19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
21	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
22	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Wyman West
23	Actual Lock the Clock Act".

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 161, O.S.L.
2 2024 (25 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 90.29), is amended to read as
3 follows:

Section 90.29. A. If a federal law is passed that authorizes
states to observe daylight saving time year-round, Upon returning
to Standard Time on November 2, 2025, this state shall adopt
daylight saving standard time as the year-round standard of time for
the entire state and all its political subdivisions.

9 B. This section shall not be construed to affect the standard 10 time established by federal law governing the movement of common 11 carriers engaged in interstate commerce or the time for performance 12 of an act by an officer or department of the United States, as established by a statute, lawful order, rule, or regulation of the 13 14 United States or an agency thereof. 15 SECTION 3.
