16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-114, is  
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 7-114. A. Each person appearing to vote shall announce  
20 that person's name to the judge of the precinct and shall provide  
21 proof of identity, whereupon the judge shall determine whether the  
22 person's name is in the precinct registry. As used in this section,  
23 "proof of identity" shall mean a document that satisfies all of the  
24 following requirements:

1 1. The document shows the name of the person to whom the  
2 document was issued, and the name substantially conforms to the name  
3 in the precinct registry;

4 2. The document shows a photograph of the person to whom the  
5 document was issued;

6 3. The document includes an expiration date, which is after the  
7 date of the election in which the person is appearing to vote. The  
8 provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to:

- 9 a. an identification card that is valid indefinitely, or
- 10 b. an identification card issued by a branch of the armed  
11 services of the United States to a person who is a  
12 member of such branch or is retired therefrom; ~~and~~

13 4. The document was issued by the United States, the State of  
14 Oklahoma or the government of a federally recognized Indian tribe or  
15 nation;

16 5. Provided, for any election conducted prior to January 1,  
17 2027, if the person presents a voter identification card issued by  
18 the appropriate county election board, such card may serve as proof  
19 of identity without meeting the requirements of paragraphs 2 and 3  
20 of this subsection; and

21 6. Provided, for any election conducted after January 1, 2027,  
22 each person appearing to vote as described in this subsection shall  
23 present proof of identity that meets the requirements of paragraphs  
24 1 through 4 of this subsection.

1        B. 1. No later than January 1, 2027, Service Oklahoma shall  
2 develop and make available a photo identification card that meets  
3 the requirements of subsection A of this section to serve as a proof  
4 of identity for voters.

5        2. The photo identification card described in this subsection  
6 shall be provided free of charge by Service Oklahoma to any  
7 registered voter who presents a voter registration card described in  
8 Section 4-113 or another document showing proof of voter  
9 registration. The voter shall affirm that they are a registered  
10 voter and do not possess a document that meets the requirements of  
11 paragraphs 1 through 4 of subsection A of this section.

12        3. The Chief Executive Officer of Service Oklahoma shall  
13 consult with the Secretary of the State Election Board to develop  
14 the photo identification card.

15        C. The requirements for proof of identity described in  
16 subsection A of this section shall apply to each voter appearing to  
17 vote at an in-person absentee voting site.

19        D. 1. If a person declines to or is unable to produce proof of  
20 identity, the person may sign a statement under oath, in a form  
21 approved by the Secretary of the State Election Board, swearing or  
22 affirming that the person is the person identified on the precinct  
23 registry, and shall be allowed to cast a provisional ballot in a  
24

1 manner consistent with the provisions of Section 7-116.1 of this  
2 title.

3 2. A provisional ballot cast by a voter who declines or is  
4 unable to produce proof of identity shall only be considered  
5 verified and approved for counting if:

6 a. the voter's name on the affidavit substantially  
7 conforms to the voter's name in the voter registration  
8 database, except as provided in paragraph 3 of this  
9 subsection,

10 b. the voter's residence address on the affidavit  
11 substantially conforms to the voter's residence  
12 address in the voter registration database, except as  
13 provided in paragraph 4 of this subsection,

14 c. the voter's date of birth matches the information in  
15 the voter registration database,

16 d. the voter's Oklahoma driver license number or the last  
17 four digits of the voter's Social Security number on  
18 the affidavit matches the information in the voter  
19 registration database. The provisions of this  
20 subparagraph shall not apply if the voter was not  
21 required to provide a driver license number or the  
22 last four digits of the voter's Social Security number  
23 at the time of registration, and  
24

1 e. the provisional ballot meets the eligibility  
2 requirements set forth in Section 7-116.1 of this  
3 title.

4 3. A voter casting a provisional ballot as provided in this  
5 section who has legally changed his or her name, but has not updated  
6 the name on the voter registry, may note this fact on the affidavit  
7 and submit a form prescribed by the Secretary of the State Election  
8 Board to update his or her name. In such a case, and where the  
9 requirements of Section 4-117 of this title are satisfied, the  
10 provisional ballot shall be deemed to meet the requirements of  
11 subparagraph a of paragraph 2 of this subsection.

12 4. A voter casting a provisional ballot as provided in this  
13 section who has changed his or her address of residence, but has not  
14 updated the address on the voter registry, may note this fact on the  
15 affidavit and submit a form to update the address prescribed by the  
16 Secretary of the State Election Board. In such a case, and where  
17 the requirements of Section 4-117 of this title are satisfied, the  
18 provisional ballot shall be deemed to meet the requirements of  
19 subparagraph a of paragraph 2 of this subsection.

20 5. False swearing or affirming under oath shall be punishable  
21 as a felony as provided in Section 16-103 of this title, and the  
22 penalty shall be distinctly set forth on the face of the statement.

