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8	An Act relating to ambulance service; creating the Oklahoma Triage, Treat, and Transport to Alternative
9	Destination Act; providing short title; defining terms; requiring coverage for certain services;

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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
16	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
17	This act may be known and cited as the "Oklahoma Triage, Treat,
18	and Transport to Alternative Destination Act".
19	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.11c of Title 36, unless
21	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	A. As used in this act:
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1. "9-1-1 call" means a communication made on behalf of an 1 2 enrollee indicating that the enrollee may need emergency medical services; 3 "Alternative destination" means a lower-acuity 2. a. 4 5 facility that provides medical services, including, but not limited to: 6 a Federally Qualified Health Center, 7 (1)an urgent care center, 8 (2) 9 (3) a physician's office or medical clinic, or a behavioral or mental health care facility, 10 (4)including, but not limited to, a crisis 11 stabilization unit and a diversion center. 12 b. Alternative destination does not include: 13 a dialysis center, 14 (1)a hospital, 15 (2) (3) a private residence, or 16 a skilled nursing facility; 17 (4)3. "Ambulance service" has the same meaning as provided by 18 Section 1-2503 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes; 19 4. "Enrollee" means an individual who is covered by any health 20 benefit plan; and 21 5. "Health benefit plan" means any such policy as provided by 22 Section 4405.1 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 23

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- 1 B. On and after January 1, 2026, any insurer that offers, issues, or renews a health benefit plan in this state shall provide 2 coverage for: 3
 - Services provided by an ambulance service provider to:
 - treat an enrollee in place, or
 - triage, treat, or transport an enrollee to an b. alternative destination; and
 - 2. An encounter between an ambulance service and enrollee that results in no transport of the enrollee.
 - C. The coverage under this section:

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- Is subject to the initiation of ambulance service treatment 11 as a result of a 9-1-1 call that is documented in the records of the 12 13 ambulance service;
 - 2. Is subject to health benefit plan deductibles or copayment requirements;
 - 3. Does not diminish or limit benefits otherwise allowable under a health benefit plan, even if the billing claims for medical or behavioral health services overlap in time that is billed by the ambulance service that is also providing care; and
- 4. Is subject to any health benefit plan provision that applies 20 to other services covered by the health benefit plan.
- The reimbursement rate for an ambulance service whose 22 operators triage, treat, and transport an enrollee to an alternative 23 destination shall not be less than the minimum allowable 24

1	reimbursement rate for advanced life support with mileage to the
2	scene.
3	E. This act shall apply to all contracts subject to this
4	section that are entered into or renewed on or after January 1,
5	2026.
6	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
