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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-203 of Title 70, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. Human growth and development curriculum shall be taught in
20	the public schools of this state. Human growth and development
21	education shall include, but is not limited to:
22	1. Human biology related to pregnancy;
23	2. Human development inside of a womb;
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3. A high-definition ultrasound video, at least three (3)
 minutes in duration, showing the development of the fetus in a
 biological woman; and

4 4. A high-quality, computer-generated rendering or animation
5 showing the process of fetal development, highlighting significant
6 markers in cell growth and organ development until birth.

7 в. School districts shall provide the curriculum described in subsection A of this section to students if the student's parent or 8 9 legal guardian complete an opt-in permission form. Schools may 10 incorporate the curriculum into an existing course or courses or 11 develop curriculum for a separate course. Schools shall provide 12 parents and legal quardians an opt-in permission form to authorize 13 their child be taught the curriculum described in subsection A of 14 this section two (2) weeks prior to the date the curriculum is to be 15 The opt-in permission shall be on a form prescribed by the taught. 16 State Board of Education and retained by the school district.

In order to graduate from a public high school accredited by 18 the State Board of Education with a standard diploma, students in 19 grades nine through twelve shall receive human growth and 20 development instruction as described in subsection A of this section 21 unless the student's parent or legal quardian did not complete an 22 opt-in permission form as provided for in subsection B of this 23 section or the student has an Individualized Education Program (IEP) 24 for a significant cognitive disability. Such instruction shall be

1	integrated into health or science education and shall be
2	incorporated into the state academic content standards adopted by
3	the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 11-103.6 of Title
4	70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
