Any existing or future ordinance enacted or adopted by a county, municipality, or any other local government entity which is in conflict with this section shall be deemed void. Any election for any public office in this state conducted under a voting system prohibited by this section shall be deemed void. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall have the authority to bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction for such declaratory or injunctive relief as is necessary to carry out this section.
