14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-9-100 of Title 27A, unless
17	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
19	Invasive Woody Species Stewardship for State-Leased Lands Act".
20	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-9-101 of Title 27A, unless
22	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	A. As used in this act, "invasive woody species" means a native
24	or non-native tree or shrub species that threatens and causes harm

to the environment, water resources, or economy. Invasive woody species include, but are not limited to, Juniperus virginiana (Eastern Redcedar), Juniperus scopulorum (Rocky Mountain juniper), Juniperus monosperma (oneseed juniper), and Tamarix ramosissima (salt cedar).

B. As established in the Oklahoma Constitution, the 6 Commissioners of the Land Office are responsible for the management 7 of the permanent school fund and the management of trust assets for 8 9 the exclusive purpose of providing maximum benefits of current and 10 future beneficiaries. Invasive woody species threaten to, and have caused harmed to, the environment, water resources, and the economy, 11 including having caused harm to and devaluing the trust assets and 12 13 the permanent school fund. Invasive woody species are likely to cause further harm to and further devalue the Office's trust assets 14 of the permanent school fund. In order to protect and maintain the 15 value of trust assets of the permanent school fund, and to manage 16 trust assets for the benefit of current and future beneficiaries, 17 the Office is hereby authorized to remove and manage invasive woody 18 species as provided in this act. 19

C. By December 15 of each year, the Office shall identify and prioritize trust lands that have been harmed and devalued by invasive woody species and shall submit a management plan to the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, outlining the strategy that the

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Commissioners of the Land Office intend to employ for the removal
and ongoing maintenance of invasive woody species on trust lands.

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D. The Office shall be authorized to:

Enter into programs run by, in coordination with, or in
contract with the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, other state or
federal agencies, or entities lawfully engaging in prescribed burns
for the removal and management of invasive woody species;

8 2. Contract with vendors for the removal and management of9 invasive woody species;

10 3. Contract with its lessee for the removal and management of 11 invasive woody species; and

Engage in any other lawful activity for the removal and
management of invasive woody species.

E. By February 15 each year, the Commissioners of the Land Office shall submit electronically a report to the Legislature detailing the actions taken and the program made under the provisions of this act.

F. Beginning in fiscal year 2026, and each subsequent fiscal year, the Commissioners of the Land Office shall expend no greater than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to carry out the provisions of this act. The Office may also receive state resources through coordination with the Oklahoma Conservation Commission or other state agencies.

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1	G. The Commissioners of the Land Office shall promulgate all
2	rules necessary to implement the provisions of this act.
3	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