23 E. The Secretary of the State Election Board may promulgate  
24 rules or procedures to implement the requirements of this section.

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-105.3, as  
2 last amended by Section 42, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (47 O.S. Supp.  
3 2024, Section 6-105.3), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 6-105.3. A. In addition to the licenses to operate  
5 motor vehicles, Service Oklahoma may issue cards to Oklahoma  
6 residents for purposes of identification only. The identification  
7 cards shall be issued, renewed, replaced, canceled and denied in the  
8 same manner as driver licenses in this state. A licensee whose  
9 record reflects a notation of the person's proof of legal presence,  
10 verified by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, or proof of  
11 U.S. citizenship, may obtain a REAL ID Compliant Identification Card  
12 or a Noncompliant Identification Card from a licensed operator or  
13 Service Oklahoma, regardless of the status of the license held by  
14 the licensee. Provided, the licensee must comply with all REAL ID  
15 documentation requirements to obtain a REAL ID Compliant  
16 Identification Card. A person shall not apply for or possess more  
17 than one state-issued or territory-issued REAL ID Compliant  
18 Identification Card pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-101 of  
19 this title.

20 The application for an identification card by any person under  
21 the age of eighteen (18) years shall be signed and verified by a  
22 custodial legal parent or legal guardian, either in person before a  
23 person authorized to administer oaths or electronically if  
24 completing an online application, or a notarized affidavit signed by

1 a custodial legal parent or legal guardian submitted before a person  
2 authorized to administer oaths by the person under the age of  
3 eighteen (18) years with the application. Except as otherwise  
4 provided in this section, the identification cards shall be valid  
5 for a period of either four (4) years from the month of issuance or  
6 eight (8) years from the month of issuance; however, the  
7 identification cards issued to persons sixty-five (65) years of age  
8 or older shall be valid indefinitely from the month of issuance.

9 B. 1. The Department of Corrections shall coordinate with  
10 Service Oklahoma to provide REAL ID Noncompliant Identification  
11 Cards to all inmates who do not have a current state-issued  
12 identification card or driver license upon their release from  
13 custody. The identification cards shall be issued, replaced,  
14 canceled and denied in the same manner as driver licenses in this  
15 state.

16 2. Service Oklahoma shall allow the use of a certified copy of  
17 a birth certificate coupled with a Department of Corrections-issued  
18 consolidated record card to serve as a valid form of photo  
19 identification documentation to obtain a REAL ID Noncompliant  
20 Identification Card.

21 3. REAL ID Noncompliant Identification Cards issued with a  
22 consolidated record card from the Department of Corrections for  
23 inmates shall be valid for a period of four (4) years from the month  
24

1 of issuance ~~for an allowable fee to be determined by Service~~  
2 ~~Oklahoma~~ and are nonrenewable and nontransferable.

3 4. ~~The~~ There shall be no fee charged for the issuance or  
4 replacement of a REAL ID Noncompliant Identification Card pursuant  
5 to this subsection ~~shall be deposited in the Department of Public~~  
6 ~~Safety Revolving Fund through October 31, 2022. Beginning November~~  
7 ~~1, 2022, this fee shall be deposited in the Service Oklahoma~~  
8 ~~Revolving Fund. Provided, however, REAL ID Noncompliant~~  
9 ~~Identification Cards issued to individuals required to register~~  
10 ~~pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act shall only be valid~~  
11 ~~for a period of one (1) year. No person sixty-five (65) years of~~  
12 ~~age or older shall be charged a fee for a REAL ID Noncompliant~~  
13 ~~Identification Card.~~

14 5. Service Oklahoma is authorized to promulgate rules and  
15 procedures to implement the provisions of this subsection.

16 C. No person shall hold more than one state-issued or  
17 territory-issued REAL ID Compliant Driver License or REAL ID  
18 Compliant Identification Card, as defined in subsection G of Section  
19 6-101 of this title. Service Oklahoma shall not issue a REAL ID  
20 Compliant Identification Card to any applicant who has been  
21 previously issued a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or REAL ID  
22 Compliant Identification Card unless such license or identification  
23 card has been surrendered to the Department by the applicant.  
24 Service Oklahoma may promulgate rules related to the issuance of

1 replacement REAL ID Compliant Identification Cards in the event of  
2 loss or theft.

