14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

17	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
18	Community Health Worker Act".
19	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.2 of Title 59, unless there
21	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	As used in the Oklahoma Community Health Worker Act:
23	1. "Certified community health worker" means a community health
24	worker to whom the State Department of Health has issued a

3 2. "Community health worker" means a frontline health worker 4 who has a shared understanding of and is a trusted member of the 5 community being served; and

3. "Department" means the State Department of Health.
SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.3 of Title 59, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. The State Department of Health shall establish a certificate 11 for community health workers. This certification shall be 12 voluntary.

13 B. A certified community health worker may:

Serve as a liaison between health and social services and
 the community, including faith-based organizations, to facilitate
 access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence
 of service delivery;

Assist in identifying and communicating gaps in current
 community and health care resources; and

Build individual and community capacity by increasing health
 knowledge and self-sufficiency through a range of activities such as
 outreach, community education, coaching, mentoring, social support,
 and advocacy, including efforts within faith-based settings.

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1 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.4 of Title 59, unless there 2 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 3 To be eligible to apply for voluntary community health worker 4 5 certification, an individual shall: 1. Be a United States citizen or lawful permanent resident; 6 2. Be a resident of this state; 7 Be at least eighteen (18) years of age; and 8 3. 9 4. Meet the minimum qualifications for certification promulgated by the State Commissioner of Health under Section 5 of 10 this act; provided, however, the applicant shall be exempt from such 11 12 minimum qualifications if the applicant has provided evidence to the State Department of Health of work experience as a community health 13 worker demonstrating a minimum of one thousand (1,000) practical 14 hours and a recommendation from a supervising provider. 15 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.5 of Title 59, unless there 17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 18 The State Commissioner of Health shall promulgate rules 19 necessary to implement this act including, but not limited to, rules 20 that: 21 1. Adopt a set of standards for the approval of certified 22 community health worker initial coursework or curriculum; 23 24

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1	2. Establish examination administration requirements for the
2	State Department of Health or one or more designees;
3	3. Define minimum qualifications for applicants to be
4	certified;
5	4. Establish the criteria for granting, renewing, denying,
6	suspending, and revoking a certificate to uphold health standards
7	and safety; and
8	5. Prescribe fees for the certified community health worker
9	examination, initial certification, and certification renewal.
10	SECTION 6. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
