NEW LAW 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 396.3b of Title 59, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 19 The term "assistant funeral director" as herein used means a 20 person who assists a duly Oklahoma licensed funeral director in one 21 or more of the principal functions of funeral directing, and is 22 actively engaged in such work. An assistant funeral director must 23 be an employee of the funeral director-in-charge under whom the 24 employee is registered, and shall be a person to whom the funeral

- director-in-charge delegates the responsibility of conducting

 funeral services, making funeral arrangements, and making

 interments.
- 4 The State Board may, in its discretion, license assistant В. funeral directors to each Oklahoma licensed funeral director-in-5 charge. The funeral director-in-charge shall have only one 6 7 assistant funeral director. Licensure as an assistant funeral director shall be separate and distinct from registration as an 8 9 apprentice funeral director and/or embalmer. The board may issue an 10 assistant funeral director license on successful completion of the 11 Oklahoma Funeral Board law examination, the manner and form of which 12 is to be determined by the Board, and upon the payment of the 13 application fee which shall include the license fee for the current 14 year or portion thereof, and such application and registration and 15 renewal fee shall be in the amount fixed by the Board in accordance 16 with the provision of Section 396.4 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma 17 Statutes. Before issuing a license to an applicant for an assistant 18 funeral director's license, the Board shall require satisfactory 19 proof that the applicant is capable and trustworthy to act as such 20 and that the applicant is a person of good moral character, has a 21 good standing in the community and is qualified to engage in the 22 business. In determining the moral character of any such applicant, 23 the Board shall take into consideration any felony conviction of 24 such person, but such conviction shall not automatically operate as

a bar to licensure. Each person applying for an assistant funeral director's license shall make application and be recommended in writing on forms provided by the Board. The application shall show that the applicant is at least eighteen (18) years of age and shall have at least sixty (60) semester hours of study earned, measured in quarter or clock hours, from a regionally accredited college or university before such license can be issued to the applicant. issuing a license to an assistant funeral director, as herein provided, the Board shall cause the licensee to be registered in under the supervision of the Oklahoma licensed funeral director by whom such licensee is employed and under whom such licensee is The funeral director under whom the assistant funeral registered. director has been registered must immediately notify the Board when the licensee has left the director's employ. Upon the re-employment of the licensee by any other funeral director-in-charge, such licensee shall be reinstated by the Board. The work of an assistant funeral director shall at all times be under the supervision and control of the Oklahoma licensed funeral director under whom the licensee is registered. Licenses of assistant funeral directors may be suspended or revoked, or the Board may refuse to issue or renew the same, for any of the reasons and in the manner stated herein for funeral directors' licenses.

C. The expiration date of each license shall be December 31st. Subject to the provisions of this section, each license shall be

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1	renewable on an annual basis upon the filing of a renewal
2	application prior to the expiration date of the license and upon
3	payment of the renewal fee.
4	D. The funeral director assistant shall complete continuing
5	education in accordance with the provision of Section 396.5b of
6	Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
