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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2621, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 2621. There is hereby created the Tulsa Reconciliation
16	Education and Scholarship Program. The purpose of the program is to
17 18	provide a scholarship award to residents of the Tulsa School
19	District, which was greatly impacted both socially and economically
20	by the civil unrest that occurred in the City of Tulsa during 1921.
21	Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, or as soon thereafter as
22	practicable, and subject to the availability of funds, the program
23	shall each year make scholarships available to as many students as
24	feasible, up to three hundred scholarships, to qualified residents

1 of the Tulsa School District $_{\overline{r}}$ and to qualified students of any other 2 public school district in the United States who are direct lineal descendants as defined in subsection C of Section 2623 of this title 3 and who meet the criteria set forth in Sections 2623 and 2624 of 4 5 this title, and who are intending to pursue studies at an institution of higher education in The Oklahoma State System of 6 Higher Education or a private institution of higher education, in 7 this state or who are intending to pursue studies in a postsecondary 8 9 career and technology education program in this state. 10 scholarship shall be an amount of not more than not exceeding the equivalent of the average amount of resident tuition for which an 11 12 eligible Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant enrolled at an institution of higher education in The 13 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education or a postsecondary career 14 and technology education program, whichever is applicable, is 15 obligated to pay. The scholarship shall be paid as provided for in 16 Section 2625 of this title. The further purpose of this program is 17 to establish and maintain a variety of educational support services 18 whereby residents students who qualify for the program will be 19 prepared for success in postsecondary endeavors. 20 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2623, is 21 amended to read as follows: 22 Section 2623. A. Subject to the availability of funds, the 23

Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may annually award a

- 1 maximum of three hundred full-time-equivalent scholarships for the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program to residents 2 of the Tulsa School District and to qualified students of any other 3 public school district in the United States who are direct lineal 4 descendants as defined in subsection C of this section and who are 5 intending to pursue studies at an institution of higher education in 6 The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education or a private 7 institution of higher education in this state or who are intending 8 9 to pursue studies in a postsecondary career and technology education 10 program in this state.
- B. To qualify for a scholarship, the family income of an applicant shall satisfy the following criteria:
 - 1. The family income of the applicant, from taxable sources is not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00), not exceed One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) per year. There shall be no family income limit for an applicant who is a direct lineal descendant as defined in subsection C of this section. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form may be used to verify family income;
 - 2. The applicant attended a Tulsa public school where seventy-five percent (75%) or more of the students enrolled in the school qualify for the free and reduced lunch program; and
 - 3. The applicant resides in a census block area within the Tulsa School District where thirty percent (30%) or more of the

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residents are at or below the poverty level established by the
United States Bureau of the Census.

The State Regents may consider as a Regents' selection process shall factor, when determining the order of preference of 4 5 give first priority status to applicants, whether an applicant who is a direct lineal descendant of a person who resided in the 6 Greenwood Area in the City of Tulsa between April 30, 1921, and June 7 1, 1921, and was a victim of the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre. 8 9 Regents use Use of descent as a preference factor, it shall be applied to all applicants regardless of race. The applicants shall 10 be required to present verifiable documentation of their lineage. 11 The Oklahoma Historical Society An organization or individual 12 engaged in genealogy and research of descendants and history of the 13 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre and Greenwood Area shall verify the 14 authenticity and accuracy of the documentation submitted by an 15 applicant and shall establish confirm the boundaries of the 16 Greenwood Area. Verifiable documentation shall include, but not be 17 limited to, the following: 18
 - Family records including family bibles, vital records, correspondence, memoirs, journals, diaries, unrecorded deeds, diplomas, certificates, or testimonials;
- 2. Public records including censuses, government records,
 23 military records, pensions, land bounty records, passport
 24 applications, passenger lists, original grants, naturalization or

1 immigration records, records of entry, or state, province, or local
2 records; or

