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8	An Act relating to the Department of Public Safety; amending Sections 1 and 2, Chapter 165, O.S.L. 2022
9	(74 O.S. Supp. 2024, Sections 9101 and 9102), which relate to the Mental Wellness Division; expanding
10	scope of eligibility; updating statutory reference; updating statutory language; and providing an
11	effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 165, O.S.L.
15	2022 (74 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 9101), is amended to read as
16	follows:
17	Section 9101. A. The Department of Public Safety shall
18	establish and maintain a Mental Wellness Division to provide mental
19	wellness services and programs to public safety personnel and
20	retirees thereof to promote good mental wellness. The Commissioner
21	of Public Safety shall appoint the Director of the Mental Wellness
22	Division.
23	B. The Director of the Mental Wellness Division shall report to
24	the Commissioner. All current and former employees of the Mental

1 Wellness Division shall maintain the privacy of all public safety 2 personnel served by the Division or who participate in its programs. No privileged personal health information shall ever be shared with 3 the Commissioner or made public without the consent of that person. 4 5 However, aggregate mental health information may be shared with the Commissioner. Aggregate mental health information may be made 6 public by the Commissioner if, in the judgment of the Commissioner, 7 doing so could improve public safety mental wellness policies for 8 9 public safety personnel and the information is made public for this 10 sole purpose. Provided, no aggregate mental health information may be shared or made public if doing so could reveal otherwise 11 12 privileged personal mental health information about any specific individual. It shall be the duty of the Director of the Division to 13 establish the necessary policies and procedures to ensure the 14 privacy and confidentiality requirements of this section and of all 15 other applicable health privacy laws. Any breach of the privacy 16 provisions of this section and of any other applicable health 17 privacy laws must be timely and thoroughly investigated and the 18 appropriate disciplinary and corrective actions taken. 19

- C. The Mental Wellness Division is authorized to enter into partnerships with private entities to fulfill its mandate.
- D. The offices, records, communications, information technology, equipment, and any other resources of the Mental

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- Wellness Division shall be located and maintained separately from that of the other divisions within the Department.
- 3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 165, O.S.L.
- 4 2022 (74 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 9102), is amended to read as
- 5 follows:
- 6 Section 9102. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
- 7 revolving fund for the Department of Public Safety on behalf of the
- 8 | Mental Wellness Division of the Department of Public Safety to be
- 9 designated the "Mental Wellness Division Revolving Fund". The fund
- 10 | shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations,
- 11 and shall consist of those monies appropriated to the fund by law or
- 12 deposited in the fund as provided pursuant to the provisions of
- 13 | Section 3 of this act 9103 of this title. All monies accruing to
- 14 | the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted
- 15 and expended by the Mental Wellness Division for the purpose of
- 16 | providing mental wellness services and programs to public safety
- 17 personnel and retirees thereof. Expenditures from the fund shall be
- 18 | made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims
- 19 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of
- 20 | Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.
- SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
