1 notify the Department of Corrections of the actual daily cost no 2 later than September 30. If the county's actual daily cost is accepted by the Department that, such amount shall be the 3 reimbursement rate for the county beginning the next fiscal year. 4 5 If the Department rejects the county's actual daily cost application, then the actual daily cost reimbursement shall be 6 determined by the State Auditor and Inspector and shall be imposed 7 beginning the next fiscal year. The Department shall distribute the 8 9 reimbursement on a monthly basis upon receipt and approval of a 10 billing statement from the county. The county shall use the reimbursement to defray expenses of equipping and maintaining the 11 12 jail and payment of personnel. The provisions in this act shall be implemented by the Department to allow sufficient time for 13 application to FY-2019. The Department of Corrections shall 14 reimburse the county for the emergency medical care for physical 15 injury or illness of the inmate retained under this act section if 16 the injury or illness is directly related to the incarceration and 17 the county is required by law to provide such care for inmates in 18 the jail. The Department shall not pay fees for medical care in 19 excess of the rates established for Medicaid providers. The state 20 shall not be liable for medical charges in excess of the Medicaid 21 scheduled rate. The Director Department may accept any inmate 22 required to have extended medical care upon application of the 23 24 county.
