asserting the defense numbered 6 of this subsection to dismiss for

1 failure of the pleading to state a claim upon which relief can be  
2 granted, matters outside the pleading are presented to and not  
3 excluded by the court, the motion shall be treated as one for  
4 summary judgment and all parties shall be given reasonable  
5 opportunity to present all material made pertinent to the motion by  
6 the rules for summary judgment. A motion to dismiss for failure to  
7 state a claim upon which relief can be granted shall separately  
8 state each omission or defect in the petition, and a motion that  
9 does not specify such defects or omissions shall be denied without a  
10 hearing and the defendant shall answer within twenty (20) days after  
11 notice of the court's action.

12 C. PRELIMINARY HEARINGS. The defenses specifically enumerated  
13 in paragraphs 1 through 10 of subsection B of this section, whether  
14 made in a pleading or by motion, and the motion to strike mentioned  
15 in subsection D of this section shall be heard and determined before  
16 trial on application of any party, unless the court orders that the  
17 hearing and determination thereof be deferred until the trial. If  
18 the court determines that venue is proper, the action shall not be  
19 dismissed for improper venue as a result of the jury's verdict or  
20 the subsequent ruling of the court on a demurrer to the evidence or  
21 a motion for a directed verdict.

22 D. MOTION TO STRIKE. Upon motion made by a party before  
23 responding to a pleading or, if no responsive pleading is permitted  
24 by this act, upon motion made by a party within twenty (20) days

1 after the service of the pleading upon the party or upon the court's  
2 own initiative at any time, the court may order stricken from any  
3 pleading any insufficient defense. If, on a motion to strike an  
4 insufficient defense, matters outside the pleadings are presented to  
5 and not excluded by the court, the motion shall be treated as one  
6 for partial summary judgment and all parties shall be given  
7 reasonable opportunity to present all materials made pertinent to  
8 the motion by the rules for summary judgment.

9 E. CONSOLIDATION OF DEFENSES IN MOTION. A party who makes a  
10 motion under this section may join with it any other motions herein  
11 provided for and then available to the party. If a party makes a  
12 motion under this section but omits therefrom any defense or  
13 objection then available to the party which this section permits to  
14 be raised by motion, the party shall not thereafter make a motion  
15 based on the defense or objection so omitted, except a motion as  
16 provided in paragraph 2 of subsection F of this section on the  
17 grounds there stated. The court in its discretion may permit a  
18 party to amend a motion by stating additional defenses or objections  
19 if an amendment is sought at least five (5) days before the hearing  
20 on the motion.

21 F. WAIVER OR PRESERVATION OF CERTAIN DEFENSES.

22 1. A defense of lack of jurisdiction over the person, improper  
23 venue, insufficiency of process, insufficiency of service of  
24

1 process, failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted,  
2 or lack of capacity of a party to be sued is waived:

3 a. if omitted from a motion that raises any of the  
4 defenses or objections which this section permits to  
5 be raised by motion, or

6 b. if it is not made by motion and it is not included in  
7 a responsive pleading or an amendment thereof  
8 permitted by subsection A of Section 2015 of this  
9 title to be made as a matter of course. A motion to  
10 strike an insufficient defense is waived if not raised  
11 as in subsection D of this section.

12 2. A defense of failure to join a party indispensable under  
13 Section 2019 of this title may be made in any pleading permitted or  
14 ordered under subsection A of Section 2007 of this title or at the  
15 trial on the merits. A defense of another action pending between  
16 the same parties for the same claim or a defense of lack of capacity  
17 of a party to sue may be made in any pleading permitted or ordered  
18 pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of Section 2007 of this  
19 title or at the pretrial conference.

20 3. Whenever it appears by suggestion of the parties or  
21 otherwise that the court lacks jurisdiction of the subject matter,  
22 the court shall dismiss the action.

23 4. A waiver of the defense in paragraph 6 of subsection B of  
24 this section does not preclude a later contention that a party is

1 not entitled to any relief as a matter of law, either by motion for  
2 summary judgment, or by demurrer or motion at or after trial.

3 G. FINAL DISMISSAL ON FAILURE TO AMEND. On granting a motion  
4 to dismiss a claim for relief, the court shall grant leave to amend  
5 if the defect can be remedied and shall specify the time within  
6 which an amended pleading shall be filed. If the amended pleading  
7 is not filed within the time allowed, final judgment of dismissal  
8 with prejudice shall be entered on motion except in cases of  
9 excusable neglect. In such cases amendment shall be made by the  
10 party in default within a time specified by the court for filing an  
11 amended pleading. Within the time allowed by the court for filing  
12 an amended pleading, a plaintiff may voluntarily dismiss the action  
13 without prejudice.

