6	An Act relating to teachers; amending Section 1, Chapter 289, O.S.L. 2023 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section
7	18-114.15), which relates to the minimum salary schedule for certified personnel; updating statutory
8	references; updating statutory language; modifying amount of credit school districts may grant for
9	certain service; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 289, O.S.L.
14	2023 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 18-114.15), is amended to read as
15	follows:
16	Section 18-114.15. A. Beginning with the 2023-2024 school
17	year, certified personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of $\frac{1}{1}$
18	of the Oklahoma Statutes this title, in the public schools of
19	Oklahoma this state shall receive in salary and/or fringe benefits
20	not less than the amounts specified in the following schedule:

8 Β. 1. When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule minimum 9 salary schedule, "fringe benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding the contributions made pursuant to 10 subsection A of Section 17-108.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma 11 12 Statutes this title and the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to Section 26-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title from 13 the flexible benefit allowance funds disbursed by the State Board of 14 Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education 15 pursuant to Section 26-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this 16 title. 17

2. If a school district intends to provide retirement benefits to a teacher such that the teacher's salary would be less than the amounts set forth in the minimum salary schedule specified in subsection A of this section, the district shall be required to provide written notification to the teacher prior to his or her employment or, if already employed by the district, no later than thirty (30) days prior to the date the district elects to provide

 than the minimum salary schedule.

C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from 3 a college recognized by the State Board of Education. 4 The Board 5 shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts that are accredited by the State Board of Education state board of 6 education or appropriate state accrediting agency for the districts. 7 The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-country 8 9 schools that are accredited or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-10 country certification documentation in a language other than English 11 12 shall be analyzed by an educational credential evaluation service in accordance with industry standards and guidelines and approved by 13 the State Department of Education. The person seeking to have 14 credit granted for out-of-country teaching experience shall be 15 responsible for all costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation 16 service. The Board shall accept teaching experience from primary 17 and secondary schools that are operated by the United States 18 Department of Defense or are affiliated with the United States 19 Department of State. 20

D. <u>1.</u> For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-of-country teaching experience as a certified teacher or its

 education from crediting more years of experience on district salary
 schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

4 <u>2. For the purpose of state salary increments, no teacher shall</u>
5 <u>be granted credit for more than ten (10) years of active duty in the</u>
6 <u>military service. For the purpose of retirement, no teacher shall</u>
7 <u>be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the</u>
8 military service.

9 E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes 10 of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience 11 of a:

Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of
 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;

14 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of
15 Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher
16 by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational
17 Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and
18 Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma
19 Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;

3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed
 while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor
 was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a
 teacher in Oklahoma this state;

4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the
 Child Study Center located at University Hospital, if the teacher
 was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma this state; and

5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were
completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological
assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma
this state if the experience primarily involved work with persons of
school- or preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the
experience was acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification
as, a school psychologist or psychometrist.

F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school in Oklahoma <u>this state</u> and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.

G. If a person employed as certified personnel, as defined in 15 Section 26-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title, by a 16 school district during the 2022-2023 school year was receiving a 17 salary above the step level indicated by the State Minimum Salary 18 Schedule state minimum salary schedule for the 2022-2023 school 19 year, the person shall receive a salary increase amount equal to the 20 amount indicated in subsection A of this section for the step level 21 indicated for the person, provided they remain he or she remains 22 employed by the same district, unless the hours or the duties of the 23 24 certified personnel are reduced proportionately.

H. If a school district does not receive Foundation or Salary
 Incentive Aid pursuant to Section 18-200.1 of Title 70 of the
 Oklahoma Statutes this title, funds shall be allocated by the State
 Board of Education to implement the salary increases indicated in
 subsection A of this section.

I. Persons employed as classroom instructional employees of 6 technology center school districts supervised by the State Board of 7 Career and Technology Education shall receive a salary increase 8 9 amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A of this section 10 for the step level indicated for the person persons, provided they remain employed by the same technology center school district, 11 unless the hours or the duties of the classroom instructional 12 employees are reduced proportionately. 13

J. Persons employed as correctional teachers or vocational 14 instructors by the Department of Corrections pursuant to Section 15 510.6a of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes or persons employed as 16 teachers by the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall receive a salary 17 increase amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A of 18 this section for the step level indicated for the person persons, 19 provided they remain employed by the same Department of Corrections 20 or Office of Juvenile Affairs facility, unless the hours or the 21 duties of the correctional teachers, vocational instructors, or 22 teachers are reduced proportionately. 23

1	K. Persons employed as teachers by the State Department of
2	Rehabilitation Services shall receive a salary increase amount equal
3	to the amount indicated in subsection A of this section for the step
4	level indicated for the person persons, provided they remain
5	employed by the State Department of Rehabilitation Services, unless
6	the hours or the duties of the teachers are reduced proportionately.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
8	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
10	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