- 3. Institutional records including church records, cemetery records and inscriptions, education institutions, insurance records, or societies and fraternal organizations.
- D. The <u>State</u> Regents shall promulgate rules establishing the application requirements for the program and the system for evaluating applications based on the preference factors. <u>The</u> application form shall include a small outlined box graphic, followed by the following language: "Mark the box if you are a direct lineal descendant of a **victim** greatly impacted socially and economically during the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre who resided in the Greenwood Area of Tulsa, Oklahoma, between April 30, 1921, and June 1, 1921."
- E. Applicants shall also meet the eligibility criteria established in Section 2624 of this title.
- pursuant to Section 2621 of this title and this section, the State Regents for Higher Education shall also be authorized to annually award scholarships for the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program to two students at each of the high schools in the Tulsa School District for the purpose of preserving awareness of the history and meaning of the civil unrest that occurred in Tulsa

- 14 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2625, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 Section 2625. A. Subject to the availability of funds, an
- 17 amount of not more than the equivalent of the average amount of
- 18 resident tuition for which an eligible Tulsa Reconciliation
- 19 | Education and Scholarship Program participant enrolled in an
- 20 | institution in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, or
- 21 enrolled in a postsecondary career and technology education program,
- 22 | whichever is applicable, is obligated to pay shall be awarded by
- 23 allocation from the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship
- 24 Trust Fund.

- B. Subject to the availability of funds, for each eligible Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant enrolled at a private institution of higher education, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall award from the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Trust Fund an amount of not more than the equivalent of the average amount of resident tuition for which the participant would be eligible if the participant were enrolled in a program at an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.
- C. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount of not more than the equivalent of the average amount of tuition for which an eligible Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant enrolled in a postsecondary career and technology education program is obligated to pay shall be awarded by allocation from the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Trust Fund. The allocation shall not exceed the amount a participant would have received for enrollment at a two-year institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.
- D. Benefits awarded under the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program shall not be allowed for courses or other postsecondary units taken in excess of the requirements for completion of a baccalaureate program or taken more than five (5) years after the student's first semester of participation in the program. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may award

the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program benefits for courses of postsecondary units taken more than five (5) years after the student's first semester of participation in the program only in hardship circumstances. No Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant may receive benefits beyond a cumulative time period of five (5) years. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may establish a maximum limit on the number of courses or other postsecondary units to which Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program benefits will apply. An award to an eligible Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant who is enrolled in a postsecondary career and technology education program may be used to pay for both career and technology education and college work if both are required by the program.

E. Benefits awarded under the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program shall be awarded to not more than 300 three hundred (300) eligible participants annually, subject to the amount of funds available for the program and the number of eligible participants. Subject to the provisions of subsection F of this section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for the maximum number of eligible participants each year, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall make awards on the basis of need. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall take into consideration other grants and scholarships received by an

1 eligible student when making awards. If an eligible student 2 receives other grants and scholarships scholarship award funds remain after payment of resident tuition, the benefits awarded under 3 the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program may cover 4 any additional educational costs not covered by the other grants and 5 scholarships including, but not limited to, fees, required textbooks 6 or materials, and room and board. If the family of an eligible 7 Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant 9 may qualify for the federal Hope Scholarship or Lifetime Learning 10 tax credit as provided for in the Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997, P.L. No. 105-34, the participant may elect to use the award allowed by 11 12 this section to pay for fees, required textbooks or materials and, if any funds remain, to pay for room and board instead of resident 13 tuition. 14

F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may, at the time an award is made on behalf of a Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant, set aside in the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to such Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program participant. For all academic years, participants who have previously received awards under the provisions of the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Act and who have continued at all times to fulfill the requirements for eligibility to receive awards provided pursuant to this program

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1	shall be given an absolute priority for continued financial support
2	by the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program
3	superior to any residents <u>students</u> who are applying for such
4	benefits for the first time; provided, however, that scholarship
5	applicants who are direct lineal descendants as defined in
6	subsection C of Section 2623 of this title shall always be given
7	first priority status.
8	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
10	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