14 H. MOTION FOR DEFAULT JUDGMENT NOT REQUIRED IF DEFENDANT FAILS  
15 TO FILE RESPONSE. Nothing in any provision of this title or in any  
16 local or district court rule shall be construed to require either a  
17 motion or a hearing for default judgment, and no notice shall be  
18 necessary, if, after service of summons and petition, a defendant  
19 fails to timely file with the court clerk within twenty (20) days a  
20 written appearance, answer, motion, pleading, or response as  
21 provided in subsection A of this section. Contact or communication  
22 with the plaintiff or attorney of the plaintiff shall not constitute  
23 an appearance, answer, motion, pleading, or response unless the  
24 contact or communication is in writing and is also timely filed by

1 the defendant in writing with the court clerk as provided in  
2 subsection A of this section. The provisions of this subsection  
3 shall not be construed to prevent an evidentiary hearing concerning  
4 the amount of damage to be awarded.

5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 12 O.S. 2021, Section 727.1, is  
6 amended to read as follows:

7 Section 727.1.

8 POSTJUDGMENT INTEREST

9 A. 1. Except as otherwise provided by this section, all  
10 judgments of courts of record, including costs and attorney fees  
11 authorized by statute or otherwise and allowed by the court, shall  
12 bear interest at a rate prescribed pursuant to this section. Such  
13 interest shall also apply to the amounts collected on any judgment  
14 enforced during the pendency of an appeal which is subsequently  
15 overturned on appeal when restitution is paid to the defendant.

16 2. Costs and attorney fees allowed by the court shall bear  
17 interest from the earlier of the date the judgment or order is  
18 pronounced, if expressly stated in the written judgment or order  
19 awarding the costs and attorney fees, or the date the judgment or  
20 order is filed with the court clerk.

21 B. Judgments, including costs and attorney fees authorized by  
22 statute or otherwise and allowed by the court, against this state or  
23 its political subdivisions, including counties, municipalities,  
24 school districts, and public trusts of which this state or a



1 political subdivision of this state is a beneficiary, shall bear  
2 interest during the term of judgment at a rate prescribed pursuant  
3 to this section from the date of rendition. No judgment against  
4 this state or its political subdivisions, including counties,  
5 municipalities, school districts, and public trusts of which this  
6 state or a political subdivision of this state is a beneficiary,  
7 inclusive of postjudgment interest, shall exceed the total amount of  
8 liability of the governmental entity pursuant to The Governmental  
9 Tort Claims Act.

10 C. The postjudgment interest authorized by subsection A or  
11 subsection B of this section shall accrue from the earlier of the  
12 date the judgment is rendered as expressly stated in the judgment,  
13 or the date the judgment is filed with the court clerk, and shall  
14 initially accrue at the rate in effect for the calendar year during  
15 which the judgment is rendered until the end of the calendar year in  
16 which the judgment was rendered, or until the judgment is paid,  
17 whichever first occurs. Beginning on January 1 of the next  
18 succeeding calendar year until the end of that calendar year, or  
19 until the judgment is paid, whichever first occurs, the judgment,  
20 together with postjudgment interest previously accrued, shall bear  
21 interest at the rate in effect for judgments rendered during that  
22 calendar year as certified by the Administrative Director of the  
23 Courts pursuant to subsection I of this section. For each  
24 succeeding calendar year, or part of a calendar year, during which a

1 judgment remains unpaid, the judgment, together with postjudgment  
2 interest previously accrued, shall bear interest at the rate in  
3 effect for judgments rendered during that calendar year as certified  
4 by the Administrative Director of the Courts pursuant to subsection  
5 I of this section. A separate computation using the interest rate  
6 in effect for judgments as provided by subsection I of this section  
7 shall be made for each calendar year, or part of a calendar year,  
8 during which the judgment remains unpaid in order to determine the  
9 total amount of interest for which the judgment debtor is liable.  
10 The postjudgment interest rate for each calendar year or part of a  
11 calendar year a judgment remains unpaid shall be multiplied by the  
12 original amount of the judgment, including any prejudgment interest,  
13 together with postjudgment interest previously accrued. Interest  
14 shall accrue on a judgment in the manner prescribed by this  
15 subsection until the judgment is satisfied or released.

16 D. If a rate of interest is specified in a contract, the rate  
17 specified shall apply and be stated in the journal entry of  
18 judgment. The rate of interest shall not exceed the lawful rate for  
19 that obligation. Postjudgment interest shall be calculated at the  
20 contractual rate and accrued in the same manner as prescribed in  
21 subsection C of this section.

#### 22 PREJUDGMENT INTEREST

23 E. Except as provided by subsection F of this section,  
24 beginning November 1, 2009, if a verdict for damages by reason of

