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5	AS INTRODUCED
6	An Act relating to schools; creating the Oklahoma
7	Sexual Education Reform and Parental Rights Protection Act; providing short title; defining
8	terms; amending 25 O.S. 2021, Section 2003, which relates to the Parents' Bill of Rights; requiring written consent to provide certain sexual education
9	instruction to a student; requiring a school district
10	board of education to adopt procedures to provide notification and require written consent prior to
11	providing certain instruction; updating statutory language; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-105.1,
12	which relates to sex education curriculum and materials; requiring written consent from a parent or
13	legal guardian for a student to participate in certain instruction; requiring certain information to
14	be available on a school district's website; requiring written notification to include certain
15	information; requiring certain classes or programs to only be taught by a certified teacher; prohibiting
16	certain organizations from leading certain class or program; requiring only certain textbooks and
17	instructional materials to be used in certain class or program; prohibiting the use of certain funds to
18	purchase textbooks or materials not included on certain list; providing for codification; providing
19	an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
22	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-105.2 of Title 70, unless
24	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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1 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Α. 2 Sexual Education Reform and Parental Rights Protection Act". 3 As used in this act: Β. 4 "Comprehensive sexual education" or "sexual risk reduction" 1. 5 means any educational program that includes, endorses, or promotes 6 any of the following: 7 the advocacy of sexual activity outside of marriage, a. 8 b. the advocacy or promotion of any form of sexual 9 activity that deviates from the understanding of 10 sexual norms within a traditional family structure, 11 the provision of information about contraceptive с. 12 methods without emphasizing their potential risks and 13 failure rates, 14 the endorsement or promotion of non-heterosexual d. 15 orientations as equally valid or preferable to 16 heterosexual orientations, 17 the teaching of explicit sexual techniques without a e. 18 focus on abstinence as the preferred choice, 19 f. the inclusion of materials that may be considered 2.0 obscene or harmful to minors, 21 the teaching of gender identity and gender expression g. 22 outside the binary concept of male and female, without 23 emphasizing the biological basis of sex, 24 h. rights-based, pleasure-based sexual response system, 27

16	b.	the benefits of abstaining from sexual activity,
17	с.	the physical, psychological, and emotional risks and
18		consequences of engaging in premarital sexual
19		activity,
20	d.	the importance of personal responsibility and self-
21		discipline,
22	e.	the positive aspects of healthy relationships
23		including communication skills, mutual respect, and
24 47		emotional intimacy,

1	f.	the development of decision-making skills and setting
2		personal boundaries,
3	g.	the understanding of the potential social, emotional,
4		and physical consequences of early sexual activity,
5	h.	science-based, health-based information about the
6		reproductive system,
7	i.	refusal and resistance skills for sexual avoidance,
8	j.	that sexually transmitted infections (STIs) can cause
9		serious health concerns and can and should be avoided,
10	k.	information provided and risk avoidance promoted for
11		all students, regardless of sexual orientation or
12		gender identity,
13	l.	that abortion, if discussed, is presented in the
14		context of state law and physical and emotional risks,
15		and
16	m.	parental involvement, communication, and authority are
17		upheld and family values are supported.
18	SECTION 2	. AMENDATORY 25 O.S. 2021, Section 2003, is
19	amended to rea	ad as follows:
20	Section 20	003. A. The board of education of a school district,
21	in consultatio	on with parents, teachers <u>,</u> and administrators, shall
22	develop and ac	dopt a policy to promote the involvement of parents and
23	guardians of o	children enrolled in the schools within the school

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A plan for parent participation in the schools which is
 designed to improve parent and teacher cooperation in such areas as
 homework, attendance, and discipline;

⁷ 3. Procedures by which parents who object to any learning ⁸ material or activity on the basis that it is harmful may withdraw ⁹ their children from the activity or from the class or program in ¹⁰ which the material is used. Objection to a learning material or ¹¹ activity on the basis that it is harmful includes objection to a ¹² material or activity because it questions beliefs or practices in ¹³ sex, morality, or religion;

If a school district offers any sex education curricula 15 pursuant to Section 11-105.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes or 16 pursuant to any rules adopted by the State Board of Education, 17 procedures to opt out of a school district from providing sex 18 education require written consent from a parent for a child to 19 participate in comprehensive sexual education or sexual risk 20 reduction instruction to a child if the child's parent provides 21 written objection to the child's participation in the sex education 22 curricula or optimal sexual health education or sexual risk 23 avoidance instruction, as defined in Section 1 of this act;

8	6. Procedures by which parents may learn about the nature and
9	purpose of clubs and activities that are part of the school
10	curriculum, as well as extracurricular clubs and activities that
11	have been approved by the school; and
12	7. Procedures by which parents may learn about parental rights
13	and responsibilities under the laws of this state $_{ au}$ including the
14	following:
15	a. the right to opt out of <u>in to</u> a sex <u>comprehensive</u>
16	sexual education or sexual risk reduction curriculum
17	or an optimal sexual health education or sexual risk
18	<u>avoidance curriculum</u> if one <u>such a course or courses</u>
19	is provided by the school district,
20	b. open enrollment rights,
21	c. the right to opt out of assignments pursuant to this

