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8                                   COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

9                   An Act relating to professions and occupations;  
10                   amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1000.4a, as amended by  
11                   Section 3, Chapter 185, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp.  
12                   2024, Section 1000.4a), which relates to construction  
13                   skilled trade education; modifying contract terms;  
14                   and providing an effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16                   SECTION 1.           AMENDATORY           59 O.S. 2021, Section 1000.4a, as  
17                   amended by Section 3, Chapter 185, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024,  
18                   Section 1000.4a), is amended to read as follows:

19                   Section 1000.4a.   A.   The Construction Industries Board shall  
20                   have the additional powers to:

21                   1.   Receive and convey information relating to the skilled  
22                   trades regulated by the Construction Industries Board including, but  
23                   not limited to, workforce development; and

24                   2.   Enter into contracts with the Oklahoma Department of Career  
                  and Technology Education ~~or,~~ any Oklahoma State Board of Career and

1 Technology Education fully accredited vocational or technical  
2 school, or any accredited system of education institution in ~~the~~  
3 ~~State of Oklahoma~~ this state receiving state appropriations and  
4 offering programs in secondary ~~and~~ or postsecondary instruction that  
5 provide electrical, mechanical, plumbing or roofing trade coursework  
6 for any of the following purposes, or combination thereof:

7 a. developing and implementing instructional courses on  
8 Oklahoma Statutes and rules that govern the  
9 electrical, mechanical, plumbing and roofing trades,  
10 which courses can be in conjunction with instruction  
11 in performing trade work or instruction on statewide-  
12 adopted trade codes, or both, for the advancement of  
13 the electrical, mechanical, plumbing and roofing  
14 trades, or

15 b. developing and implementing a workforce development  
16 program that will create interest in the pursuit of a  
17 skilled trade career. The workforce development  
18 program may consist of, but ~~is~~ shall not be limited  
19 to, use of the Internet, community and school  
20 presentations, ~~and~~ research and instruction on the  
21 electrical, mechanical, plumbing and roofing trades,  
22 and may be implemented through public awareness and  
23 public information campaigns to promote skilled trades  
24 and skilled trade careers as provided in this section.

1 B. All contracts pursuant to this section shall be approved by  
2 the Construction Industries Board in accordance with the Oklahoma  
3 Open Meeting Act. Costs of the contracts for education and  
4 workforce development programs shall be paid from the Skilled Trade  
5 Education and Workforce Development Fund ~~established herein~~ created  
6 in subsection E of this section and funded by administrative fines  
7 or penalties as described in this section. Applications for  
8 proposals are to be submitted to the Board on forms provided  
9 requiring sufficient justification and information to evaluate  
10 costs, return on investment, value, and viability of the proposal.  
11 Any contracts will include the requirement that the recipient of the  
12 funds will, upon the completion of the contract, provide a written  
13 report to the Board providing an accounting of expenditures,  
14 describing an explanation of the funds used for the services  
15 provided and the success of outreach demonstrating a return on the  
16 investment including, but not limited to, an accounting of  
17 accomplishments.

18 C. Fines or penalties collected by the Board and deposited in  
19 the Oklahoma Mechanical Licensing Revolving Fund, the Electrical  
20 Revolving Fund, the Plumbing Licensing Revolving Fund and the  
21 Roofing Contractor Registration Revolving Fund may be transferred to  
22 the Skilled Trade Education and Workforce Development Fund created  
23 in subsection E of this section for the following purposes:  
24

1 1. To develop instructional materials on Oklahoma laws,  
2 statutes and rules, as they relate to the plumbing, mechanical,  
3 electrical and roofing trades and state licensing standards;

4 2. To cover the cost of equipment, materials, personnel and any  
5 other costs of developing and implementing the trade curriculum; and

6 3. To cover the cost of equipment, materials, personnel and any  
7 other costs of developing and implementing the workforce development  
8 program used to promote the plumbing, mechanical, electrical and  
9 roofing trades as a career in Oklahoma.

10 D. The Skilled Trade Education and Workforce Development Fund  
11 monies shall be used only for the advancement of trade-related  
12 education and workforce development, and only if available based  
13 upon statutory limitations.

14 E. 1. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a  
15 revolving fund for the Construction Industries Board to be  
16 designated the "Skilled Trade Education and Workforce Development  
17 Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal  
18 year limitations. The fund shall consist of an annual transfer of  
19 fully adjudicated fine revenue received in the Oklahoma Mechanical  
20 Licensing Revolving Fund, Electrical Revolving Fund, Plumbing  
21 Licensing Revolving Fund or Roofing Contractor Registration  
22 Revolving Fund as determined pursuant to this section. Funds may be  
23 transferred only from the prior fiscal year.

1           2. If actual receipts, not including fine receipts, exceed  
2 actual expenses and outstanding encumbrances, then one hundred  
3 percent (100%) of all fully adjudicated fine revenue received shall  
4 be transferred from each specific trade revolving fund: the  
5 Oklahoma Mechanical Licensing Revolving Fund, Electrical Revolving  
6 Fund, Plumbing Licensing Revolving Fund or Roofing Contractor  
7 Registration Revolving Fund.

8           3. If at any time the receipts in the Oklahoma Mechanical  
9 Licensing Revolving Fund, Electrical Revolving Fund, Plumbing  
10 Licensing Revolving Fund or Roofing Contractor Registration  
11 Revolving Fund, not including fine receipts, are less than actual  
12 expenses and outstanding encumbrances, then the difference of fine  
13 receipts over actual expenses and outstanding encumbrances, if any,  
14 shall be transferred.

15           4. If at any time the annual receipts in the Oklahoma  
16 Mechanical Licensing Revolving Fund, Electrical Revolving Fund,  
17 Plumbing Licensing Revolving Fund or Roofing Contractor Registration  
18 Revolving Fund, including fine receipts, are less than the actual  
19 expenses and outstanding encumbrances, there shall be no transfer of  
20 funds for that period.

21           5. All monies accruing to the credit of the Skilled Trade  
22 Education and Workforce Development Fund may be budgeted and  
23 expended by the Construction Industries Board for workforce  
24 development as it relates to the skilled trades and to contract for

1 the services identified in this act. Expenditures from the fund  
2 shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against  
3 claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of  
4 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

5 6. All unexpended or outstanding Skilled Trade Education and  
6 Workforce Development Funds from any written agreement where work or  
7 services have not been previously approved by specific quote or cost  
8 estimate and have not been performed within eighteen (18) months of  
9 the date the agreement was signed are hereby released from the  
10 agreement and are available for future agreements approved by the  
11 Board pursuant to this act, except for specific quotes, estimates,  
12 or invoices that previously have been approved for payment,  
13 performance has been initiated, and completed within twenty-four  
14 (24) months of the signed agreement.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