1 personal injuries or injury to personal rights including, but not  
2 limited to, injury resulting from bodily restraint, personal insult,  
3 defamation, invasion of privacy, injury to personal relations, or  
4 detriment due to an act or omission of another is accepted by the  
5 trial court, the court in rendering judgment shall add interest on  
6 the verdict at a rate prescribed pursuant to subsection I of this  
7 section from the date which is twenty-four (24) months after the  
8 suit resulting in the judgment was commenced to the earlier of the  
9 date the verdict is accepted by the trial court as expressly stated  
10 in the judgment, or the date the judgment is filed with the court  
11 clerk. No prejudgment interest shall begin to accrue until twenty-  
12 four (24) months after the suit resulting in the judgment was  
13 commenced. The interest rate for computation of prejudgment  
14 interest shall begin with the rate prescribed by subsection I of  
15 this section which is in effect for the calendar year which is  
16 twenty-four (24) months after the suit resulting in the judgment was  
17 commenced. This rate shall be in effect until the end of the  
18 calendar year in which interest begins to accrue or until the date  
19 judgment is filed, whichever first occurs. Beginning on January 1  
20 of the next succeeding calendar year until the end of that calendar  
21 year, or until the date the judgment is filed, whichever first  
22 occurs, and for each succeeding calendar year thereafter, the  
23 prejudgment interest rate shall be the rate in effect for judgments  
24 rendered during each calendar year as certified by the

1 Administrative Director of the Courts pursuant to subsection I of  
2 this section. After the computation of all prejudgment interest has  
3 been completed, the total amount of prejudgment interest shall be  
4 added to the amount of the judgment rendered pursuant to the trial  
5 of the action, and the total amount of the resulting judgment shall  
6 become the amount upon which postjudgment interest is computed  
7 pursuant to subsection A of this section.

8 F. If a verdict of the type described by subsection E of this  
9 section is rendered against this state or its political  
10 subdivisions, including counties, municipalities, school districts,  
11 and public trusts of which this state or a political subdivision of  
12 this state is a beneficiary, the judgment shall bear interest at the  
13 rate prescribed pursuant to subsection I of this section from the  
14 date the suit was commenced to the earlier of the date the verdict  
15 is accepted by the trial court as expressly stated in the judgment  
16 or the date the judgment is filed with the court clerk. The  
17 interest rate for computation of prejudgment interest shall begin  
18 with the rate prescribed by subsection I of this section which is in  
19 effect for the calendar year in which the suit resulting in the  
20 judgment is commenced. This rate shall be in effect until the end  
21 of the calendar year in which the suit resulting in judgment was  
22 filed or until the date the judgment is rendered as expressly stated  
23 in the judgment, whichever first occurs. Beginning on January 1 of  
24 the next succeeding calendar year until the end of that calendar

1 year, or until the date judgment is rendered, whichever first  
2 occurs, and for each succeeding calendar year thereafter, the  
3 prejudgment interest rate shall be the rate in effect for judgments  
4 rendered during each calendar year as certified by the  
5 Administrative Director of the Courts pursuant to subsection I of  
6 this section. After the computation of prejudgment interest has  
7 been completed, the amount shall be added to the amount of the  
8 judgment rendered pursuant to the trial of the action, and the total  
9 amount of the resulting judgment shall become the amount upon which  
10 postjudgment interest is computed pursuant to subsection B of this  
11 section. No award of prejudgment interest against this state or its  
12 political subdivisions, including counties, municipalities, school  
13 districts, and public trusts of which this state or a political  
14 subdivision of this state is a beneficiary, including the amount of  
15 the judgment awarded pursuant to trial of the action, shall exceed  
16 the total amount of liability of the governmental entity pursuant to  
17 The Governmental Tort Claims Act.

18 G. If exemplary or punitive damages are awarded in an action  
19 for personal injury or injury to personal rights including, but not  
20 limited to, injury resulting from bodily restraint, personal insult,  
21 defamation, invasion of privacy, injury to personal relations, or  
22 detriment due to an act or omission of another, the interest on that  
23 award shall begin to accrue from the earlier of the date the  
24

1 judgment is rendered as expressly stated in the judgment, or the  
2 date the judgment is filed with the court clerk.

3 H. If a judgment is rendered establishing the existence of a  
4 lien against property and no rate of interest exists, the court  
5 shall allow prejudgment interest at a rate prescribed pursuant to  
6 subsection I of this section from the date the lien is filed to the  
7 date of verdict.

8 I. For purposes of computing postjudgment interest as  
9 authorized by this section, interest shall be the prime rate, as  
10 listed in the first edition of the Wall Street Journal published for  
11 each calendar year and as certified to the Administrative Director  
12 of the Courts by the State Treasurer on the first regular business  
13 day following publication in January of each year, plus two percent  
14 (2%). For purposes of computing prejudgment interest as authorized  
15 by this section, interest shall be determined using a rate equal to  
16 the average United States Treasury Bill rate of the preceding  
17 calendar year as certified to the Administrative Director of the  
18 Courts by the State Treasurer on the first regular business day in  
19 January of each year.

20 J. For purposes of computing postjudgment interest, the  
21 provisions of this section shall be applicable to all judgments of  
22 the district courts rendered on or after January 1, 2005. Effective  
23 January 1, 2005, the method for computing postjudgment interest  
24

1 prescribed by this section shall be applicable to all judgments  
2 remaining unpaid rendered prior to January 1, 2005.

3 K. For purposes of computing prejudgment interest, the  
4 provisions of this section shall be applicable to all actions which  
5 are filed in the district courts on or after January 1, 2010, for  
6 which an award of prejudgment interest is authorized by the  
7 provisions of this section.

8 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