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1 d. the right to be exempt from the immunization laws of 2 the state pursuant to Section 1210.192 of Title 70 of 3 the Oklahoma Statutes, 4 e. the promotion requirements prescribed in Section 5 1210.508E of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes 6 provisions of the Strong Readers Act, 7 f. the minimum course of study and competency 8 requirements for graduation from high school 9 prescribed in Section 11-103.6 of Title 70 of the 10 Oklahoma Statutes, 11 the right to opt out of instruction on the acquired q. 12 immune deficiency syndrome pursuant to Section 11-13 103.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 14 h. the right to review test results, 15 i. the right to participate in gifted programs pursuant 16 to Sections 1210.301 through 1210.308 of Title 70 of 17 the Oklahoma Statutes, 18 i. the right to inspect instructional materials used in 19 connection with any research or experimentation 20 program or project pursuant to Section 11-106 of Title 21 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 22 k. the right to receive a school report card, 23 1. the attendance requirements prescribed in Section 10-24 106 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 27

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1 the right to public review of courses of study and m. 2 textbooks, 3 the right to be excused from school attendance for n. 4 religious purposes, 5 policies related to parental involvement pursuant to ο. 6 this section, 7 the right to participate in parent-teacher p. 8 associations and organizations that are sanctioned by 9 the board of education of a school district, and 10 the right to opt out of any data collection instrument q. 11 at the district level that would capture data for 12 inclusion in the state longitudinal student data 13 system except what is necessary and essential for 14 establishing a student's public school record. 15 Β. The board of education of a school district may adopt a 16 policy to provide to parents the information required by this

¹⁸ C. A parent shall submit a written request for information ¹⁹ pursuant to this section during regular business hours to either the ²⁰ school principal at the school site or the superintendent of the ²¹ school district at the office of the school district. Within ten ²² (10) days of receiving the request for information, the school ²³ principal or the superintendent of the school district shall either ²⁴ deliver the requested information to the parent or submit to the

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1 parent a written explanation of the reasons for the denial of the 2 requested information. If the request for information is denied or 3 the parent does not receive the requested information within fifteen 4 (15) days after submitting the request for information, the parent 5 may submit a written request for the information to the board of 6 education of a school district, which shall formally consider the 7 request at the next scheduled public meeting of the board if the 8 request can be properly noticed on the agenda. If the request 9 cannot be properly noticed on the agenda, the board of education of 10 a school district shall formally consider the request at the next 11 subsequent public meeting of the board.

14 Section 11-105.1. A. All curriculum and materials including 15 supplementary materials which will be used to teach or will be used 16 for or in connection with a sex comprehensive sexual education or 17 sexual risk reduction class or program which is designed for the 18 exclusive purpose of discussing sexual behavior or attitudes or an 19 optimal sexual health education or sexual risk avoidance class or 20 program, as defined in Section 1 of this act, or any test, survey or 21 questionnaire whose primary purpose is to elicit responses on sexual 22 behavior or attitudes shall be available on the school district's 23 website and through the superintendent or a designee of the school 24 district for inspection by parents and legal guardians of the

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1 student who will be involved with the class, program or, test, 2 survey, or questionnaire. Such curriculum, materials, classes, 3 programs, tests, surveys, or questionnaires shall include 4 information about consent and shall have as one of its primary 5 purposes the teaching of or informing students about the practice of 6 abstinence. For the purposes of this section, "consent" shall have 7 the same meaning as that provided by Section 113 of Title 21 of the 8 Oklahoma Statutes. The superintendent or a designee of the school 9 district shall provide prior written notification to the parents or 10 legal guardians of the students involved of their right to inspect 11 the curriculum and material, the right to inspect a detailed outline 12 of the curriculum, and of their obligation to notify the right of 13 parents or legal guardians to provide the school in writing written 14 consent if they do not want their child to participate in the class, 15 program, test, survey, or questionnaire. Each local board of 16 education shall determine the means of providing written 17 notification to the parents and legal guardian which will ensure 18 effective notice in an efficient and appropriate manner including a 19 reasonable time period for the parent or legal guardian to review 20 the curriculum. No student shall be required to participate in a 21 sex comprehensive sexual education or sexual risk reduction class or 22 program or an optimal sexual health education or sexual risk 23 avoidance class or program which discusses sexual behavior or 24 attitudes if a parent or legal guardian of the student objects in 2 7

The superintendent or a designee of a school district in 8 which sex a comprehensive sexual education or sexual risk reduction 9 class or program or an optimal sexual health education or sexual 10 risk avoidance class or program is taught or a program is offered 11 which is designed for the exclusive purpose of discussing sexual 12 behavior or attitudes shall approve all curriculum and materials 13 which will be used for such education and any test, survey, or 14 questionnaire whose primary purpose is to elicit responses on sexual 15 behavior or attitudes used in the school prior to their use in the 16 classroom or school. The teacher involved in the class, program, 17 testing, or survey shall submit the curriculum, materials, tests, or 18 surveys to the superintendent or a designee for approval prior to 19 their use in the classroom or school. This section shall not apply 20 to those students enrolled in classes, programs, testings, or 21 surveys offered through an alternative education program.

C. A comprehensive sexual education or sexual risk reduction class or program or an optimal sexual health education or sexual risk avoidance class or program offered by a school district

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1	pursuant to this section shall only be taught by a certified teacher
2	who is employed by the school district. Outside organizations
3	including, but not limited to, county health departments and city-
4	county health departments shall be prohibited from leading such a
5	class or program.
6	D. Only textbooks and other instructional materials included in
7	the list of textbooks selected by the State Textbook Committee
8	pursuant to Section 16-110 of this title shall be used in a
9	comprehensive sexual education or sexual risk reduction class or
10	program or an optimal sexual health education or sexual risk
11	avoidance class or program offered pursuant to this section. A
12	school district shall be prohibited from using state funds to
13	purchase textbooks or other instructional materials not included in
14	the list of textbooks selected by the State Textbook Committee.
15	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
16	SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
17	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
18	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
19	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