3 D. ~~The~~ There shall be no fee charged for the issuance or  
4 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Identification Card ~~shall be Twenty-~~  
5 ~~five Dollars (\$25.00) for a 4-year card and Fifty Dollars (\$50.00)~~  
6 ~~for an 8-year card. The fee charged for the issuance or renewal of~~  
7 ~~a REAL ID Noncompliant Identification Card pursuant to this section~~  
8 ~~shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for a 4-year card and Fifty~~  
9 ~~Dollars (\$50.00) for an 8-year card; however, no person sixty-five~~  
10 ~~(65) years of age or older, or one hundred percent (100%) disabled~~  
11 ~~veteran described in subsection P of Section 6-101 of this title~~  
12 ~~shall be charged a fee for an identification card. Of each fee~~  
13 ~~charged pursuant to the provisions of this subsection:~~

14 1. ~~Seven Dollars (\$7.00) of a 4-year card and Fourteen Dollars~~  
15 ~~(\$14.00) of an 8-year card shall be apportioned as provided in~~  
16 ~~Section 1104 of this title;~~

17 2. ~~Three Dollars (\$3.00) of a 4-year card and Six Dollars~~  
18 ~~(\$6.00) of an 8-year card shall be credited to the Department of~~  
19 ~~Public Safety Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used~~  
20 ~~solely for the purpose of the administration and maintenance of the~~  
21 ~~computerized imaging system of the Department through October 31,~~  
22 ~~2022. Beginning November 1, 2022, Three Dollars (\$3.00) of a 4-year~~  
23 ~~card and Six Dollars (\$6.00) of an 8-year card shall be credited to~~  
24 ~~the Service Oklahoma Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be~~

1 ~~used solely for the purpose of administration and maintenance of the~~  
2 ~~computerized imaging system of Service Oklahoma;~~

3 ~~3. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of a 4-year card and Twenty Dollars~~  
4 ~~(\$20.00) of an 8-year card shall be deposited in the Department of~~  
5 ~~Public Safety Revolving Fund through October 31, 2022. Beginning~~  
6 ~~November 1, 2022, this fee shall be deposited in the Service~~  
7 ~~Oklahoma Revolving Fund;~~

8 ~~4. Three Dollars (\$3.00) of a 4-year card and Six Dollars~~  
9 ~~(\$6.00) of an 8-year card shall be deposited to the State Public~~  
10 ~~Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title; and~~

11 ~~5. Two Dollars (\$2.00) for a 4-year card and Four Dollars~~  
12 ~~(\$4.00) for an 8-year card of the fee authorized by this subsection~~  
13 ~~related to the issuance or renewal of an identification card by a~~  
14 ~~licensed operator that does process approved applications or~~  
15 ~~renewals for REAL ID Compliant and REAL ID Noncompliant Driver~~  
16 ~~Licenses or Identification Cards shall be retained by the licensed~~  
17 ~~operator pursuant to subsection E of Section 1141.1 of this title.~~

18 E. The fee charged for replacement of a REAL ID Compliant  
19 Identification Card, or REAL ID Noncompliant Identification Card,  
20 shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00); however, no person sixty-five  
21 (65) years of age or older shall be charged a fee for an  
22 identification card replacement. Of each fee charged pursuant to  
23 the provisions of this subsection:

24

1        1. Seven Dollars (\$7.00) shall be apportioned as provided in  
2 Section 1104 of this title;

3        2. Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be credited to the Department of  
4 Public Safety Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used  
5 solely for the purpose of the administration and maintenance of the  
6 computerized imaging system of the Department through October 31,  
7 2022. Beginning November 1, 2022, Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be  
8 credited to the Service Oklahoma Computer Imaging System Revolving  
9 Fund to be used solely for the purpose of administration and  
10 maintenance of the computerized imaging system of Service Oklahoma;

11       3. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be deposited in the Department of  
12 Public Safety Revolving Fund through October 31, 2022. Beginning  
13 November 1, 2022, this fee shall be deposited in the Service  
14 Oklahoma Revolving Fund;

15       4. Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be deposited to the State Public  
16 Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title; and

17       5. Two Dollars (\$2.00) of the fee authorized by this subsection  
18 related to the replacement of an identification card by a licensed  
19 operator that does process approved applications or renewals for  
20 REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver Licenses or  
21 Identification Cards shall be retained by the licensed operator  
22 pursuant to subsection E of Section 1141.1 of this title.

23       F. The Oklahoma Tax Commission is hereby authorized to  
24 reimburse, from funds available to that agency, each licensed

1 operator issuing an identification card to a person sixty-five (65)  
2 years of age or older, an amount not to exceed One Dollar (\$1.00)  
3 for each card or driver license so issued through June 30, 2023.  
4 The Tax Commission shall develop procedures for claims for  
5 reimbursement.

6 G. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, when a person  
7 makes application for a new identification card, or makes  
8 application to renew an identification card, and the person has been  
9 convicted of, or received a deferred judgment for, any offense  
10 required to register pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act,  
11 the identification card shall be valid for a period of one (1) year  
12 from the month of issuance, but may be renewed yearly during the  
13 time the person is subject to registration on the Sex Offender  
14 Registry. The cost for such identification card shall be the same  
15 as for the replacement of other identification cards ~~and renewals~~.

16 H. Nothing in this section requires or authorizes the  
17 Department of Public Safety to issue a REAL ID Noncompliant  
18 Identification Card without the documentation required by the  
19 provisions of paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this  
20 title.

21 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
